Water fowl known as mallard, grey duck, black duck, wood or summer duck shall not be hunted, taken or killed between 1st of January and 15th of August.

The eggs of any of the above-mentioned birds are not to be taken.

No traps or nets shall be set for the purpose of taking game birds at any time.
