The Archbishop's Fund, although still far short of what it should be, shows a substantial increase for 1906 over 1905, being \$1575 as against \$1315. The Cathedral envelopes produced \$182.28 for 1906, the amount for previous year having been \$145.36.

On Sunday 3rd March, sixty four envelopes were received through the offertory.

The Archbishop has appointed Mr. T. E. Moberly to have the charge and management of the Envelopes.

Mrs. Macnab's Silver Kettle Drum, on the Fifth of February, in aid of the Women's Pier was a great success, realizing the sum of twenty one dollars, and being the means of bringing together a number of people who showed their keen interest in the grand undertaking of the extension of the Cathedral, and due appreciation of the delightful musical programme provided.

In order that all obligations may be made at the Easter Offertory, the officers of the Cathedral League will be glad if the members of the League will kindly send in their obligations, or donations, on or before the 15th March to Miss Canavan, 61 Albany Avenue.

The amount received for P. M. Collections for February was \$38.35.

A. Y. P. A.

On the 4th of last month Professor Coleman of Toronto University, gave a most delightful and admirably illustrated lecture in the Cathedral Crypt on "*The Volcanoes of Mexico.*" The pictures thrown on the screen were made from his own photographs and sketches, and those who had the privilege of listening to the Professor's graphic description of his unique experiences in that interesting country enjoyed a rare treat. Sickness, absence from home and other causes, prevented many members of the A.Y.P.A. from attending, but the audience was a fairly representative one.

On February 18th, Rev. Mr. Fotheringham gave the A.Y.P.A. an interesting and instructive address on "The Influence of our Companions, ... other Persons or Books." The sacred Solo sung by Miss A. Hobson, was an enjoyable feature of the evening.

On the 4th inst., Rev. T. J. Wallace, the eloquent and versatile Rector of Oakville, lectured for the Association, taking for his subject "*A Lenten message from Macbeth.*" It was a capital and well nigh exhaustive interpretation of that wonderful tragedy, shewing how the Master Poet taught us that wilful sin has always its Nemesis or punishment, and the ultimate triumph of good over evil. Mr. Wallace has many friends and admirers in the Cathedral Congregation, and may always be sure of a hearty welcome when he comes amongst us.

Mr. E. Infield-Jenking sang as a sacred Solo, that beautiful Hymn "There is a Green hill far away," which was greatly appreciated.

On Monday evening in Holy Week, 25th inst., Canon Macnab will give a devotional lecture on the "*Passion of Our Blessed Lord.*" The lecture will be illustrated with Lantern Views. A Violin Solo will be given by Mr. S. Gahan, Junr.
