The room in which the late O'Connor lay was draped in sombre black and at the head of the casket floral garlands in memory of his friends gathered round.

It was one of the largest funerals ever witnessed in Toronto. Fully 300 carriages were in line, and the last vehicle left the O'Connor house as the hearse arrived at the church.

Two hundred persons, representatives of the city, walking in the procession, followed the hearse.

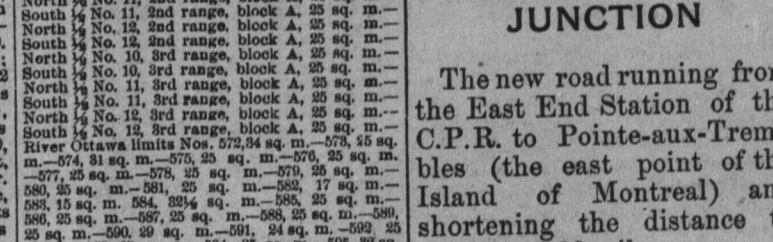
