

TO BE APPEALED Leave Granted in St. John Matter -Fredericton Board of Trade

Fredericton, N. B., Feb. 11—The February term of the Supreme Court opened this morning with Chief Justice Barker and Judge McKeown absent. Judge Landry, as senior puisne judge, presided. In the case of the King vs. John W. Allen, Mr. Weyman moved for leave to appeal from conviction. His point was that the wife of the accused was subpoensed by the crown to give evidence and did give evidence against the accused. The prisoner was indicted and convicted for obtaining money under false pretences.

Attorney-General Grimmer consented that leave be granted and leave to appeal was granted. The case is to be heard on the second Friday. This is a St. John case.


