**Sudden and Awful Death of ALICE HEYWOOD at PETROLIA.**  
(Ottawa Free Press, Oct. 15.)  
The Petrolia Topic furnishes the particulars of the death of Alice Heywood, of that town a few days since, reference to which was made in these columns recently: - For some time the residents of Petrolia have been in the habit of borrowing water from a cistern at the rear of the machine shop of Messrs. McKee & Marwick, and of walking through the shop to reach it. On the afternoon in question Miss Alice Heywood, a domestic in the family of Mr. John Enochs, was sent for water, and took the accustomed route through the works. It was raining at the time and, having some distance to walk, her skirts became wet. Going through the shop she had to cross a revolving shaft, used to turn the machinery of some wells, which was about eight inches from and parallel with the floor. In stepping across this her damp skirt stuck to it and she was drawn down and partly under it. For a moment the speed of the engine was checked, but sufficient long for Mr. Marwick to suspect something wrong, and he at once shut off steam in order to ascertain the trouble. His horror can be imagined when he discovered the terrible cause. The powerful shaft had done its fatal work. Drawn by the force of the power girl had been forced beneath it and both her legs torn off, one at the knee and the other a few inches above. She presented a spectacle that will not soon be forgotten by those who were present. Still conscious, she raised one of her dismembered limbs and, gazing upon it, cried out in the agony of her pain for some one to kill her. She was removed, and surgical assistance procured as rapidly as possible. Morphine and chloroform were freely used, but so intense was the pain that it conquered all attempts to drive her into unconsciousness, and she remained alive to all surroundings until half an hour before her death which released her from suffering two hours after the accident. Not more than a half a pint of blood flowed from the ghastly wounds - two dismembered limbs, protrusion of the hip bone and laceration of the muscles of the abdomen, the severe shock to her nervous system presumably arresting the circulation. She was in the 22nd year of her age - a well-known citizen of Petrolia, and was highly respected by all who knew her. She was to have been married on Thursday to Mr. Wm. Ginter, the well known torpedo exploder, who had a home neatly furnished for his promised bride. Her funeral occurred from the residence of her brother-in-law, Mr. Adam Nichol, formerly of London East, whither the body had been carried after the accident. The remains were followed to their last resting place by a large concourse of sorrowing friends.

**AN INTERESTING NEWSPAPER SUIT** in general interest was disposed of in the United States circuit court at Chattanooga, Tenn., Oct. 12, Judge D. M. Key, ex-Postmaster-General, presiding. The suit was against the Chattanooga Daily Times to recover \$10,000 alleged damages to Alvin O. Dixon, tax collector of Blount County, Ala., who was referred to as having disgraced himself with burnt cork and attempted to burglarize his own house, but being detected by his wife, who did not recognize him, was shot and killed. The story was totally untrue. The Times acknowledged the libelous character of the article, [but in mitigation] of damages proved they had no acquaintance with Dixon; that the item was taken from other papers, though published as original, and that as soon as they learned the story was untrue, they made proper correction. The trial took up four days of the court. Eminent counsel from Georgia, Alabama and Tennessee were engaged in the suit. Judge Key gave an able and progressive opinion on the law relating to libel in favor of newspapers, and the jury, after a few moments' reflection, gave the plaintiff \$5,000 damages. Dixon has also suits pending against several Alabama papers.
