Failure of the Honey Crop.—California bees have for several years been a prolific source of the honey supply. The honey crop of that State is this year a failure, and the price of honey is therefore likely to advance.

Out Rats for Pros.—Some people will pick up what falls in the street, and do no harm even to the pig pen. The rooting over of this straw in search of the grain will soon mix it with the manure pile, and the pigs will find it just such liberty condoning as they should in the before heavy grain feeding for fattening begins.

Sheep for Orchards.—A flock of sheep will pick up what falls in the orchard even more actively than the dog of hogs. The pig is naturally a lazy animal, he is if fed as he should be and kept well-fed, as is most consistent with profit. Sheep will get more benefit from pasture in orchards than will pigs, and will deposit their droppings more evenly.

The Cost of Underdraining.—The great cost of underdraining is the chief bug-bear which prevents many farmers from underdraining it. But the proper way to look at underdraining is as a permanent investment, for well laid tile will practically last forever. In this case only the interest on first cost need be calculated, and underdraining will pay large interest than anything else the farm can do.

Weeds and briars that have grown up by ditch lands and in fence corners, as well as around the outbuildings and sheds, and along the hedge rows of the fields, will soon be maturing their seeds, and should be removed in time. An arduous of green grain cut as forage will make a good feed for a cow. The same arduous, allowed to ripen, would make very little grain, and the straw would be of little value to feed. The use of as much as possible of green forage is true economy.

Give meadows a top-dressing of old manure or fine compost. Harrow bare and mossy spots in pasture and sow seed on them. Give a dressing of lime or plaster. Cut brush with a brush-hook; burn and sow the ashes. This is a harvest month for weeds. The perennial kinds run up to flower, and will ripen seeds to make future trouble. Cut and burn if they cannot be grubbed up by the roots. The manure-heap should increase in size. Add to it potato tops and other refuse, weeds that have not gone to seed, sods from the roadside, &c.
