THE LEGISLATURE.
We have this day the pleasure of laying before our readers the Speech of His Excellency, the leading feature of which is the "East River" question, in reference to which His Excellency tenders his best wishes and assistance for its completion, and adds that it would be highly gratifying to Her Majesty's Government, could a junction of that description be formed for linking together the British appendages of the Crown on this Continent; but we are sorry to add, that no offer whatever of assistance is made from the Home Government. In reference to the address from the House of Assembly of last Session, relative to the making of the Legislative Council elective, His Excellency states that although Her Majesty's Government evinces a disposition to meet the wishes of the people of this country in any Constitutional question, *causa deliberata*, yet they are not disposed to look well to it in making changes in the Constitution, nor do they intend to alter the House of Representatives to be the House, the Address, or echo to the Speech, as moved by Mr. Thompson, and seconded by Mr. Hayward, whereupon Mr. Ritchie moved an amendment, and accompanied his motion with a lengthy speech, the burden of which was that neither the Country nor the House possessed confidence in His Excellency's advisers. "We have no space, however, to go into detail on this subject this week, but this we may say, that we think the amendment of Mr. Ritchie, at present, perfectly out of place. If Responsible Government is really to be established in the country (and to which we have no objection) let its advocates begin at the beginning, and the very first step to which the surrender to the Executive is the initiation of the Money Grants; and as this step has been taken of it in His Excellency's speech, we trust that should the House permit its time to be frittered away in the discussion of this hitherto fruitless question, His Excellency will find it necessary to dissolve the House, in order that those who have conducted it in the manner in which it has been conducted, may be consigned to their original obscurity, as men not to be trusted, and wholly unfit to legislate for an enlightened people. What we would ask, can be the meaning of the advocates being so strenuous for Responsible Government, when they themselves have not submitted to its first and leading principle, that of placing the Initiation of Money Grants into their hands, and giving them something for which to be responsible."
