REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

In presenting the 20th Annual Report, the Council, while not able to report any very material advance over last year, has the pleasure of stating that there has been a steady augmentation to the library and to the museum in articles of historic interest.

The Archæological Section has had a careful overhauling and the specimens and articles are now secured in more convenient show cases.

The Library has been very fairly arranged by the librarian, Miss Horsman, who took an intelligent interest in the work.

A notable addition to the library has been a copy of the Bible in the Tukulh language, translated by Ven. Archdeacon McDonald, honorary member of the society.

There were seven executive meetings during the season, at which an average of six members were present.

An addition of ten more institutions with which this society exchanges brings up the total of exchanges to 161.

Of newspapers there has been an addition of twelve, making a total of 111 for the year. These papers are placed in the library reading rooms and are free to the public.

The society records the death of Sir William Dawson, one of its most distinguished honorary members, and of Mr. Joseph Fortescue, of the Hudson's Bay Co., whose obituary notices will be found elsewhere.

Two papers were read before the society, one by Mr. G. W. Fonseca and the other by Rev. W. A. Burman, the president. These form Nos. 55 and 56 respectively of the Society's transactions.

OBITUARY.

SIR WM. DAWSON, HONORARY MEMBER.

This Society desires to express its sorrow at the death of one of the most distinguished of its Honorary Members, Sir William Dawson, C. M. G.

Sir William Dawson had reached the ripe age of 79, having been Principal of McGill College for 38 years, retiring in 1893, and passing away Nov. 19th, 1899.

Noted in his native Province of Nova Scotia as a co-worker of Sir Chas. Lyell, as a practical Geologist and a prominent Educationist, Sir William on his removal to Montreal maintained his place as a leader in Canadian Science and became a prolific writer of scientific works.

A member of many learned societies, Sir William was the first President of the Royal Society of Canada, and was also President of the British Association and of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

This Society records its sense of the great loss to Canada and the scientific world of so distinguished a man, but recognizes that his true value to the country will be still preserved in the work he has done, the books he has written and the lives he has influenced.

JOSEPH FORTESCUE

Was born in Dawlish, Devonshire, England, in 1833. He was the eldest son of an English Judge. In 1852 he entered the service of the Hudson's Bay Company, and was stationed at Moose Factory, Hudson's Bay, for about three years. In 1855 he was sent to Fort Garry and shortly after became accountant there for the District of Red River. A few years after he was appointed Northern Department Accountant at York, Hudson's Bay. While a resident there he was united in marriage to the eldest daughter of the Rev. Mr. Masen, D. D., a noted Indian Missionary. For about ten years he was in charge of the Company's business at York Factory District, and in 1885 took charge of English River District, with head

quarters at Isle à la Crosse. In 1889 he was appointed to the charge of Moose Factory District, where he was stationed when he first entered the service. He remained there until his retirement in 1892, when he settled in Kingston, Ontario, where he departed this life early in June, 1899. He left a widow, three sons and three daughters. In 1879 he was made a Chief Factor, the highest rank a Commissioned Officer can obtain in the service of the Hudson's Bay Company. At the time of his death Mr. Fortescue had been one of the Aldermen of the City of Kingston.

In 1882 Mr. Fortescue was elected a *delegue stationnaire de l'Institution Ethnographique* de Paris. He wrote a paper on the Ethnography of Hudson Bay, for which he was awarded a medal in 1890.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

Your Library Committee begs to report that its work of adding to the Society's Collection of North West and Reference Books and of making these stores more accessible to students went on during the past year in a satisfactory manner. The early part of the year was devoted to completing a piece of work which was begun during 1878. This was the collecting, classifying, and binding of upwards of a hundred volumes of pamphlets and typical Western newspapers. The volumes of pamphlets which were bound, have now been indexed and their contents made as easy of reference as possible. The purchase of books bearing upon the country west of Lake Superior has continued to receive attention, especially the purchase of scarce and out of print volumes, such as are not easily obtainable by the private collector.

The number of bound volumes thus added to the Library in the course of 1899 was 167.

The most important sets purchased was Bancroft's History of the Pacific Coast States (39 Vols.) and the volumes thus published in the new translation of the Jesuit Relations (9 Vols.). There have been several additions to the list of

societies and institutions sending their publications in exchange for those of our Society, and many of these are of great value. The collection of such works which our Society possesses is unique in the North West, and increasing as it is, it deserves our constant attention to its development and our watchful care for its preservation.

REPORT OF THE JOINT LIBRARY COMMITTEE

During the past year the City Library has been conducted with considerable success. A large selection of books amounting to 670 has been purchased at a cost of \$809, and the selection has been a matter requiring a considerable amount of time by the committee. As shown by the following list the books belonging to the class of fiction have been most largely sought for, but the committee is pleased to see a growing demand for the more solid kind of literature. The number of books taken out has been large, numbering 34,342, and divided into classes as follows :

The re-arrangement of shelving and the affording of more room for the increasing library has occupied the attention of the Board, and some money has been spent in this way. The Register Library has not been catalogued anew, but a new catalogue of the circulating library has been prepared and is now ready for the printer.

The contract for new books has been awarded to Mr. C. Black, on terms most favorable to the Society, and the magazines are for this year supplied by the same bookseller. The magazines and periodicals obtained to supplement the 161 exchanges received by the Society this year number 71, and cost \$265.70. The local newspapers from Lake Superior to the Pacific Ocean, numbering 111, which the Historic Society supplies to the Reading Room, are much consulted by readers.

The grant during the present year given to the Public Library by the city council is \$2,250, being a small increase on that of last year, and will enable the joint committee to supply a large amount of good literature for the readers.

During the present year Aldermen Fry, Carruthers and McFarlane are the representatives of the city on the Board.

The Historical Society is requested to appoint two representatives for the current year.

REPORT OF THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL COMMITTEE.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 25th, 1900.

to the President and Members of the Historical and Scientific Society of Manitoba.

Your Archaeological and Scientific Committee have pleasure in reporting a very satisfactory year in connection with the departments under its charge. We feel that the expenditures and collections of the Society are now in a much more satisfactory condition than ever before.

Since our last report an entire change in arrangement of the show cases has been made.

This was rendered necessary by the removal of the city engineer's department into the rooms in the northwest corner of the building formerly occupied by us. Our accommodation being now entirely inadequate, the city council kindly consented to close up the unused staircase on the north side and to put in a false floor at its head.

The accommodation being still very confined it was found necessary to have new and improved cabinets constructed, as well also to remodel a number of old cases. Those of no further service to us to the number of twelve have been disposed of by your committee to the industrial exhibition.

In this manner a very satisfactory solution of the question of adequate space has been attained, and the specimens of the society are now much more easy of access and more open to inspection than had formerly been the case.

Your committee still further contemplates the construction of a special cabinet for the reception of the fine collection of botanical specimens in its possession. The additions throughout the year have not been very numerous, though several very interesting objects have been added, amongst them being :

Rev. A. Sylva White—Relic of the dynamite explosion at Whitehall, Eng., in 1883.

Mrs. Livingstone—Old iron lamp.

Mr. W. A. Corbett, B. A.—Pottery unearthed in the old Roman village of Uriconium, now Wroxeter, Eng.

Dr. E. A. Blakeley—Photograph of the members of Fort Garry Lodge I. O. G. T. of 1870-1898.

Mr. C. H. Royal, M. A.—Collection of old maps.

Mr. Basil Hamilton—Three steel dies from old Hudson's Bay post at Machipicoton ; life preserver of tin formerly in use by Hudson's Bay Co.; Indian stone pipe.

Mr. Basil Hamilton's collection of coins and of numerous articles of interest still remain with us, and it is now proposed by him to make the same a permanent loan to the society. This it is hoped will be done.

In conclusion it may not be out of place for the chairman to express his warm appreciation of the interest displayed by the various members of the committee and their hearty cooperation in the work entrusted to them by the Society.
