FIFTY SIX DEAD IN MEXICAN MINE DISASTER

Gas Explosion the Cause; Many Are Injured; Victims Mostly Natives

LAREDO, Tex. Feb. 2.—One of the greatest disasters in the history of Mexican coal mining took place early today in the Palmito mine at Laredo, Coahuila, Mex. The toll of human life is officially placed at fifty six, while the list of injured numbers nearly as many.

The explosion occurred in the No. 3 shaft of the coal mine of the Esperanza Mining Company and it is attributed to the ignition of gas from a cigarette of a miner who was smoking contrary to the rules.
