

The Grand Secretary read a communication from Major John Fraser, Quebec, in reference to Bro. Thomas Cairns Price.

On motion of Bro. B. Wilson Higgs it was

 ${\it Resolved},$  That the communication be referred to Mount Lebanon Lodge.

The Grand Secretary read a communication from the so-called Grand Lodge of Colon.

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On motion-

Resolved, That the Communication from Colon do lay over until the Annual Communication.

The Grand Secretary read notice of appeal from Bro. A. Henry McPherson in reference to the action of Bro. William H. Findley, Worshipful Master of Victoria Lodge in refusing to put a motion to the said Lodge, made by him and based upon a decision of the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

The Most Worshipful Grand Master ordered the same to be referred to the Board of General Purposes.

Moved by Bro. B. Wilson Higgs, that Section 16, page 24, of the Constitution be suspended for to-night.

In amendment it was moved by Bro. Simon W. Crabbe, that this Grand Lodge do meet at nine o'clock a. m. to-morrow.

The amendment was put to Grand Lodge and declared lost.

The original motion was then put to Grand Lodge and declared carried.

#### AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Bro. John W. Morrison, pursuant to notice given at the Annual Communication, moved,

That the resolution passed on the 21st day of Feburary, 1878, page 26, of the Journal of this Grand Lodge be rescinded, and the following substituted, viz:

That Section 13, page 18, of the constitution, be changed to read as follows:

The Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge shall be holden alternately in the City of Charlottetown and Town of Summerside, on the Festival day of Saint John the Baptist, unless that day shall fall upon a Saturday or Sunday, when it shall be held on the Monday following:

Which was adopted.

On motion of Grand Secretary, it was

Resolved, That in consideration of the change of time of the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge, the Secretaries of Subordinate Lodges be required to make up a supplementary Report to the last day of April next, and forward the same to the Grand Secretary with the amount due thereon, as early as the first week in May.

On motion of Grand Secretary,

Resolved, That the term "Seafaring Men," in clause 2, page 53, of the Constitution, does not extend or apply to persons employed in vessels known as "Coasters," or in any vessel trading between ports on the Atlantic Sea Board of North America.

Moved by Bro. Simon W. Crabbe,

That Bro. B. Wilson Higgs be requested to return to the several Subordinate Lodges any moneys which he may have received from them towards Grand Lodge Regalia Fund.

In amendment, it was moved by Bro. Richard Hunt,

That the Committee on Regalia be re-constructed, and that they use all possible means to have a sum sufficient collected.

The amendment was put to Grand Lodge and declared carried.

The M. W. Grand Master appointed Bro. David Small as a member of Committee on Regalia, in connection with Bros. B. Wilson Higgs and John W. Morrison.

Moved by Bro. John W. Morrison,

That the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars be appropriated by Grand Lodge towards the purchase of Regalia.

In amendment it was moved by Bro Simon W. Crabbe,

That the funds necessary for the purpose of procuring the Grand Lodge Regalia, be contributed as follows:—One-third by the Grand Lodge, the balance by equal assessment on each member of the Subordinate Lodges in this Jurisdiction; officers of the Grand Lodge to be assessed double.

The amendment was put to Grand Lodge and declared carried.

#### NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

Bro. Grand Secretary gave notice that at the next Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge, he would move that Section 34, page 45, of the Constitution of this Grand Lodge be amended by striking out the words "27th day of December," and inserting the words "30th day of April," also,

That Section 3, page 37, under head "Subordinate Lodges," be rescinded, also,

That Section 27, page 43, be rescinded and the following substituted: "Any member of a Lodge in arrears for dues for the term of two years and upwards, may by a vote of the Lodge be stricken from the roll of membership," also,

That a clause be inserted to be known as Section 27 A, to read as follows:—"The name of every Brother, suspended or stricken from the roll, shall be sent to the Grand Secretary and to every Lodge in the Province, also,

That Section 28, page 43, be rescinded and the following substituted:—\*A member stricken from the roll for non-payment of dues, shall be immediately restored by the

Lodge, without a fresh ballot, on payment of all arrears, and notice of his re-instatement shall be forthwith given to the Grand Secretary and to every Lodge in the jurisdiction," also,

That Section 29, page 44, be amended by striking out the word "suspended" on the second line and substituting the words "stricken from the roll."

Bro. B. Wilson, Higgs gave notice that at the next Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge, he would move "That the Semi-Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge be dispensed with."

Bro. John W. Morrison gave notice that at the next Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge, he would move that Section 3, page 14 and 15 and Section 5, page 15, of the Constitution of this Grand Lodge be rescinded and the following substituted, to be numbered Section 3, "In the Election of officers of this Grand Lodge, a majority of all the votes present shall be necessary to a choice, the names having the lowest number of votes shall each time be withdrawn, and in case of a tie between the last two, the vote shall be re-taken until one of them has a majority."

The above to take place of a similar notice at the last Annual Communication.

#### THANKS.

On motion of Grand Secretary, it was

Resolved, That the thanks of this Grand Lodge be tendered to Alexander McNab, Esquire, Superintendent of the Prince Edward Island Railway, for the courtesy extended by him to the Officers and members of Grand Lodge.

### On motion of Grand Secretary, it. was

Resolved. That the thanks of this Grand Lodge be tendered to the officers and members of Mount Lebanon and King Hiram Lodges, for the use of their Hall during the present Communication.

#### SERVICES OF TYLER.

On motion of Bro. W. Wallace McLeod, it was Resolved, That the sum of Two Dollars be paid Bro. Richard Buker. for his services as Tyler during this Communication.

The Committee appointed to investigate the appeal of Bro. James M. Butcher, vs. Victoria Lodge Number 2, presented their report as follows:

TO THE PRESIDENT

BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES.

GRAND LODGE A. F. AND A. M.,

OF P. E. ISLAND. \*

We, your Committee appointed, at the meeting of your Board, held on the 7th April last, to investigate the appeal of Bro. James M. Butcher, vs. Victoria Lodge, have to report that we find considerable difficulty in arriving at satisfactory conclusions, we however have done the best we could under the circumstances, and herewith submit the following, viz:

The items of dispute are as follows, and are claimed by Victoria Lodge as due by Bro. Butcher:

No. 1.	Commission charged by Bro. Butcher on monies received
other	than fees and dues, viz: 197.06\$9.86
No. 2.	Bro. Bethune, payment5.00
No. 3.	Bro. Blatch. fees
No. 4.	Bro. Alex. McKenzie, dues,2.00
No. 5.	Bro. Butcher's account,
No. 6.	Bro. Boyce,
No. 7.	Bro. Darrach, dues,
No. 8.	And Bro. Butcher claims credit from Victoria Lodge, for
havin	g paid Bro. Higgs on account Grand Lodge, dues 25.00

We have made up the account in the way we think it should stand, and annex it herewith, showing \$16.72 as due by Bro. Butcher to Victoria Lodge.

We also submit the following as our reasons for arriving at the conclusions we did, viz:

No. 1. We debit to Bro. Butcher because we consider it was never intended that he should receive commission on money loaned to the

Lodge, nor on monies raised by Entertainments for the benefit of helping the Lodge funds or charitable purposes.

- No. 2. We find on enquiry that Bro. Bethune was entitled to \$10 for work. Bro. Butcher only paid him \$5 cash, and gave him credit for the other \$5 on account dues. As Bro. Butcher only charged the Lodge with the \$5 cash paid, he ought not to be charged with the \$5 credited to Bro. Bethune for dues.
- No. 3. Your committee find that the \$10 in dispute in Bro. Blatch's account, is not initiation fee, but \$6.00 for 2nd degree, and \$4.00 for 3rd degree, making \$10. claimed by Bro. Blatch to have been paid by him 23rd Aug. and 5th Nov., 1875 respectively. On the 23rd Aug. Bro. Butcher was not present, but on 5th Nov. he was present, and acting as secretary, we therefore charge him with the \$4 which Bro. Blatch is so positive of having paid.
- No. 4. Bro. Alex. McKenzie positively declares he paid Bro. Butcher the \$2 disputed, and we therefore debit Bro. Butcher that amount.
- No. 5. Bro. Butcher's account \$29.39, against the Lodge, which he paid to himself out of the Lodge funds, we find in our opinion to be all right, with the exception of the \$6.3\$ collected from Bro. Sheidow and this portion of it we debit him.

No. 6 and No. 7. Bros. Boyce, \$1.08. Darrach, \$2.00, we could get no information about and as they are only small amounts we have omitted them.

No. 8. We have credited Bro. Butcher, because we learn he paid this amount to Bro. Higgs, on account of dues from Victoria Lodge to the Grand Lodge.

# ANNUAL ADDRESS:

#### BRETHREN,-

Another Masonic year has passed, and as required by our constitution, we are again assembled at this onr Fifth Annual Communication, to labor for the general good of the Fraternity.

I am happy to meet you, and I trust that under Divine Providence the various matters which are to be deliberated upon, may be dealt with in such a manner as will best

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serve the interests of Masonry in this jurisdiction. I sincerely hope that we may each one of us be able to lay aside all individual considerations, and to forget any private differences if any unhappily exist amongst us, and that every effort shall be put forth to advance the cause of our beloved order. If we disagree as to any measure or measures, let us differ as Brethren should, and in all our considerations let us be inspired with that noble emulation of who can best work and best agree.

I feel that at this time it is necessary that an extra exertion should be made by those who have the good of Masonry at heart, as I am under the impression that there is a lukewarmness and apathy existing amongst us, which must be overcome if we wish our institution to flourish.

Our jurisdiction is limited in extent with few lodges, and the membership necessarily small; therefore the greater reason that harmony and unanimity should prevail and that all should give a helping hand.

Our by-laws provide for the appointment by the Grand Master of competent brethren to visit the different lodges, and though I would gladly visit all personally, I find that my business and other engagements will not permit me to do that which I would like, and to conform to the constitution as nearly as possible I have, during the past year, commissioned a number of the members of the Grand Lodge to visit the subordinate lodges as my representatives, and have requested them to furnish to the Grand Lodge at this Annual Communication a report in writing of their doings, and trust that all have attended to their duty, as I am of opinion that the lodges should be visited by the Grand Master or other officer or member of the Grand Lodge at least once a year.

During the past year I have appointed Representatives of this Grand Lodge near other Grand Lodges as follows:

I have issued special dispensations for the following purposes: One to confer degrees at a shorter period than authorized by our constitution, two to appear at an entertainment in Masonic costume, one to elect a secretary, and two to instal officers.

Bro. James M. Butcher was suspended by Victoria Lodge, No. 2, of which he was a member, on the 23rd July, 1879, for alleged unmasonic conduct. He took an appeal to the Grand Lodge, which was laid before the committee on grievances and appeals, but owing to the resignation of Bro. Adam Murray the chairman of said committee, it was referred to the board of general purposes. The board appointed a committee from their number to investigate the case. Their report will be found on the minutes.

On the 23rd October last, Bro. A. H. McPherson, a member of Victoria Lodge, No. 2, forwarded an appeal to the Grand Lodge, against the ruling of the Worshipful Master of said Lodge in declining to put a motion to the Lodge. This appeal was also referred to the board of general purposes.

#### DECISIONS.

I have given two decisions during the year, and I now report same for your consideration:

1st. A brother who has been indefinitely suspended can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication that a motion to that effect would be made.

2nd. The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues cannot by paying his dues entitle him to masonic burial.

I received a notice of the death of M. W. Bro. Israel M. Bullock, Grand Master of Connecticut. He died on the 20th October, 1879, aged 36 years. The memorial committee in their report say of him: "Young in years, mature in jndgment upright in character, honored in his profession, dignified in the performance of duties and beloved by all, he passed away in the vigor of his days." To mortal view verily "his death was untimely," and we stand in the shadow of our bereavement amazed and sorrow-stricken. Worthily did he wear the badge of a Mason which in sadness has been deposited in his grave, and more lasting than the evergreen which has been placed over his remains will be our memory of him.

R. W., Bro. Colin H. Miner, Grand Treasurer, Grand Lodge of Illinois, was called to refreshment in the Grand Lodge above on the 27th May last.

I regret that the suspensions for non-payment of dues have not decreased. There are instances where no doubt it may be necessary to suspend, but I fear that in some cases at least, Lodges in inflicting this penalty, lose sight of the principle taught by the third round of Jacob's ladder. It should be remembered that a suspended brother is deprived of all the rights and privileges of masonry, and that no Lodge has the right of conferring any of these privileges until the brother is legally restored to good standing; therefore the case should be carefully dealt with before the verdict is pronounced.

I am pleased to inform you that the masonic difficulties in Manitoba have terminated, and the brethren in that jurisdiction are now dwelling together in peace and harmony. The masonic bodies in Cuba have also arrived at an understanding, and are now united, being known as the Grand Lodge of Colon and Cuba.

I find that Westmoreland Lodge, No. 10, still owes a balance of ten dollars on their warrant, besides dues from organization, and unless their members come to an understanding with the Grand Lodge, I am of opinion that the best interests of masonry will be served by recalling their charter.

My brethren, in now returning to you the badge of my office, I do so with feelings of both regret and pleasure. Regret that, for the five years I have held the high position of Grand Master, I have been able to accomplish so little. The limited time at my disposal prevented my doing many things which I hoped and wished to have done;—Pleasure from the kindly recollections I shall always have of the courteous and generous treatment I have on all occasions received, not only from the members of the Grand Lodge, but from every member of the fraternity I have met in this jurisdiction.

#### GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the M. W. Grand Lodge A. F. & A. M., of Prince Edward Island.

In compliance with the Constitution of the Grand Lodge, I respectfully submit the following report of the financial and other business transactions of this office.

Immediately on receipt of the books and papers from Past Grand Secretary Higgs, I had the proceedings printed, and on the 1st October mailed three copies to each of the Grand Lodges in the United States and Dominion of Canada, also to the Grand Lodges of England, Ireland and Scotland, and one copy to each officer, past officer and member of this Grand Lodge and each Grand Representative, also one copy for the use of each Subordinate Lodge.

When preparing the proceedings for publication I deemed it necessary to give the names, as near as possible, of the members of the Subordinate Lodges, as I found, on examination of the register, that there appeared the names of 630 brethren as members in good standing,

whereas the Grand Secretary's Report for 1879, stated the number on the roll 548 only. This mistake was caused, in a great measure, by neglecting to enter up the returns received from the Lodges for 1877 and 1878, many demissions and suspensions &c., having occurred and no note made of same on the register, and allowing Lodges to drop names without stating a reason.

I also discovered an error in moneys received by Brother Higgs during the years 1877 and 1878, of \$25.50; one amount (\$24.50) being dues paid by Zetland Lodge, No. 7, in 1877, and \$1.00 from Brother James M. Butcher for fee on appeal. I notified Brother Higgs of these errors in December last, and on the 8th March he paid me the amount.

As a means of giving the officers of the Subordinate Lodges the views of other Grand Lodges on different questions of masonic jurisprudence, I appended to the proceedings "A Digest of Decisions,' compiled from their journals. At the semi-annual communication there was a disposition shown to find fault with me for having published same without the express sanction of Grand Lodge, and a motion was made to that effect, as appears by the minutes. In explaining my motive for doing so, I cannot do better than quote the words of R. W., Brother William P. Innes, Grand Secretary Grand Lodge of Michigan, in his report on Foreign Correspondence, 1880. "At the close of our review we append a compilation of the Decisions made in our sister jurisdictions by their Grand Masters, which will be found of great value to the presiding officers of our Subordinate Lodges.

#### APPEALS.

August 22nd, 1879. I received a notice of Appeal from Brother James M. Butcher against the action of Victoria Lodge, No. 2, in suspending him from all the rights and privileges of masoury.

I forwarded same with all the papers connected therewith to the Chairman of Committee on Grievances and Appeals.

October 23rd, 1879. Received notice of Appeal from Brother A. H. McPherson, Victoria Lodge, No. 2, against the ruling of the W. M. of said Lodge, in declining to put a motion made by Bro. McPherson.

At the semi-annual communication the M.W. Grand Master ordered both cases to be referred to the Board of General Purposes, the chairman of committee having resigned.

This cause of complaint can be avoided if the Masters and Secretaries would see that section 33, page 44, of the constitution is attended to.

Westmoreland Lodge, No. 10, has not furnished any returns, neither dothey take notice of the communications I have sent them.

When publishing the proceedings for this year, I think it necessary that all the suspensions which have taken place since December, 1878, should appear, as I find in one case, a Mason suspended for non-payment of dues is a charter member of a Lodge on the Nova Scotia Register. The brother referred to is John Harkness, he was suspended by Alexandra Lodge, No. 5, on the 9th August, 1879, and his name appears in the proceedings of Nova Scotia. (1878), as a charter member of Wimburn Lodge, No. 75.

## TRUE BROTHERS LODGE, No. 8.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Muster, A. F. & A. M., Prince Edward Island.

## MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER,-

In accordance with commission received from you, I proceeded to True Brothers Lodge as your representative, called special communication on Tuesday, 15th inst., when a goodly number of the brethren presented themselves. By the W. Master's special request, I took the chair, opened Lodge, and handed my commission to the secretary, who read it to the Lodge. I then proceeded to the examination of their minutes, and found that they have been conducting the business of their Lodge in accordance with the constitution, and considering the disadvantages they labor under of living long distances from their Lodge Room, their attendance on Lodge nights does them very great eredit. They appear to be deeply impressed with the duties of Masonry and carry them to a remarkable degree. They have buried two of their brethren at their own expense, paid their doctors' bills, donated money to the relief of deceased's relatives, and are willing to assume doctors' bills of one or two brethren who are now laid up. With all those expenses, and a large number of brethren in arrears, it is not to be wondered at if they find it difficult to raise funds to meet the expenses of Grand Lodge as promptly as is expected from Lodges who are situated in larger centres of population.

I would urge on this Grand Lodge the necessity of sending our Grand Lecturer among the Lodges, especially to True Brothers Lodge, as they are very anxious to receive instructions in ritual; it will stir them up to a greater interest in Lodge work and qualify them to fulfil their Masonic missions. There are a number of brethren who have been made in True Brothers Lodge, returned to the Grand Lodge of England and fees paid, who have never had their Grand Lodge Diplomas sent them. The Lodge has written several times, but no attention has been paid. I would urge their case for the consideration of this Grand Lodge, as those brethren are placed at a great disadvantage, and the Lodge is suffering, as one member withdrew altogether on that account, so the result is he is a non-affiliate, without diploma, and would not be accepted in any other Lodge. He is deprived of his Masonic privileges which he has paid for, and the Lodges are deprived of a man who might be a bright and shining light in the fraternity.

Hoping that this Grand Lodge may devise some means of remedying the evil complained of, I submit this imperfect Report,

To the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island.

As the Representative of the Grand Lodge of Manitoba near that of Prince Edward Island, I beg leave to submit the following Report:

By summons, dated the 10th of June, 1879, the Grand Lodge met on the 19th of June, for the purpose of receiving the report of the M. W. Grand Master, Samuel P. Matheson, on settlement of masonic difficulties, and to perfect terms of agreement, and other matters connected therewith.

The M. W. Grand Master in his report says: "The unhappy differences which have for some time existed in the fraternity here have been augmented and complicated to a degree far beyond my expectations when I entered upon the duties of Grand Master last February.

The settlement consisted in the dissolution of the seceding Grand Lodge, withdrawing all suspensions of Lodges and individual Masons that have in any manner been caused by or arisen out of the difficulties, and also healing all work done by the Lodges not in allegiance with the Grand Lodge of Manitoba, countersigning the warrants of two Lodges for the purpose of legalizing the same, the Grand Master to do all possible to have the representatives of Foreign Grand Lodges whose appointments have been cancelled in consequence of the difficulties, re-instated in their former stations, and to provide for the payment of the liabilities of the seceding body, and also for transfer of assets.

The whole matter was then finally settled and all former disagreements ceased to exist.

The Fifth Annual Communication was held at Winnipeg, on the 11th February, 1880.

M. W., Samuel P. Matheson, Grand Master, presiding, all the Lodges (10) were represented.

The Grand Master in his address referred to the settlement of the question in dispute, and other matters of local interest.

Statistics:—Lodges, 10; Under dispensation, 1; Initiated, 46; Passed, 33; Raised, 35; Affiliated, 19; Restored, 3; Demitted, 29; Suspended, N. P. D., 31; Died, 1; Total membership; 360.

As this Grand Lodge took no action in regard to the trouble that has shaken the Grand Lodge of Manitoba to its very centre, we will now be in a position to extend our congratulations to our sister Grand Lodge in the prairie Province of our Dominion for the happy termination of all matters in dispute, and trust that the experience gained in the past may stand up as a beacon light to warn, not only them, but all masonic bodies, from the rocks on which they split.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, A. F. & A. M.

I beg leave to submit the following Report, as the Representative of the Grand Lodge of Utah near this Grand Lodge, and in doing so will endeavor to present to view all matters of interest.

The Eighth Annual Communication was held at Salt Lake City. commencing 11th November, 1879, when all the Lodges (six) were represented. The R. W., Frank Tilford, Deputy, Grand Master, presiding.

The M. W., Thomas Edward Clohecy, Grand Master, being unavoidably absent, transmitted his Annual Address to the Grand Lodge, which was read by P. G. M., John Shaw Scott. From the same I quote the following: "Happy those, whose retrospective glance brings with it no keen awakening of conscience for errors committed or opportunities for doing good unimproved; happy they, who can with clean hearts say, that in their intercourse with their fellow-men they have at all times been influenced by the principles of morality and brotherly love; that they have ever been ready to go out of the way to help a brother; that they have ever regarded his welfare as their own; that they have stretched forth the hand to assist a falling brother, and have whispered good counsel in his ear, kindly admonishing him and aiding in his reformation." Referring to the death of Brother Reuben H. Robertson, P. G. M., the M. W. Grand Master, says of him: "By nature unselfish, with a heart abounding in the

most generous impulses, staunch in his friendships, his hand ever open to relieve the wants of his distressed fellowmen, a liberal supporter of all enterprises for the diffusion of light and knowledge, Brother Robertson has endeared himself to all in a degree that few have equalled and none excelled."

At the Seventh Annual Communication, a proposition was submitted and discussed to alternate the place of meeting. The Grand Master doubted at the outset whether the mover of the resolution was in earnest, and regards it as fortunate that the good sense of the members prevented the consummation of the step, remarking that a perambulating Grand Lodge is a source of great annoyance to the craft, losing much of its dignity and influence by reason of its migratory character.

By the report of Brother Diehl, as Grand Librarian, it appears that that branch is in a flourishing condition, and I cannot pass over the same without giving you the following closing remarks: "Indirectly the Library is a great help to our Lodges, and an auxiliary to masonry in the Territory, and as a nucleus for intelligent information it cannot be surpassed. Masons are taught to search for 'more light,' and that cannot be found more readily than in a good library, the foundation of which is laid. It is in your power, brothers, to complete the building and extend its usefulness, that it may give brain food to every inhabitant of Utah."

We cannot fail to observe by the foregoing that the library is not confined to members of the fraternity only, but open to the whole community, and there can be no doubt that it will become a lasting benefit to the many who will avail themselves of the opportunity it affords for the increase of knowledge.

The Deputy Grand Master in his report, referring to the library says: "Among the many good works done by the masonic fraternity of Utah, no act deserves more commendation, or has resulted in greater benefit to the community, than the establishment of the library, It is a gratifying fact, that not only the members of our association, but a numerous class of readers, outside of our Lodges have drawn largely on its stores. The influences which radiate from such sources are silent and unseen forces, yet ever active and all-potent, working in the cause of virtue and happiness.

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A member of Argenta Lodge had charges preferred against him, and was expelled, for uniting himself with the Mormon Church. This at first sight appears strange, as we are taught that "Masonry unitessmen of every country, sect, and opinion"; but we must look a little

further and remember that we are also taught to "conform with cheerfulness to the Government of the country in which we live." The latter the Mormons do not, because the practices of their church are in direct violation of the laws of the United States. Our brethren in Utah have, therefore, taken a step in the right direction.

The Grand Secretary reports for the year, Initiated, 22; Passed, 21; Raised, 20; Total membership, 377.

The proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island are acknowledged.

Brother Gumbert Goldberg, the representative of this Grand Lodge, appears on their list of officers as Senior Grand Warden.

Brother Frank Tilford was elected Grand Master, and Brother Christopher Diehl, re-elected Grand Secretary, both of Sall Lake City.

# Instructions to Secretaries.

The Financial Return is intended to show the cash transactions with Grand Lodge for the whole year; therefore if ten candidates have been raised during the year, and if five of these ten have been supplied with diplomas, leaving five to be supplied at the time of sending in the Annual returns, the Secretary should not write

5 Diplomas, &c., &c.

5 Enrolments, &c., &c.

As is frequently done, but

10 Diplomas, &c., &c.

10 Enrolments, &c., &c.

Noting the cash paid, (if any) and forwarding the balance.

The registration and diploma return must contain the names of all raised and affiliated during the year, and in the case of a joining member, the name of his former Lodge must be inserted in the column for remarks. If any have been supplied with diplomas, write the word supplied opposite the name, in the column for remarks.

The first names must be written in full, and not abbreviated as is too often the case. In the return of subscribing members be careful to give the names of the newly installed officers, not those of the year just passed. Compare the return with that of the previous year, and make them agree.

All returns should be forwarded to the Grand Secretary immediately after the 27th December. In making returns of suspensions, demissions and deaths, give dates.

# Amendments to Constitution.

## FEBRUARY, 1876.

Resolved, That the blank clause in the constitution relative to the salary of the Grand Secretary, be completed by inserting the words "one hundred and fifty dollars."

## JUNE, 1879.

Resolved, That section 6, page 55, of the constitution be amended by striking out the word "two" and substituting the word "one" in the sixth line, and all after the word "him" in the same line.

## DECEMBER, 1879.

Resolved, That the resolution passed on the 21st day of February, 1878, page 26 of the Journal of this Grand Lodge, be rescinded, and the following substituted, viz:—.

That section 13, page 18, of the constitution, be changed to read as follows:—"The Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge shall be holden alternately in the city of Charlottetown and town of Summerside on the Festival day of Saint John the Baptist, unless that day shall fall upon a Saturday or Sunday, when it shall be held on the Monday following."

## JUNE, 1880.

That section 34, page 45, be amended by striking out the words "27th day of December" and inserting the words "30th day of April."

# Standing Resolutions.

## FEBRUARY, 1876.

Whereas. Intemperance is an evil that afflicts humanity and injures society, and whereas our time-honored and beloved institution has, through its agency and the indiscretion of some of its members, suffered from its influences, and whereas we regard the excessive use of alcoholic liquors as a violation of the principles of Free Masonry, and as a sin against God, the Grand Artificer of the universe,

Therefore Resolved, That this Grand Lodge records its disapprobation of the custom of having intoxicating drinks at Masonic suppers and festivals.

## FEBRUARY, 1877.

Resolved, That the Subordinate Lodges forward to the Grand Secretary as soon as possible after St. John's Day, 27th December, the names of the officers elected and installed.

## JUNE, 1879.

Resolved, That the Grand Tyler, in future, be paid Five Dollars for his services for each communication he may attend.

## DECEMBER, 1879.

Resolved, That the term "seafaring men" in clause 2, page 53, of the constitution, does not extend or apply to persons employed in vessels known as "coasters," or in any vessel trading between portson the Atlantic sea board of North America.

# Decisions Rendered by the Grand Master.

PHYSICAL QUALIFICATION.—There is nothing in the constitution or landmarks for disqualifying a hunchback from being initiated into Masonry, provided he could comply with all the ceremonies of the initiation in the several degrees.—(Proceedings, May 1877).

Lodge Business.—It is not competent for a Subordinate Lodge at an emergent meeting to enter on any other business than that specified on the summons.—(Proceedings, 1877).

RESTORATION.—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication that a motion to that effect would be made.—Proceedings, 1880).

MASONIC BURIAL.—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot, by paying his dues, entitle him to masonic burial.—(Proceedings, 1880).

MOTIONS.—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880).
