Was negrly \$45,000,000; Revenues I was \$39,671,920, and yesterday it was \$34,343,306. There was cause for the decline during September in the redemption 4½ per cent bonds, but such redemptions have since been small, and the steady fall is due to nothing but current expenditures. The declared balance of \$34,343,306 today is made up of \$14,270,710 on deposit in national banks, \$14,761,248 in subsidiary silver and \$344,463 in minor coin and fractional paper. This leaves an actual margin of available cash of less than \$5,000,000, and a part of the pension money for the month yet remains to be drawn. 
