C A P. XIX.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and ten, an Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, for permitting the Importation of Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, and Timber, for Naval Purposes, from the *British Colonies in North America*, Duty-free. [21st *March* 1808.]

WHEREAS the Law herein-after mentioned has by Experience been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be continued ; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That an Act made in the Forty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act to permit until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and nine,*
