That the session will be an important, even sensational, one goes without saying, for the Manitoba school question will be on their mettle. It is very easy to surmise that the deliberations will occupy a brief period, but it will probably be found that Midsummer has come ere members wend their way homewards. Meantime there will be a lull in campalgning, and candidates aspiring to political honors will devote more of their time to mending their private fortunes, and less to fraternizing wifth the honest, intelligent electorate and the horny-handed sons of toil. Parliament meets at a dull season of the year, in a newspaper sense, and space will be available for lengthened reports of the debates on the grave subjects that must arise for consideration and settlement in the House of Commons.
