Religious Rags.

From an article entitled "A Ride through the Trans-Balkal" in the May Century, by George Kennan, we quote the following "All day Wednesday we rode southward through a rather dreary and desolate region of sandy pine barrens or wide stretches of short, dead grass, broken here and there by low hills covered with birch, larches, and evergreens. Now and then we met a train of small, one-horse wagons loaded with that had come overland across Mongolia from Pekin, or two or three mounted Burials (Boorvats) in disheveled hats and long brown kaftans (karfians), upon the breasts of which had been sewn zigzags of red cloth that suggested a Puritan Scapular Letter." As a rule, however, the road seemed to be little traveled and scantily settled, and in a ride of nearly fifty miles we saw nothing of interest except here and there on the summits of hills, small, frosted piles of stones, which Mr. Frost called "Bariat shrines." All over Siberia it is the custom of the natives when they cross the top of a high hill or mountain to make a propitiatory offering to the spirits of storm and tempest. Washington as a Farmer.

From a profusely illustrated series of articles on the Centennial of Washington's inauguration we quote the following: "Good reason had M. D. Jones de Warville, the traveler and author (the 'brisk little Frenchman' who became the chief of Gironde and died by the guillotine in 1793), to cry out in astonishment of the general's success in farming when he went the rounds of Mount Vernon in the autumn of 1788. The estates were then at the highest pitch of improvement they ever attained, crops of wheat, tobacco, corn, barley, and buckwheat 'bordering the ground.' What excited the Frenchman's chief surprise was that every barn and cabin, garage and clearing, field and orchard, passed daily beneath the eye of the master.

All the busy life of the negro world was regulated by his personal directions to overseers and bailiffs. No item was too insignificant to bring before his notice. The minutest contract for work agreed upon was put into writing. How curious for example, the agreement with Philip Barter, the gardener, found among Washington's papers, where in Philip binds himself to keep sober for a year, and to fulfill his duties on the place, if allowed 'four dollars at Christmas, with which to be drunk four days and four nights; two dollars at Easter, to suffer the same purpose; two dollars at Whitsuntide, to be drunk for two days; a dram in the morning, and a drink of grog at dinner, at noon. For true and faithful performance of all these things, the parties have heretofore set their hands, this twenty-third day of April, Anno Domini, 1787.

Terms Used in Feeding-Rations.

The albuminoids, sometimes called protein, are the principal nitrogenous portions of the fodders. It is out of this class of nutrients that the muscular structure of an animal is formed, hence they are sometimes denominated muscle formers. The albuminoids are not known to be definite compounds, but are made up of a large number of nitrogenous products of animal and vegetable origin. Albumen and gluten are common examples of this class of products.

Amides is a term sometimes used in connection with certain fodders, but not so frequently as albuminoids. The nitrogenous materials of feeding stuffs is in the form of amides. Sometimes a considerable portion of this nitrogenous matter is in what may be termed an unorganized or transitory state, and in this state the nitrogen amides have been given it. The feeding value of amides has not been so well determined as in the albuminoids, they are generally set down as having less of nutritive value.

Nitrogen-free extracts—that is, extractive matter, nitrogen-free, or free of nitrogen—commonly called carbo-hydrates, or carb-hydrates, is a mixture of various substances found in fodders, such as starch, sugar, gum, and several other nutritive parts, and is less valuable than the albuminoids.
