



The Capital of the County of Elgin, is situated near the centre of the County, in the Townships of Yarmouth and Southwold.

The surrounding country is one of the finest agricultural districts in Western Canada. Large quantities of wheat and other grain, are annually exported from this place.

The situation of St. Thomas is exceedingly pleasant. It is built on an elevated peninsula, formed by Kettle Creek and its tributaries, which make the complete circuit of the Town. The scenery in its immediate vicinity is remarkably picturesque and beautiful.

Since it became the County Town, which event took place in 1853, its progress though not very rapid, has been sure and steady. At the present time there is probably as much business transacted in it as there is in any place of the same size in Upper Canada.

St. Thomas is one of the principal stations of the London and Port Stanley Railroad, and by means of railway communication is connected with all parts of Canada, and the neighbouring States. It is distant from London, 18 miles; Simcoe, 48 miles; Chatham 82 miles; Hamilton, 94 miles; Windsor, 128 miles; Toronto, '182 miles; Niagara Falls, 139 miles; Kingston 297 Ottawa, 265 miles; Montreal, 465 miles; New York, 632 miles; Quebec, 634 miles; Boston, 727 miles; and Portland, 757 miles.

In 1853 the town contained 1,100 inhabitants, its population is now about 1,800.







The County Town of the County of Norfolk, is situated on Patterson's Creek, in the Township of Woodhouse. It is built on a level plain, its streets are of a good width and for the most part intersect each other at right angles. In appearance it is one of the prettiest towns in the Province. On Norfolk Street, which is the principal business thoroughfare of the place, the houses are chiefly built of brick; on it are erected a number of commodious stores, which are occupied as dry goods, grocery, and hardware establishments, &c., and in which can be found complete assortments of goods belonging to these various branches of business.

The local trade of the town is excellent, and a very large business is carried on in the above mentioned description of goods, and also in lumber and wool. The country in the vicinity of Simcoe is capable of a high state of cultivation, and at the present time furnishes its market with large quantities of wheat and other grain.

Amongst the buildings of the town, which are chiefly worthy of mention, are the County Buildings, the Simcoe Union School, and the large block of Buildings on Norfolk Street known as the Norfolk Buildings. Messrs. J. & G. Jackson, of Simcoe, were the contractors for all of the structures, and, it must be admitted, that the manner in which they have performed their tasks is conclusive proof of their ability in this capacity.

The Norfolk Buildings were designed for, and are occupied as, an hotel, with stores underneath. These buildings, from their size and the handsome manner in which they are constructed, present a very fine appearance. Mr. George Battersby is the proprietor of this hotel, which is called the Norfolk House, and is one of the largest and most comfortable "homes for the traveller" in Canada. In connection with the hotel is a concert hall and ball room, capable of containing five hundred persons. The Masonic Hall is also in this building.

The Simcoe Union School was designed by Messrs. Messer & Jones of Toronto; as has already been stated, Messrs. J. & G. Jackson, of Simcoe, were the contractors. We clip the following particulars relative to it from a very useful work edited by J. George Hodgins, Esq., M. A., and called "The School House, its Architecture, Arrangements, and Discipline, &c." "The building," it says, "is designed in the Old English style-the most appropriate for a red brick building-(which it is) and is finish-The overhanging roofs afford proed with Ohio stone dressings. The windows are covered with hoods which tection to the walls. shade them, making the light free from the glare of sunshine, and being glazed in small squares are less liable to be broken. An entirely separate entrance is provided for boys and girls, the whole of the ground floor being appropriated to the use of the The boys enter the door in the left wing, and ascend a latter. broad staircase to the second floor, where there is a large schoolroom with seats for 160 pupils; two class-rooms for 48 pupils each; a gallery for 112 pupils, and a large cloak-room. The whole area of the basement is 6 feet 6 inches high. building has been excavated, so that any system of heating may be adopted. The rooms on the ground floor are 14 feet high. The large room on the upper floor has an open roof, 17 feet to the ceiling, and the class-rooms a height of 14 feet. All the rooms are ventilated by flues in the walls, carried up into the roof, from whence the foul air escapes by means of an open ventilator on the ridge." The cost of the building was about £1.700.


Simcoe is but a few miles from Lake Erie. Port Dover, a place of considerable importance, and the safest harbor on the Canada side of the Lake, being distant from it 8 miles; while Port Ryerse, which is four miles West of Port Dover, is still nearer, the distance between it and the capital of Norfolk being only six miles.

Simcoe is distant from Brantford, 24 miles; Paris, 28 miles; Hamilton, 45 miles; St. Thomas, 48 miles; London, 58 miles; Niagara Falls, 84 miles; Toronto, 85 miles; Buffalo, 100 miles; Chatham, 147 miles; Windsor, (opposite Detroit,) 193 miles; Kingston, 250 miles; Ottawa, 318 miles; Montreal, 418 miles; New York, 585 miles; Quebec, 589 miles; Boston, 678 miles; Portland, 710 miles; and Liverpool, 3168 miles. The population of the town is about 2.000.

PORT DOVER.

The County Town excepted, Port Dover is the largest and most important place in the County of Norfolk. It is a port of entry, and is situated at the confluence of the River Lynn with Lake Erie, in the Township of Woodhouse. This place was laid out in the year 1836, by the late Israel Powell, Esq. Up to 1842, its progress was not very rapid, as at that time it contained but 17 dwelling houses, 2 small taverns, 1 general store, 2 blacksmiths, and 1 shoe maker. Besides these buildings, which were all built of wood, there was one other, built of brick, but only partially finished; some interest is attached to this dwelling, which is now occupied by Mr. McQueen, as an hotel, from the fact that during the Rebellion of 1837-8, it was used by the volunteers as a barracks.

Port Dover is the principal lumber, grain and produce market, for a large section of country.

The harbor, which is exceedingly capacious, is, owing to the possession of many natural advantages, beyond comparison the best on the Canada side of Lake Erie. A considerable amount of shipping is carried on at this port, which possesses a good storage capacity. The following vessels are entered and owned in this place; the barque Mary Jane, of 397 tons, and the schooners Active, 31 tons; Three Friends, 115 tons; E. Hall, 108 tons; Saucy Jack, 68 tons; Ada, 54 tons; Bay Queen, 115 tons; and May Flower, 98 tons.

A few years ago, that is to say in 1861, the town was materially benefited, by the erection of the Norfolk Woollen Mills, these fine buildings which are remarkably well adapted to the purposes for which they are intended, are situated on Patterson's Creek, as good a water privilege, its capacity taken into consideration, as there is in the Province. In the year mentioned these mills were built for, and they are at the present time owned by Andrew Thompson, Esq., of Port Dover. The machinery, which is of a superior description, is the property of the Norfolk Woollen Mills, Company. John Harvey, Esq., of Hamilton, is the lessee, and Mr. Joseph N. Pitts, the manager. Under the skilful directions of the last named gentleman, large quantities of cloths have been made, which for durability and appearance are equal to other goods of a similar class, the productions of any part of The quantity at present manufactured, is about the world.

400 yards a day. The dimensions of the premises are as follows: the main building which is 41 storeys high, is 96 feet by 44 feet, the Dye House and Wheel House attached, 44 feet by 24 feet; that for the purpose of drying wool, cloths, &c., 110 feet by 30 feet, and the boiler house, 30 feet by 30 feet. The total frontage of the premises just mentioned, is 250 feet, these together with a building 38 feet by 25 feet, and occupied as a store-room and office complete the edifices. Within the Mills is a machine room containing turning engines, &c., for the purpose of executing repairs. The building is heated by steam, generated by a boiler, in a fire proof room, and consequently the necessity of having any other fires is obviated. The number of hands at present employis 50.

About 60 rods from the Norfolk Woollen Mills, is situated the Port Dover Tannery, owned and occupied by Peter Lawson, Esq. This Tannery was built in 1860, on the ruins of another which was burnt down a short time previous to its erection. The main building is 85 feet by 44 feet, with Bark Mill and Leech House, 45 feet by 30 feet, driven by steam and containing a Hide Mill, Rolling Machine, Leather Splitting Machine, and in a word, all the modern appliances for the manufacture of leather. There is also a Sweat House attached to the main building, 42 feet by 12 feet. For fuel, spent bark is used, in consequence of which a very large saving is effected in this particular.

There are a number of merchants in Port Dover, who, to judge, from their extensive business premises, and the large stocks they contain, must do an extensive business.

Amongst other establishments coming under this category, might be mentioned those of Buckwell, Skey & Co.; B. Powell; Robert Riddell, and Norman B. Scofield.

To the tourist or pleasure seeker, this place presents considerable attractions. The fishing is all that the diciples of Isaac Walton could wish for, while the shooting in its vicinity, and especially at Long Point, a few miles distant is unequalled in the Province. Port Dover is distant from Simcoe, the County Town, 8 miles; Port Ryerse, 4 miles; Vittoria, 6 miles; Townsend Centre, 10 miles; Normandale, 11 miles; Rockford, 12 miles; Waterford, 15 miles; Boston, 15 miles; Delhi, also known as Fredericksburgh, 20 miles; Lynedock, 20 miles; Port Rowan, 23 miles; and Walsingham Centre, 25 miles.

In 1842 if contained a population of 125, in 1850, it had increased to 600, and at the present time, it numbers about 1200 inhabitants.





PORT ROWAN.

A village of considerable importance, in the Township of Walsingham, and County of Norfolk. It was laid out in 1825, (40 years ago.) but for the first 20 years of its existence, its progress was the reverse of being rapid, for we find that in 1845 it contained but one store; one blacksmith; one tailor; one shoe maker; and sixteen dwelling houses. From the last mentioned date, however, it began steadily to improve, and has continued to do so up to the present period. In the rear of this place are large timber districts, and from this port immense quantities are annually shipped. The total exports from Port Rowan, including lumber, grain, &c., for the year ending June 30th, 1865, amounted to \$246,658, the imports for the same period of time, were \$24,011.





VIENNA.

An incorporated village situated on the Big Otter River, in the Township of Bayham, and County of Elgin, This Village was first settled in the year 1829. Its growth must have been, even from its commencement unusually rapid, for in 1831, only two years afterwards, it contained a population of 300. It continued to prosper in the most gratifying manner, and in 1851, the number of its inhabitants was about 800. From this period, owing chiefly to an immense increase in the lumber business of the locality, which for a number of years prior to this date had by no means been inconsiderable, it advanced at a much accelerated speed, and soon become one of the most, (if not the most,) flourishing villages in Upper Canada. In 1853, having attained a population of 1,200, it was incorporated as a seperate municipality. For a time its great and almost unprecedented prosperity continued, but finally a conjunction of circumstances arose, which not only impeded its further progress, but to some extent caused it to recede, both in point of business and population. These circumstances were two in number, firstly, and principally, a great decline in the lumber trade of Nienna, and its environs, and secondly an extensive conflagration, which, with unsparing fury, destroyed nearly all the buildings on one side of the principal business street of the village; the other side though not so severely demolished, nevertheless suffered to an extent, which, but for the black ruins opposite, would have been deemed considerable. ravages which were committed by this fire, have, in some degree been repaired, and at the present time there is probably as much business transacted in Vienna, as there is in any village of the same size in Western Canada. It possesses good water privileges, and being situated in the midst of a thickly settled country, must always command a good local trade. Vienna is distant from St. Thomas, the County Town, 28 miles; Port Burwell, 3 miles; Staffordville, 5 miles; Aylmer, 15 miles; Orwell, 18 miles; and Port Stanley, 21 miles. Its population is about 850.

In 1831, the ground on which it now stands was an unbroken forest. In that year it was surveyed out by the late Colonel Burwell, and his brother, John Burwell, Esq., of Port Burwell. About two years after the last mentioned date, various buildings were erected, and an English Church was commenced. In 1836, the first divine service ever performed in Port Burwell, in a building specially erected for that purpose, was celebrated within the walls of this sacred edifice, the officiating minister being the present venerable Lord Bishop of Toronto, then Archdeacon of York, In 1844, a resident clergyman was appointed, and in the same year, the late Colonel Burwell, acting in accordance with a spirit of liberality, which is more frequently admired than imitated, endowed it with six hundred acres of his land, in the Township of Bayham. From this period the village steadily increased in population and wealth. The situation of this place is very pleasant, it being in a beautiful country, and surrounded by scenery of the most picturesque description. It enjoys a good local trade, and also does considerable of a shipping business. For the year ending June 30th, 1865, the exports amounted to \$202,943, the imports to \$14,437, and the duties collected \$2,320. Port Burwell is distant from St. Thomas, the County Town, 31 miles; Vienna, 3 miles; Staffordville, 8 miles; Aylmer, 18 miles; and Orwell, 21 miles. Its population is about 900.

PORT STANLEY.

Is situated at the mouth of Kettle Creek, at it confluence with Lake Erie, in the Townships of Yarmouth and Southwold, and County of Elgin. It was settled in the year 1812, by the late Colonel Bostwick, and possesses one of the best harbors on the Canada side of the Lake. The exports from the Port for the year ending June 30th, 1865, amounted to \$217,349, and imports for the same period were of the value of \$42, 527, and the duties collected, \$722,23. It is the terminus of the London and Port Stanley Railway, by means of which, and the great Western, and Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway in connection with it, uninterrupted communication can be maintained between it and all parts of Canada, and the neighbouring States. The country surrounding Port Stanley is well settled and is unquestionably one of the best agricultural regions in Western Canada. The scenery in the immediate vicinity of the village is of the most picturesque and striking character, and is in every way adapted to please the eye of those who appreciate and enjoy the beauties of nature. Of late

years it has become the fashionable resort of pleasure seekers from all parts of the country. The directors of the London and Port Stanley Railroad have lately purchased some twelve acres of ground, which they have made into a park, for the benefit of excúrsionists. This park is within a quarter of a mile of the Railway Station, and is very pleasantly situated on a hill, from the summit of which, a magnificent view of Lake Erie and surrounding country can be obtained. UPPER CANADA.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the fourth Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity begins Monday next after the 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas being 3rd Monday in November, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long Vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April, and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long Vacation from the 1st of July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS.—On the first Monday in January, April, July and October, and end the following Saturday.


