MONO MILLS IN ASHES.

Eleven Buildings, Comprising the Business Portion, Burned—Narrow Escape of Several Children.

The most disastrous fire that has ever visited Mono Mills took place about 10.45 Thursday night and there it burned itself out the business portion of the town was laid to ashes. Eleven buildings in all were destroyed.

The fire is thought to be the work of an incendiary, and a tramp who had been in the village that evening was once arrested, but a search failed to find him. Mr. Crockett ejected him from the hotel early in the evening, and it is thought that he took this way in having his revenge. The flames were first noticed in the hay loft.

So quick the fire burned that Mr. Crockett's family had the greatest difficulty in getting out of the house, and several little children who were sleeping in their beds had to be hurriedly picked up and carried out in their night dresses. Old man Kidd was asleep in his residence, about 100 yards from where the fire started, and it was with little exertion that he was taken out in safety. As soon as he was thoroughly awakened he rushed back into the house for a bag of old toys and succeeded in saving it.

A heavy draught station, Freedom, belonging to a man named Brown, and a large house owned by Henry Allen were burned. Freedom was worth about \$1000. The total loss will be in the neighborhood of \$10,000.

IT WILL BE A RARE SIGHT.
