DUBLIN, April 13-In the Brady trial o-day a clerk named Kennedy swore that e spoke to Brady, who was accompanied by a girl, on Dominick street between 5 and 7 o'clock on the evening of the Phonix park murder. He recognized the girl as Annie Mesgher, who testified yesterday she was with Brady that evening. Witness also met Brady the following day and the latter declared that the murders would ruin the cause of Ireland. The defence announced that they would call no other witnesses. #### The People's Mealth. The weather for the week ending April 7 was ex

eeedingly cold, taken as a whole, though there were one or two warm days during the week. This accounts for several notable features in the prevalence of certain diseases. Bronchutis and pneumonia of certain diseases. Bronchitis and pneumonia have been very prevalent, but along with them neuralgia, and especially rheumatism have greatly extended in area of prevalence. These diseases are the very special characteristics of the weather at this season of the year, being especially dependent on cold and dampness. Zymotic diseases do not show any increase, but on the whole seem to have diminished in prevalence. Thus scarlatina has wholly disappeared from the twenty more prevalent diseases. Measles das receded very marked y. fall-ing from ten to seventy-five per cent in de ree of prevalence. Smallpox has been suppressed. The continued prevalence of ane nia is important to be
