

## ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1853.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1854.

THE Committee of Management of the Saint George's Society, in accordance with the By-Laws, has the honor to submit the Annual statements of the affairs of the Society.

Its proceedings for the current year have varied but little from its usual routing.

The able Sub-Committee of Charity, the very essence of the Society, and on which devolves its most onerous duties, has expended, in relief, the sum of £84 6s. 5d.; a detail of which will be found in the books, now on the table for inspection. The sum is about the average of former years; but, in view of the general prosperity of the country, it might naturally have been expected that fewer claims would have presented themselves. The Committee deem it their duty to remark, with the view, if possible, of devising some remedy, that a very large portion of this year's expenditure, on this head, has arisen from the necessity of procuring passages to the old country for those coming from other parts of the Province—and it would seem but just that some portion of this should be borne by the sister societies of those towns from which such applicants may come.

The financial position of the Society will be found embodied in the Treasurer's Report—it is still prosperous. The permanent fund now amounts to the sum of £1,376 8s. 9d.,—the cash on hand to £81 8s. 9d.

The Society has received an addition, during the present year, of 2 life and 8 ordinary members, and 5 ordinary members have become life members. The following gentlemen were elected honorary members:—Geo. P. Ridout, Esq., of Toronto, C. W.; Col. Thorndike, R. A.; F. S. Carpenter, Esq., Asst. Commissary General; and Lieut. Col. Moore, 54th Regiment.

The Anniversary of the Society was celebrated by the members attending Divine Service at the Cathedral. His Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, the Patron, and the Rev. A. W. Mountain, one of the Chaplains of the Society, performed the service, and the Sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Mackie, also a Chaplain to the Society.

To the organist of the Cathedral, John Carter, Esquire, the ladies and gentlemen of the Choir, and other amateur musicians in the city, the Society was indebted for a very splendid musical service. The collection in aid of the Charitable Fund amounted to £35 5s.; and on no occasion was the Cathedral so filled to overflowing.

The Society has to lament the loss, by death, of William Patton, Esq., one of its life members, and for several years its President and always its warm friend:—this gentleman, a true-hearted Englishman, had, by his kindness of disposition, made himself beloved by every individual member of the Society.

Death has also deprived the Society of another valued member, Charles Poston; Esquire, its last President, who died whilst on a visit to his native land.

The obituary list also contains the names of Mr. James Poole and Mr. Fletcher, both members of old standing.

## REPORT OF THE CHARITABLE COMMITTEE FOR 1853.

---

The Charitable Committee have much satisfaction in laying a statement of their proceedings before the Society for the information of the members, and which will be found similar to that of the preceding year. The number of cases relieved being forty; the amount of relief afforded, £84 6s. 5d., currency;—the greater portion of which has been paid to provide conveyance to England or Canada West. Some of the applicants had evidently seen better days, and others were of great age and quite unable to earn their own livelihood.

The Committee, when called upon to meet together to take into consideration applications for relief, carefully enquired into each case, in order to afford such assistance as would most effectually accomplish the object of the applicants.

It must be gratifying to every Englishman, more particularly to the members of the Society, to know that his fellow-countrymen are well cared for when thrown upon our shores; to carry out which object has been the endeavor of your Committee.

REPORT  
OF THE  
TREASURER OF THE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY,  
FOR THE YEAR 1854.

---

The Treasurer, in submitting his Annual Report, has much pleasure in stating that the transactions of the Society during the year have been highly satisfactory, both as respects the receipts from subscriptions, and amount paid in charity; forty cases have received relief, amounting to the sum of £84 6s. 5d. The receipts from the annual subscriptions, entrance fees and donations, during the year, have been £49 8s. 11d., £6 7s. 3d. of which was received from the Committee of the complimentary dinner given to Messrs. Jackson and Betts, being the fourth part of the balance remaining in their hands. Also, the sum of two pounds ten shillings from James Garrett, Esq. The increase of the permanent fund this year has been £59 14s. 3d., the total amount being £1376 8s. 9d., £1300, of which is invested in Bank Stock and other securities; £20, remaining in the hands of the late Treasurer, being the balance due the Society on the deposit of two fire debentures of £200, for the purchase of four new shares of Montreal Bank Stock, and the balance of £56 8s. 9d., is deposited in the Savings Bank.


Five ordinary members have become life members during the past year, and two members have joined as life members, and eight new members have been added to our numbers during the same period.

The Treasurer must again draw the attention of the members to the large amount of arrears which have increased this year in the sum of £23 10s., the total amount being £87 15s.

The Right Honorable John George, Earl of Durham, G. C. B., Patron. Died at Cowes, Isle of Wight, 28th July, 1840, at the age of 48 years.

The Right Honorable Lord Sydenham, G. C. B. Died at Kingston, C. W., September, 1841, at the age of 42 years.

The Right Honorable Sir Charles Bagot, G. C. B. Died at Kingston, C. W., 18th May, 1843, at the age of 62 years.

William Kemble, past President. Died at Quebec, 5th March, 1845, at the age of 64 years.

Charles Gibbs Gortley. Died at Dartmouth, England, 24th March, 1846, at the age of 35 years.

Froste Ralph Grey. Died at Quebec, 11th April, 1846, at the age of 38 years.

James John Low, Esq. Died at St. Foy, near Quebec, 23rd July, 1846, at the age of 45 years.

The Right Honorable Lord Metcalfe, G. C. B., Patron. Died at his seat, near Basingstoke, Hants, 5th September, 1846, at the age of 62 years.

John Jeffrey. Died at Quebec, 13th December, 1846, at the age of 52 years.

Anthony Anderson. Died at Hedley Lodge, Quebec, 3rd April, 1847, at the age of 80 years.

John Racey, M. D. Esq., one of the Physicians to the Society. Died at Quebec, 25th October, 1847, at the age of 39 years.

William Phillips. Died at Quebec, 4th April, 1849, at the age of 59 years.

John Charlton Fisher, past President. Died on board Steamer "Sarah Sands" on her passage from Liverpool to New York, on the 10th August 1849, at the age of 55 years.

Abraham Lenfesty. Died at Quebec, 13th July, 1849, at the age of 40.

Thomas Yates. Died at Quebec, 17th July, 1849, at the age of 62.

William Benjamin Poston. Died at San Francisco, October, 13th, 1850, at the age of 25.

William John Chapman Benson. Died at Whitehall, U. S., December, 3rd, 1850, at the age of 33.

Peter Patterson. Died at his residence, Montmorency Falls, 12th June, 1851, at the age of 83 years.

Stephen Codman, native of the City of Norwich, England, came to Canada in 1816, as organist of the Cathedral. Died at Quebec, 6th October, 1852, at the age of 56 years. The congregation have erected a tablet to his memory in the Cathedral Church.

William Patton, born at Low Leyton, County of Essex, 26th July, 1798; came to Canada, 16th June, 1819; seven years President of St. George's Society. Died at Quebec, 1853.

Charles Poston, born at Whitechurch, Shropshire, 3rd October, 1788; came to Canada, 23d May, 1815; Past President. Died in England, 5 April, 1853.
