# The Order of Morning Prayer.

¶ The Service shall be the same with the usual office for Holydays, except where it is in this Office otherwise appointed.

¶ Let him that ministereth read with an audible voice these sentences of Scripture ; and after them the Exhortation—Dearly beloved Brethren, &c.

To the Lord our God belong mercies and forgivenesses, though we have rebelled against him ; neither have obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his laws, which he set before us.

In my trouble I will call upon the Lord, and complain unto my God. So shall he hear my voice out of his holy temple.

¶ Proper Psalms, LI, LVI, LXXIII.

¶ First Lesson, Isaiah X. verse 5—19, both inclusive.

¶ After the first Lesson shall follow—Te Deum laudamus.

¶ Second Lesson, Matth. III. 1—12.

¶ Then the Benedictus, the Creed, &c. to the end of the Lord's Prayer.

¶ Then the Priest, standing up, shall say,

Priest. O Lord, shew thy mercy upon us.

Answ. And grant us thy salvation.

Priest. O Lord, save the King.

Answ. Who putteth his trust in Thee.

Priest. Send him help from thy holy place.

Answ. And evermore mightily defend him.

*Priest.* Let his enemies have no advantage against him,

*Answ.* Let not the wicked approach to hurt him.

*Priest.* O Lord, save thy people.

*Answ.* And bless thine inheritance.

*This and the following Collect to be used instead of the first Collect for Morning Prayer.*

**O** ALMIGHTY God, who rulest over all the kingdoms of the earth, and on whose most gracious Providence they depend evermore for preservation and prosperity ; extend, we beseech thee, thy goodness to the people of this land, and to all our fellow subjects wheresoever they are dispersed ; who, looking up to Thee, as the author of all blessings, and their safeguard and mighty deliverer in all dangers, do now implore thy watchful care and protection. Grant us unfeigned repentance for our past transgressions, and for our forgetfulness of thy sovereign dominion ; and fill us with lively gratitude for thy forbearance in the exercise of that dominion towards us ; so that we may become fit subjects of thy future mercies ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**O** LORD God of our Salvation, without whose favour the wisest counsels, and the mightiest armies are weak and vain ; incline thine ear, we pray thee, to the supplications of thy servants ; who, not confiding in their own strength, or wisdom, or any human aid, most humbly have recourse to thee for succour in this time of danger, and who put their trust under the shadow of thy wings. Be to us a tower of defence against our enemies,

enemies. Frustrate their designs against our parent State ; and so bless the arms of our gracious Sovereign, that we being preserved, through thy help, from all disasters, and made happy triumphant over all the disturbers of our peace, may joyfully magnify thy glorious name, and serve thee from generation to generation, in all godliness, through Jesus Christ, our blessed Saviour and Redeemer. Amen.

**T**hen shall follow the second and third Collects at Morning Prayer ; and the Litany.

**T**Instead of the Collect at the end of the Litany [We humbly beseech thee] shall the following be used.

**O** LORD, we beseech thee, mercifully hear our prayers, and spare all those who confess their sins unto thee ; they, whose consciences by sin are accused, by thy merciful Pardon may be absolved, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

**T**hen shall the people say this that followeth, after the Minister.

**T**URN us, O good Lord, and so shall we be turned. Be favourable, O Lord, be favourable to thy people, who turn to thee in fasting and prayer. For thou art a merciful God, full of compassion, long suffering, and of great pity. Thou sparest when we deserve punishment ; and in thy wrath, thinkest upon mercy. Spare thy people, good Lord, spare them, and let not thy heritage be brought to confusion. Hear us, O Lord, for thy mercy is great ; and after the multitude of thy mercies, look upon us, through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

LORD, most gracious and powerful, we thy sinful people here assembled, do prostrate ourselves before thee, and knowledge it thine infinite mercy, that for our manifold and inious provocations we are not consumed, and given over a ey to the enemy and avenger. We confess, with sorrow and nfusion, our long unfruitfulness under the means of Grace, d the many wonderful deliverances of our Church and Nation, hich thou, of thy unspeakable goodness, hast been pleased to ouchsafe unto us. Give us, we beseech thee, a still deeper sense our guilt and unworthiness. Shouldest thou, O Lord, enter to judgment with us for the crying sins of our Nation, our ofaneness and infidelity, our heresies and schisms, our gross im- rities and intemperance, our levities and love of pleasures d vanity, and other manifold offences ; thou mightest stly inflict the severity of thy wrath. But look down, we amably beseech thee, with pity upon thy servants, who, with ntrite hearts bewail our transgressions, and implore thy pardon r the sake, and through the merits and mediation, of thy eter- al Son, Christ Jesus. Forsake us not at this awful and perilous onjunction ; let our Nation still enjoy the light of thy coun- nance, and the support of thy protecting arm. Teach us to ely on thy Almighty aid, and to ascribe our successes to thy un- erited favour. Cause our losses and disappointments to work gether for our good ; and so influence our minds by the opera- ons of thy Holy Spirit, that being turned froin the error of ur ways to newness of life, we may thankfully walk before thee all righteousness and holiness ; and finally inherit thine ever- sting kingdom, through Jesus Christ, our only mediator and dvocate. Amen.

*T*nstead of the Prayer in time of war and tumults, let the following be used.

**O** ALMIGHTY God, maker of the universe, and sovereign disposer of the affairs of men ; at whose command, Nations and Empires rise and fall, flourish and decay : We, these unworthy servants most humbly implore thy gracious aid and protection. We flee unto thee for succour, in this time of peril and necessity, when, in defence of our liberty, our laws and our religion, we are exposed to the dangers and calamities of war by a fierce and haughty foe. Vouchsafe, we beseech thee, thine especial protection to our most gracious Sovereign Lord, King GEORGE. Direct his counsels, prosper all his measures for the welfare of his dominions, and the preservation of our Church and of our civil Constitution. And let no internal divisions, nor any other sins and provocations of this nation, obstruct his designs for the public good, nor bring down thy judgments upon us. But spare thy people, O Lord, spare them ; and, by thy Grace, so unite us in a spirit of obedience to thy Law, Zeal for thy Truth, and Loyalty to thine appointed Servant, whom thy good Providence hath set over us, that we may evermore rejoice in thy Salvation, through thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**W**E humbly beseech thee, most merciful God, that by thy Grace thou wouldest keep alive in us, who have this day presumed to implore such great blessings, a constant sense of thy presence, and of our dependence upon thee. Suffer us not to return to our former disobedience and sinfulness, nor again to yield to those evil passions and desires, which have brought down thy just judgments upon us : But save us, O God, fav

save us, not only from wordly, but also from our spiritual enemies ; and most especially, save us from ourselves, from our sinful inclinations and habits, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**n:** ¶ Then the Prayer for the Lieutenant-Governor, the General Banks, driving, and to the end of the Morning Prayer, as usual.

## The Communion Service.

After the Prayer for the King [Almighty God, whose Kingdom is everlasting] shall be read the Collects of the day, as in the Morning Prayer [O Almighty God, who rulest, and, O Lord God of our Salvation] and then shall follow—

For the Epistle. Revel. III. 14—19, both inclusive.

The Gospel. Luke XIII. 1—9, both inclusive.

Then shall follow the Nicene Creed, and after that the Sermon.  
After the Prayer [for the whole state of Christ's Church] the following shall be used.

**M**OST merciful God, the fountain of all wisdom and power, we humbly beseech thee to bless thy faithful servant, our gracious and beloved Sovereign, King GEORGE. Preserve and prolong his life, a blessing to his subjects; defend him against all secret conspiracies and open violence; direct his counsels, and prosper his anxious cares and endeavours for the safety of his people;

people; and for the restoration of peace to them, and to the world, now visited with the calamities of war. Vouchsafe thy assistance to his Fleets and Armies. Be thou their shield in the day of Battle, and crown their exertions with victory. Thy judgments are abredad, may the Inhabitants of the earth learn righteousness. And when thou hast performed thy whole work on a degenerate world, in reclaiming those who have forsaken thee; and conyincing them there is a God who ruleth and judgeth the earth, may the blessings of amity and peace succeed the horrors of discord. And may our gracious Sovereign, according to his benevolent disposition, be a happy instrument in thy hand, of accomplishing thy merciful purpose, and of diffusing those blessings. Hear us, O Lord, and grant these our petitions for Jesus Christ his sake. Amen.

¶ Then the Minister shall dismiss the Congregation with the usual Benediction [The peace of God which passeth all understanding].

¶ God be merciful unto us, &c.

¶ Then the Creed &c. to the end of the Lord's Prayer.

¶ Then the Priest, standing up, shall say,

Priest. O Lord, shew thy mercy upon us.

Answe. And grant us thy salvation. And so, as in the Morning  
Prayer.

¶ Instead of the first Collect for Evening Prayer, the two following  
[O Almighty God who rulest over all the kingdoms of the  
earth—and—O Lord God of our salvation] as in the Morning  
Prayer for this day, shall be used.

¶ Then the second and third Collects for Evening Prayer, as usual,  
after which shall be read the Prayer in the Morning Service [O  
Lord, we beseech thee, mercifully hear our Prayers] and then  
the Minister, standing up, shall say, the people repeating after him—  
[Turn us, O good Lord, and so shall we be turned] as in the  
Morning Prayer. And then shall follow the usual Prayers for the  
King, the Royal Family and Clergy.

¶ Instead of the Prayer in time of war and tumult, shall be used the two  
following Prayers [O Almighty God, maker of the universe,  
and We humbly beseech thee, most merciful God] as in the  
Morning Service.

¶ After the Prayer for all conditions of men (O God, the creator and  
preserver of all mankind) shall be read the prayer in the Commu-  
nion Service of this day (Most merciful God, the fountain of all  
wisdom and power) Then the prayer for the Lieutenant Governor,  
the General Thanksgiving, and to the end of the usual Evening  
Prayer.
