much activity if not of important hostilities. Bulgarian troops in large numbers crossed the Greek border and occupied without resistance Rupel and Demirhisar on the River Struma.

The allied forces are entirely with the Central European Powers. It was reported that the Serbian troops were re-embarking on the island of Corfu and had reached Salonika by sea, the 700-mile voyage being made necessary by the refusal of the Greek Government to permit their transport by railway.

The Austro-Italian campaign was prosecuted with the usual vigor, but with the tide again turning in favor of the Italians, who were said to have checked the Austrian advance in the Trentino.

The naval events of the period under review were of outstanding importance, and are referred to in 'News of the Sea' and elsewhere in this issue. The result of the Battle of Jutland are only to be conjectured until the actual damage inflicted upon the German fleet has been definitely ascertained.

It is only too apparent that ordinary methods of recruiting have proved inadequate, and the Government will be forced to adopt some measure of compulsory service to secure the necessary recruits.

The JUTLAND NAVAL BATTLE. LIMITATIONS of space prevent us from printing the voluminous reports of the battle from the light German High Sea fleet which took place between Skagerrack and Horns Reef off the coast of Jutland on Wednesday afternoon, October 31, 1914.

It is now definitely known that they equal both in number and tonnage the British losses. That it was a real British victory is now established beyond dispute. The weather conditions, affecting the protection of visibility to the German fleet, were against the British, as also the vastly superior number of German ships engaged, which included most of their battleships, two or perhaps three of which were sunk.

On the Russian front in Europe, after a period of relative quiescence and only defensive activity, the Russian began an offensive movement on their whole line from the Pripiat Marshes to the Rumanian border, and enormous initial successes are reported.
