Ottawa, April 17.—The Militia Department considers it advisable to postpone the Niagara camp for the troops of the 2nd Military District, which is usually held in June, until September or October, when the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York will be on a visit to Canada.

BIG BANK ROBBERY RECALLED

One of the Thieves Offers to Return the Stolen Bonds for a Consideration.

ONLY VALUABLE AS REIGNS NOW.

And the Man, Who Wants the Money Badly, Will Have to Do Without.

New York, April 17.—One of the largest bank robberies ever committed in the United States is recalled by one of the thieves entering into negotiations for the return of millions of dollars of bonds that were stolen from the Manhattan Bank in this city in 1878. The Manhattan Savings Institution was robbed on October 27, 1878, of \$2,747,000 in securities and \$11,000 in cash. A few of the securities were returned, and by special acts of Congress and the State Legislature duplicate Government bonds and state and municipal bonds were issued to the bank, reducing the institution's loss to something like \$15,000. The person who is in a position to restore the bonds is in New York, and if the officers of the bank were to offer a small reward for their return he would put the police in the way of getting them, but the bonds are valueless now and the bank officials decline to enter into negotiations for their return. The bonds would not be worth anything to them, except as relics.

UNITED STATES CATHOLICISM.

Archbishop Ireland Declares There Are Fifteen Millions of Catholics Across the Border. Dubuque, Iowa, April 17.—Archbishop John J. Keane was this morning invested with the pallium, the insignia of the high office he holds in the Roman Catholic Church. Cardinal Gibbons was present. Archbishop Ireland delivered the sermon. He said in part: "I fear not to say that we have to-day in the United States fourteen or fifteen millions of Catholics. I speak, too, of the number of churches, colleges, schools, convents, hospitals, orphanages, and institutions of piety, charity, education and apostolic zeal with which the whole country is covered. These are the creations of the civil State or of rich religious corporations; they are the results of the genius of the Catholic people."

MEN AS SAVAGE AS DOGS.

Doctor Was Horribly Bitten, Clinch Followed and He Used His Teeth Viciously.

Utica, N. Y., April 17.—Alois Brambach, a prominent piano board manufacturer of Delongville, waited outside the postoffice in that place this afternoon till Dr. Mangold should come out. Under his coat Brambach carried a short whip, and when the doctor appeared Brambach commenced to rain blows over his head and shoulders as rapidly as he could. The men clinched in the struggle which followed. Dr. Mangold fell and his left leg was broken in two places. The doctor caught Brambach's hand in his teeth and secured it in a terrible manner, nearly severing some of the fingers. It is thought the men would have killed each other had they not been dragged apart.

Theatrical Men Acquitted.

New York, April 17.—Magistrate Zeller in the Yorkville Court today dismissed the charges against William A. Brady, Dan Daly and De Wolf Hopper, arrested Sunday night for a violation of the Sunday law in connection with the Actors' Fund benefit at the Academy of Music.

Death Rather Than Exposure.

Zanesville, Ohio, April 17.—J. K. Lamsley of Lowell drowned himself today in the Muskingum River. It is alleged he was short in his accounts as township treasurer, and that his bondsmen last evening notified him they would be no longer responsible.

Good News for Many People.

Washington, April 17.—The transport Garonne, with Massachusetts Volunteers, returning from Manila, has been reported. She was Honolulu and will be in San Francisco in two or three days. The Garonne was long overdue, and anxiety was felt for her safety.

Venezuela Courts Unfit.

Port of Spain, Island of Trinidad, April 17.—Germany, the United States, Great Britain and Spain have refused to recognize the Venezuelan courts as at tribunals of appropriate claims involving the rights of foreigners.
