





The Parties to the Case Which Will Shortly

British Troops Leaving Egypt.

London, Jan. 10.—The reduction of the British army in Egypt was begun to-day, when 806 troops departed for here. By April 8614 men will have been withdrawn, leaving a Berlin, Jan. 10.—Official newspapers say that Prince Bismarck will certainly intervene in the debate on the Army Bill in the Reichstan, and that he will insist upon the adoption of the seven years' terms, conceding nothing to the opponents of the measure.
