THE BUDGET presented to the Legislature of Newfoundland on the 3rd, for the year ending June 30, 1897, shows a surplus of \$285,000. This was obtained by reducing the appropriation in all the public services.

AN order in council has been passed at Ottawa renewing the modern vivand li- cense to fish for this year. It contains the significant statement that negotiations on trade relations and other matters between Canada and the States are still pending.

IN THE Dominion House of Commons, on Monday last, an interesting return of unforeseen expenses was brought down in reply to a motion of Mr. Foster.
