


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

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#### EXTRACTS.

Extracts from the Proceedings of the County Council of Oxford at the December Session, 1878.

Moved by Mr. Munro, seconded by Mr. T. Cowing, and Resolved—That the communication from the Clerk referring to the revision of the By-laws of this Council be referred to a Select Committee composed of Messrs. Hopkins, Field, Cook, W. Peers and the mover for their report at this Session of the Council.

#### REPORT OF SELECT COMMITTEE.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council of the County of Oxford:

Gentlemen,—Your Committee appointed to consider the propriety of revising the County By-laws beg leave to report as follows:

Your Committee have considered the suggestions in the communication from the County Clerk in reference to the revision of

the County By-laws, and are of opinion that the suggestions made by him should be carried into effect.

Your Committee have examined the By-laws, and find them in a very unsatisfactory condition, some having expired through lapse of time, some repealed or amended, and others rendered inoperative by acts of Parliament.

Your Committee would therefore recommend that a Committee of three be appointed to meet at some time before the next regular session of the Council, and make a thorough revision of said By-laws, and submit a full report of their work at the January Session with a view to publication in pamphlet form of the By-laws of this County.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Extracts from the Proceedings of the County Council of Oxford at the January Session, 1879.

#### REPORT OF SELECT COMMITTEE.

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To the Warden and Members of the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford:

Gentlemen,—The Select Committee appointed by the Council in December, 1878, to revise the County By-laws respectfully, report as follows:

Your Committee have carefully examined all the By-laws of the Council, and after consideration have resolved to arrange them for the sake of convenience in reference, into the following classes. viz: In the first class are included all such as are temporary in their characters and have therefore expired; in the second class all such as have been repealed by other By-laws, cancelled, or superseded by acts of Parliament, or quashed by Court of Queen's Bench; and in the third class all that are in force at the present time. Your Committee recommend that the numbers and titles alone of the By-laws included in the first and second classes beprinted. Of those in the third class, that numbers 81, 108, 130, 136, 138, 158, 159, 172, 175, 176, 177, 183, 193, 195, 211, 214 and 224 be printed in full. In regard to the remaining 18 By-laws that are in force, it is the opinion of your Committee that they are not of sufficient public importance to require that more than the number and title of each should be printed. Your Committee would also recommend that By-laws numbers 3, 6 and 62 be consolidated and repealed by a new By-law.

Also that By-laws numbers 73, 92 and 171 be repealed by new By-laws.

Your Committee beg to submit herewith for your consideration draft copies for the purpose of consolidating and repealing the above named By-laws.

Your attention is also called to the fact that the third clause of By-law number 159 requires to be amended.

Your Committee recommend that any By-laws consolidating and repealing the By-laws named for that purpose by your Committee be printed with the other By-laws.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford to provide for carrying out the rules and regulations for the government of the Common Gaols of Canada, so far as applies to the County of Oxford.

WHEREAS it is incumbent on this Council under the statute, 22nd Vic., cap. 54, sec. 403, of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, to pass a By-law to enable them to carry out the Rules and Regulations of the Prison Inspector, as passed by Vic. 22 cap. 110, sec. 22, of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, (see Vic. 20, cap. 28, sec. 27.)

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford in Council Assembled—That from and after the passing of this By-law, all necessaries requisite for the maintenance of the Prisoners in the County Gaol in regard to Diet, Clothing, &c., be supplied to the Gaoler by parties tendering for the same, and to whom the contracts of such supplies have been given under the authority of said Council. The Governor of the Gaol shall make known daily to the contractors on application by the contractors what supplies are required.

And be it enacted that it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to draw up bonds to be executed by the contractors for the due fulfilment of their contract, with two sufficient sureties added vereto.

This By-law shall not take effect until the committee on County Buildings and Property shall have issued notices and entered into contracts with parties for providing the same according to instructions given to them by this Council at its last session.

And whereas Arthur Armstrong and five others have served similar notice on the head of this Council; and whereas the latter company has been formed for the same or similar purpose, and with the same object as the former, and believing that the formation of any company for the purposes of imposing tolls upon the travelling public from Sweaburg to Woodstock, along the said road, would be injurious to the interests of the township of West Oxford and the town of Woodstock. And whereas the statute labor (so tar as the County road proceeds) is sufficient to keep the same in repair, there being not more than one hundred rods to complete. And whereas it is necessary to pass a By-law by this municipality to prevent the said road from being controlled by any company.

Be it therefore enacted by the powers invested in this Council by the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, chap. 40. sec. 10, Vic. 22. And be it therefore enacted by authority of the same that this corporation does prohibit and prevent Arthur Armstrong, Thomas J. Clark or any other person forming a company under the title of the Woodstock and West Oxford Plank and Gravel Road Company, or any other title, from obtaining possession of that portion of gravel road leading from Woodstock to Sweaburg in West Oxford.

And this Council does prevent any company from imposing tolls upon said road or in any way controlling the same

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Co. of Oxford, to divert the County Line between the Township of Dereham in this County and the Township of Mildleton in the County of Norfolk.

WHEREAS upon a portion of the County Line between the Township of Dereham in this County, and the Township of Middleton in the County of Norfolk, it is impracticable to make a road.

And whereas the County Engineer W. G. Wonham, Esq., P. L. S., with instructions from this Council has examined said road and reported that it was impracticable to build a road on it from a point situated 20 chains east of the south-east angle of lot number nine, in the 12th concession of the Township of Dereham, to where the front of the fifth concession of Middleton would intersect said road allowance, in consequence of its being cut up by Nettle Creek, close to the banks of Otter Creek, and has recommended the deviation of such county line in lieu of that portion of impracticable part as follows:

Commencing where a post has been planted on the centre of the allowance for road between the counties of Oxford and Norfolk, which said post is sixty links westerly from where the westerly limit of lot number six, in the fifth concession of the Township of Middleton, if produced northerly, would intersect centre of said road allowance-North 30 degrees 30 minutes east, 4 chains 74 links; North 81 degrees east, 4 chains 9 links—thence south 78 degrees 40 minutes east, 9 chains 76 links to the centre of the allowance for road aforesaid, being a point where the easterly limit of lot number seven, in the 12th concession of Dereham, if produced southerly would intersect it-then north easterly following the centre of the streets known as John Pound street, Bloomer street and Oxford street, as delineated on a certain plan or the village of Tilsenburg, made by T. W. Dobbie, Esq., P. L. S., for Edwin D. Tilson, Esq., which plan is deposited in the Registry office of the County of Oxford, to the centre of the north end of the bridge, across Otter Creek, on the last mentioned street. Then north sixty-three degrees five minutes east, five chains fifty-eight links, then south seventy-eight degrees forty-five minutes east, sixteen chains twenty nine links-then north eighty-three degrees fifty-five minutes east, four chains thirty-five links-then south sixty-eight degrees thirtyfive minutes east, seventy chains thirty links, more or less to the allowance for road between the counties of Oxford and Norfolk.

The line above described to be the centre of a road sixty-six feet wide.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,

that the line of road heretofore particularly described, shall and the same is hereby established as a public highway for the free and common use of all Her Majesty's subjects, subject to all the laws, usages and regulations now in force or hereafter to be established in respect to other highways in this county.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford in Council assembled, that the sum of not less than twenty dollars, nor more than fifty dollars be paid out of the funds of the County of Oxford, as a reward to any person or persons who shall pursue or apprehend, or cause to be pursued and apprehended, any person or persons guilty of stealing any horse or mare within the said County of Oxford.

And be it further enacted that the Treasurer of the said County shall pay said reward on conviction of the thief or thieves, and on the order of the judge before whom such conviction is obtained.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and expedient to pass a By-law to appoint a County Treasurer and to define his duties not already defined by Statute.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, and it is hereby enacted and declared:

FIRST.—That Homer Pratt Brown, be and he is hereby appointed County Treasurer of the County of Oxford.

SECOND.—That the said Treasurer shall give good and sufficient security in himself, and at least two other good and sufficient sureties, to the Corporation, for the faithful performance of the duties connected with his office, in a sum not less than (\$20,000) twenty thousand dollars, the sufficiency of such security to be examined by a committee of this Council appointed for that purpose and on being duly approved by the Council, it shall be the duty of the Warden of this County to direct the County Solicitor to draw up Bends in proper form for that purpose, and to see that said Bonds are duly executed by the parties thereto.

The said Treasurer shall be paid as Salary—the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars per annum—and shall have no other claims against the Corporation for any fees, percentages, profits or emoluments, for any services rendered by him as such Treasurer; and all profits, percentages and emoluments to be received by him as such Treasurer—except such as by any laws regulating his duties, he is to receive to his own use and benefit—shall be placed by him to the credit of the County, in the account to be kept by him, and that he be paid his Salary quarterly, by an order to be given by the Warden, or other officer to be appointed for that purpose.

FOURTH.—The said Treasurer shall deposit to the redit of this County all smus of money from whatever source received by him, as such Treasurer, in the agency of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, at Woodstock, or any other Bank, as may hereafter be directed by Resolution or By-law of this Council; and all moneys

payable by this County for any purpose whatever, shall be paid by cheque, signed by the said Homer Pratt Brown, as Treasurer of the County of Oxford, and that no account or part of an account shall be so paid by the County Treasurer, unless the said account or part of an account shall be first audited or otherwise examined or authorized by the County Council or Quarter Sessions.

FIFTH.—That the said Bank account of the Treasurer of this-County shall be open at all times to the inspection of the County Auditors or any other person or persons duly authorized by the Council for that purpose.

Sixth.—The appointment hereby made, shall be and continue during pleasure—and in case the appointment be cancelled by the Council, the Treasurer shall receive a proportionate amount of such Salary up to the time of such removal, unless such removal shall be for any misconduct, which by law would forfeit his right to receive the balance of such salary.

SEVENTH.—That all By-laws or part of By-laws—all Resolutions—Reports or other acts of this Council inconsistent herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed, so far as the same affect this By-law.

SECOND .- In lieu of the repealed part of said By-law, that the said property surrendered by George Gordon, of the Township of West Zorra, and George Adam, of the Village of Embro, and now used and travelled as a public road, be, and is hereby from and after the passing of this By-law, made a County public highway, and may be known and described as follows, that is to say, commencing when a post has been planted in the centre of the fourth Concession of the Township of West Zorra, and twenty-four feet north from the south east angle of the west half of Lot number twelve on the said Concession, but now within the Corporation of the Village of Embro; thence westerly parallel with the southerly limit of the said west half of Lot number twelve to where a post has been planted at the eastern limit of the allowance for road between the third and fourth Concessions of the said Township of West Zorra; thence southerly along the westerly limits of Lots numbers twelve and eleven, to where a post has been planted twenty-two feet six inches south from the north-west angle of the said west half of Lot number eleven; thence easterly parallel with the northerly limit of the west half of said Lot number eleven, to where a post has been planted thirty-five feet west from the centre of the Concession, thence south-easterly to where a post has been planted twenty-two feet south from the north-east angle of

the east half of the said Lot, number eleven; thence northerly along the centre of the Concession to the place of beginning.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Statutes of the Province of Ontario, chap. 33, 35 Vic., entitled, "An Act to improve the Common and Grammar Schools of the Province of Ontario," power is given to the Council of each County to appoint Inspectors of Public Schools, to provide for the payment of such Inspectors' salaries, also to appoint a Board of Examiners for the examination and licensing of Common School Teachers:

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, and it is hereby enacted and declared:

FIRST.—That Wm. Carlyle, Esq., of the Town of Galt, in the County of Waterloo, Teacher, be, and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Public Schools for the County of Oxford.

Second.—That the sum of five dollars per school per annum, to be paid quarterly by the County Treasurer to the said Inspector of Public Schools, as remuneration for his services as such Inspector, and the further sum of two hundred dollars per annum as travelling expenses.

THIRD.—That the Rev. W. H. Landon, of Princeton, E. Stone Wiggins, Esq., of Ingersoll, J. S. Deacon, Esq., of the Township of North Oxford, and George Strauchon, Esq., of Woodstock, be and are hereby appointed a Board of Examiners for the examina-

tion and licensing of Teachers in Public Schools in the County of Oxford.

FOURTH.—That in the event of the Government failing to supplement the sum per school stated in the By-law as remuneration to the Inspector for his services, so as the same shall amount to ten dollars per school, any deficiency from said amount shall be paid by this Council.

## No. 172.

A By law to authorize the sale to the Town of Woodstock of the County Fair Ground.

WHEREAS the Corporation of the Town of Woodstock by By-law of the Council of the said Corporation, passed the tweifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy three, have determined to purchase from the said County the said lands here-inafter mentioned for the sum of two thousand dollars, and the Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford in pursuance of the powers contained in an Act of Parliament of Ontario, made in a session therof, held in the thirty-sixth year of the reign of the now Queen, intituled "An Act respecting the Fair Ground of the County of Oxford and the Public Square of the Town of Woodstock," have determined to sell the said lands to the said Corporation of the Town of Woodstock.

#### No. 175.

A By-law to aid and assist the Credit Valley Railway Company by giving Two Hundred Thousand Dollars to the Company by way of Bonus, and to issue Debentures therefor, and to authorize the levying of a special rate for the payment of the Debentures and Interest.

WHEREAS by the Act of the fourth session of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, passed in the thirty-fourth year of her Majesty's reign, incorporating the Credit Valley Railway Company. and the acts amending the same; it is provided that any portion of any Municipality or Municipalities, or County Municipality, which may be interested in securing the construction of the said Railway, or through any part of which, or near which, the Railway or Works of the said company shall pass or be situated, may aid and assist the said Company by loaning or guaranteeing, or giving money by way of bonus or other means to the Company, or issuing Municipal Bonds to or in aid of the Company, and otherwise in such manner and to such extent as such Municipalities, or any of them, shall think expedient; provided always that no such aid, loans, bonus or guarantee shall be given except after the passing of By-laws for the purpose, and the adoption of such By-laws by the rate-payers, as provided in the Municipal Act for the creation of debts.

And whereas twenty persons and upwards, duly qualified voters in each of the Municipalities of the Townships of Blenheim, Blandtord, East Zorra, East Oxford, North Oxford, West Oxford and Dereham, together with the towns of Woodsteck and Ingersoll.

forming a portion of the County Municipality of the County of Oxford have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts petitioned the Council of the said Municipality of the County of Oxford to pass a By-law granting a bonus for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the said The Credit Valley Railway, to the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, and it is expedient to grant the same.

And whereas for such purpose it is necessary for that portion of the said County of Oxford above mentioned, being all that portion of the County of Oxford comprised within the limits of the Town ships of Blenheim, Blandford, East Zorra, East Oxford, North Oxford, West Oxford and Dereham and the towns of Woodstock and Ingersoll, to raise the said amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, in the manner hereinafter mentioned.







FIRST—Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford that it shall and may be lawful for that portion of the said County of Oxford above described to aid and assist the Credit Valley Railway Company by giving thereto two hundred thousand dollars by way of bonus.

SECOND--That for the purpose aforesaid the Warden or other head of the said County of Oxford shall cause any number of Debentures of the said County of Oxford to be made for such sums of money as may be required for the said purpose, not less than twenty dollars each, and not exceeding in the whole the amount of Two Hundred Thousand dollars; which said Debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the said County of Oxford and signed by the Warden or other head of the Municipal Council of the said County, or by such person as may be authorized by By-law of the said Council to sign the same, and countersigned by the Treasurer, or by such other person or persons as the said Council may by By-law appoint, and shall define the portion of the said County of Oxford for and on account of which they are issued.

THIRD—That the said Debeatures shall be made payable in twenty years from the day hereinafter mentioned for this By-law to take effect at the Royal Canadian Bank in Toronto, and shall have attached to them Coupons for the payment of interest at the rate in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

FOURTH—That the said Debentures shall bear interest at and after the rate of six per cent. per annum from the date there

which interest shall be payable half-yearly on the first days of January and July in each year, at the Royal Canadian Bank in Toronto.

FIFTH—That for the purpose of forming a sinking fund for payment of said Debentures and the interest thereon, at the rate aforesaid, an equal annual special rate of two mills and sixty-eight hundredths of a mill in the dollar shall, in addition to all other rates, be assessed. raised, levied and collected in each year, upon all the rateable property within that part or section of the said County of Oxford hereinbefore mentioned and described during the said term of twenty years from the coming into effect of this By-law, unless such Debentures shall be sooner paid.

Sinth—That this By-law shall take effect on, from and after the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

SEVENTH—That the debentures to be signed and issued as afore-said shall be delivered by the Warden of the said County of Oxford to the Trustees appointed, (or to be appointed,) in accordance with the twenty-eighth section of the said Act incorporating the said Credit Valley Railway Company.

Eighth—And it is further enacted by the said Municipal Council of the County of Oxford that polls be held, and the votes of the clusters of that portion of the said County of Oxford hereinbefore mentioned, be taken on this By-law.

A By-law to fix the Salaries of the Gaol Officials.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient in conformity with the municipal Act, 26 Vic., chap. 48, section 358, to fix the Salaries of the several Gaol Officials by By-law:

Be it therefore enacted by the authority of the Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford:

FIRST -- That the salary of the Gaoler be and is hereby fixed at the yearly sum of eight hundred dollars.

SECOND—That the salary of the Matron of the Gaol be and ishereby fixed at the yearly sum of two hundred dollars.

THIRD—That the salary of the Turnkey of the Gaol be and is hereby fixed at the yearly sum of four hundred dollars.

Be it further enacted that this By-law shall take effect immediately on and after the passing thereof; and that the aforesaid salaries shall be paid, and the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay to each officer respectively his or her salary quarterly, namely, on the last day of the months of March, June, September and December in each and every year.

Be it further enacted that every By-law or By-laws, or parts of By-law or By-laws, inconsistent with the provisions of this By-law, be and the same is and are hereby repealed.

#### No. 177.

A By-law to aid and assist the Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway Company by giving the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars to the said Company by way of Bonus and to issue Debentures therefor, and to Authorize the levying of a Special Rate for the Payment of the said Debentures and Interest.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, passed in the thirty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled "An Act respecting Municipal Institutions in the Province of Ontario." It is enacted among other things as follows:

Any Municipality or any portion of any Municipality which may be interested in securing the construction of a Railway through any part of which, or near which the Railway or works of any Railway Company shall pass or be situated, may aid or assist such Company by loaning or guaranteeing or giving money by way of Bonus or other means to the Company, or issuing Municipal Bonds to or in aid of the Company and otherwise in such manner and to such extent as such Municipality shall think expedient; provided always that such aid, loan, bonus or guarantee shall be given under a By-law for the purpose to be passed in conformity with the provisions of section two hundred and thirty-one of the said Act.

And whereas the said Railway will pass through the Township of East Oxford and Town of Woodstock, which said Township of East Oxford and Town of Woodstock form a portion of the County Municipality of the County of Oxford.

And whereas fifty of the resident Freeholders who are duly qualified voters in the Municipalities of the Town of Woodstock and the Township of East Oxford, which said Township of East Oxford and Town of Woodstock form a portion of the County Municipality of the County of Oxford have, in accordance with the said Act, petitioned the Council of the said Municipality of the County of Oxford to pass a By-law granting a Bonus for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the said Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars. And it is expedient to grant the same, and whereas for such purpose it is necessary for that portion of the said County of

And whereas the whole rateable property in that portion of the said County of Oxford above described, irrespective of any future increase in the value of tolls, interest or dividends from the work, or from any stock, share or interest in the work upon which the money to be so received, or any part thereof, may be invested, and also irrespective of any increase to be derived from the temporary investment in the Sinking Fund hereinafter mentioned, or any part thereof, according to the last revised Assessment Roll of the said County is one million five hundred and seventy-four thousand four hundred and forty dollars; for the Town of Woodstock, the sum of five hundred and eighty thousand dollars; and for the Township of East Oxford, the sum of nine hundred and forty-four thousand four hundred and forty dollars.

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property for the

County of Oxford, irrespective of any future increase of the same and also irrespective of any increase in the nature of toll, interest or dividends from the work or from any stock, share or interest in the work upon which the money to be so received, or any part thereof, may be invested, and also irrespective of any increase to be derived from the temporary investment of the Sinking Fund hereinafter mentioned, or any part thereof, according to the latest revised assessment rolls of the said County is twelve millions five hundred and sixty-seven thousand eight hundred and eleven dollars.

And whereas the amount of the existing debt of the said County of Oxford is two hundred thousand dollars principal, but no interest is in arrear or due thereon.

And whereas the proportionate part of the said County of Oxford, payable or to be borne by the said described portion of the said County of Oxford is thirty-seven thousand and sixteen dollars and thirteen cents for principal, and no sum whatever being due for interest.

And whereas the amount of the existing debt of the said Town of Woodstock is sixty-eight thousand three hundred and ninety-one dollars for principal, and two thousand three hundred and eighty-four dollars interest, and one thousand dollars principal in arrears over and above the proportion of the said Town of Woodstock for the existing debt of the said County of Oxford amounting to fourteen thousand and eighty-three dollars and thirty-two cents.

And whereas the said Township of East Oxford is not indebted in any sum except for its proportion of the existing debt of the said County of Oxford amounting to the sum of twenty-two thousand nine hundred and thirty-three dollars.

And be it further enacted that for the purpose aforesaid the Warden or other head of the said County of Oxford shall cause any number of Debentures of the said County of Oxford to be made for such sums of money as may be required for the said purpose, not less than twenty dollars each and not exceeding the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars and payable in twenty annual sums, which said Debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the County of Oxford and signed by the Warden or other head of the Municipal Council of the said County, or by such person as may be authorized by By-law of the said Council to sign the same, and countersigned by the Treasurer or by such other person or persons as the said Council may by By-law appoint, and shall define the position of the said County of Oxford for and on account of which they are issued.

That the said Debentures shall be made payable in twenty annual instalments or portions from the day hereinafter mentioned for this By-law to take effect at the Royal Canadian Bank in the Town of Woodstock and shall have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest at the rate of six per centum per annum and in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

That the said Debentures shall bear interest at and after the rate of six per cent. per annum from the date thereof, which interest shall be payable half yearly from the day of the date thereof.

That this By-law shall take effect on, from and after the twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

## No. 183.

A By-law to aid and assist the Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway Company by giving the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars to the said Company by way of Bonus, and to issue Debentures therefor, and to authorize the Levying of a Special Rate for the payment of the said Debentures and Interest.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, passed in the thirty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty

Queen Victoria, and entituled "An Act respecting Municipal Institutions in the Province of Ontario," and chaptered 48. It is enacted among other things as follows:

Any Municipality or any portion of any Municipality which may be interested in securing the construction of a Railway or through any part of which or near which the Railway or works of any Railway Company shall pass or be situated, may aid or assist such Company by loaning or guaranteeing or giving money by way of Bonus or other means to the Company, or issuing Municipal Bonds to or in aid of the Company and otherwise in such manner and to such extent as such Municipality shall think expedient; provided always that such aid, loan, bonus or guarantee shall be given under a By-law for the purpose to be passed in conformity with the provisions of section two hundred and thirty-one of the said Act.

And whereas the said Railway will pass through the Township of North Norwieh and the town of Woodstoek, which said Township of North Norwieh and Town of Woodstoek form a portion of the County Municipality of the County of Oxford.

And whereas fifty of the resident Freeholders who are duly qualified voters in the Municipalities of the Town of Woodstock and the Township of North Norwieh which said Township of North Norwich and Town of Woodstock form a portion of the County Municipality of the County of Oxford have in accordance with the said Act petitioned the Council of the said Municipality of the County of Oxford to pass a By-law granting a Bonus for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the said Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway to the amount of fifty thousand dollars. And it is expedient to grant the same, and whereas for such purpose it is necessary for that portion of the said County of Oxford above mentioned being all that portion of the County of Oxford comprised within the limits of the Town of Woodstock and the Township of North Norwich to raise the said amount of fifty thousand dollars in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and whereas it is expedient to pay the amount of the bonus of fifty thousand dollars and interest thereon in twenty equal annual installments of five thousand five hundred dollars.

And whereas it will be necessary to provide for the payment of

the said Municipal bonds or debentures by raising by a special rate the sum of five thousand five hundred dollars for each of the years one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, one thousand eight hundred and eightythree, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, one crossand eight hundred and eighty-six, one thousand eight handred and eighty-seven, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, one thousand eight hundred and muety-two, and one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

And whereas the whole rateable property in that portion of the said County of Oxford above described, irrespective of any future increase of the same, and of any income in the nature of tolls, interest or dividends from the work or from any stock, share or interest in the work upon which the money to be so raised, or any part thereof may be invested, and also irrespective of any increase to be derived from the temporary investment of the sinking fund hereinafter mentioned, or any part thereof, according to the last revised assessment rolls of the said County is one million four hundred and eighty-nine thousand six hundred and forty dollars, tor the Town of Woodstock the sum of six hundred and five thousand nine hundred and ninety-eight dollars, and for the Township of North Norwich the sum of eight hundred and eighty-three thousand six hundred and forty-two dollars.

And whereas the amount of the whole rateable property for the County of Oxford irrespective of any future increase of the same, and also irrespective of any increase in the nature of toils, interest or dividends from the work, or from any stock, share or interest in the work upon which the money to be so raised, or any part thereof may be invested, and also irrespective of any increase to be derived from the temporary investment of the sinking fund hereinafter mentioned, or any part thereof according to the last revised

assessment rolls of the said County is twelve millions four hundred and thirty-two thousand and eighty-seven dollars.

And whereas the amount of the existing debt of the said County of Oxford is two hundred thousand dollars principal but no interest is in arrear or due thereon.

And whereas the proportionate part of the existing debt of the said County of Oxford payable, or to be born by the said Town of Woodstock is fourteen thousand and eighty-four dollars for principal, no sum whatever being due for interest.

And whereas the amount of the existing debt of the said Town of Woodstock over and above its share of the said County debt is seventy-seven thousand nine hundred and sixty-one dollars for principal, and two thousand three hundred and eighty-four dollars interest and one thousand dollars principal in arrears.

As d whereas the amount of the existing debt of the said Township of North Norwich is thirty-eight thousand dollars for principal, and no portion of the said principal debt is in arrears and no sum whatever is due for interest.

And whereas it will require a special rate of three mills and seven tenths of a mill in the dollar in addition to all other rates to be levied in the said Township of North Norwich and the Town of Woodstock, being that portion of the said County of Oxford above mentioned and described for each of the years one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, one thousand eight hundred and seventyfive, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, or a thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfive, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, one thousand eight hundred and niney-three.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford that it shall and may be lawful for that portion of the said County of Oxford above described to aid and assist the Port Dover and Lake Huron Railway Company by giving thereto fifty thousand dollars by way of Bonus.

Be it therefore further enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the County of Oxford that there be levied and raised on the Township of North Norwich and the Town of Woodstock, being that portion of the said County of Oxford above mentioned and described a special rate of three mills and seven tenths of a mill in the dollar in each and every of the years one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, one thousand eight hundred and seventyfive, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfive, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

The said special rate in each and every of the said years to be raised on the whole rateable property of the said portions of the said County of Oxford above mentioned and described to be in addition to all other rates to be levied in each and every of the said years last above mentioned.

And be it further enacted that for the purpose aforesaid the Warden or other head of the said County of Oxford shall cause any number of debentures of the said County of Oxford to be made for such sums of money as may be required for the said

purpose, not less than twenty dollars each, and not exceeding the sum of fifty thousand dollars, and payable in twenty annual sums, which said debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the County of Oxford, and signed by the Warden or other head of the Municipal Council of the said County, or by such person as may be authorized by By-law of the said Council to sign the same and countersigned by the Treasurer or by such other person or persons as the said Council may by By-law appoint and shali define the portion of the said County of Oxford for and on account of which they are issued.

That the debentures shall be made payable in twenty annual instalments or portions from the day hereinafter mentioned for this By-law to take effect at the Royal Canadian Bank in the Town of Woodstock, and shall have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest at and after the rate of six per cent per annum from the date thereof, and in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

That the said debentures shall bear interest at and after the rate of six per cent per annum from the date thereof, which interest shall be payable half yearly from the day of the date thereof.

That this By-law shall take effect on from and after the second day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

That the debentures to be signed and issued as aforesaid, shall be delivered by the Warden to the said County of Oxford to the Trustees appointed or to be appointed in accordance with the Statutes in that behalf.

And it is further enacted by the said Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, that polls be held and the votes of the electors of that portion of the said County of Oxford hereinbefore mentioned to be taken on this By-law on the 30th day of December, A. D., 1873.

## No. 193.

A Bz-law to prevent Immoderate Riding or Driving of Hoses, &c., on the Highways of the County of Oxford, and to regulate the Travelling Thereon.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to restrain and prevent the practice of immoderate riding and driving of horses or other animals upon the highways of this County, and to regulate travelling hereon, therefore the Corporation of the County of Oxford, by the Council thereof, enacts as follows:

FIRST-Trat from and after the passage of this By-law it shall

not be lawful for any person to engage in or pursue the practice of racing, with horses or other animals, either by riding or driving in running or trotting races on any of the highways in the County of Oxford; and any person guilty of riding or driving any horse or horses, or other animals, in a race, whether the same be by running or trotting, upon any of the highways in the County of Oxford, shall, upon conviction thereof, incur the penalties imposed by this By-law.

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SECOND—That no person shall drive furiously any horse or other animal, or shout, or use any blasphemous or indecent language upon any highway; and in case any person so drives, or shouts, or uses blasphemous or indecent language, he shall incur the penalties imposed by this By-law.

Third—That every person travelling upon any highway in the said County of Oxford with a sleigh or sled, drawn by horse or mule, shall have at least two bells attached to the harness.

FOURTH—That in case any person travelling or being upon any highway in the said County of Oxford, in charge of a vehicle drawn by one or more horses or other animals, meet another vehicle drawn as aforesaid, he shall turn out to the right from the centre of the road, allowing the vehicle so met one-half the road.

FIFTH—That in case any person travelling or being on any lighway in the said County of Oxford, in charge of a vehicle as aforesaid, or on horseback, be overtaken by any vehicle or horseman travelling at a greater speed, the person so overtaken shall suickly turn out to the right and allow the said vehicle or horsemanto pass.

Sixth—That in case of one vehicle being met or overaken by another upon any of the highways in the said County of Oxford, if by reason of the extreme weight of the load on either of the vehicles so meeting, or on the vehicle so overtaken, the driver finds it impracticable to turn out as aforesaid, he shall immediately stop, and if necessary for the safety of the other vehicle, and if required so to do, he shall assist the person in charge thereof to sass without damage.

SEVENTH—That in case any person in charge of a vehicle or of a horse or other animal used as the means of conveyance or travelling,

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or being on any highway as aforesaid, be through drunkenness unable to ride or drive the same with safety to other persons travelling on or being on the highway, he shall incur the penalties imposed by this By-law.

EIGHTH—That it shall not be lawful for any person to ride or drive any horse or horses or other animal through any body of men assembled on the highways of the said County of Oxford at a faster rate than a walk, under the penalty imposed by this By-law.

NINTH—That if any person contravenes this By-law, or any part thereof, and such contravention be duly proved by the oath of one creditable witness before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction within the locality where the offence has been committed, the offender shall incur a penalty of not less than one dollar, nor more than twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Justice, with costs.

TENTH—That if not paid forthwith, the penalty and costs shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender, under a warrant signed and sealed by the convicting Justice; and the overplus, if any, after deducting the penalty and costs and charges of sale, shall be returned on demand to the owner of such goods and chattels.

ELEVENTH—That in default of payment or distress, the offender shall, by warrant signed and sealed as aforesaid, be imprisoned in the Common Gaol of the County of Oxford for a period of not less than one day, and not more than twenty days, at the discretion of the Justice, unless such fine, costs and charges be sooner paid.

TWELFTH—That every fine collected under this By-law shall be paid to the Treasurer of the local municipality or place in which the offence was committed, and shall be applied to the general purposes thereof.

## No. 195.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford to Incorporate the Village of Norwich. WHEREAS certain inhabitants of the tract of land hereinafter formed into the Village of Norwich, being not less than one hundred resident freeholders and householders thereof, and of whom one half and over are freeholders, by petition have prayed the said Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford to erect the said lands into an incorporated village, by the name and with the boundaries hereinafter described. And whereas, by a census taken under the direction of the said Council, it appears that the said parcel of land contains over seven hundred and fifty inhabitants, and that their residences are sufficiently near to form an incorporated village, therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford enacts as follows:

FIRST—The land hereinafter mentioned, and the inhabitants of the same, shall be, and are hereby constituted and erected into an incorporated village; apart from the Township of North Norwich, by the name of the Village of Norwich, and with the boundaries hereinafter declared.

SECOND-The said village shall comprise and consist of the following lots, viz:—Commencing at the north-east angle of Not No. 7, in the 5th Concession of the Township of North Norwich, in the County of Oxford; thence south eleven degrees and thirty minutes east along the easterly side line of said Lot No. 7 twenty-eight chains; thence south seventy-eight degrees and thirty minutes west seventy-six chains and fifty links westerly from the division line between Lots 9 and 10 in the said 5th Concession; thence north eleven degrees and thirty minutes west twenty-eight chains to the front of the 5th Concession; thence north seventy-eight degrees and thirty minutes east one chain and fifty links to the north-west angle of the said Lot No. 9, in the 5th Concession; thence north eleven degrees and thirty minutes west across the allowance for road between the fourth and fifth Concessions, and along the western boundary of Lot No. 9, in the fourth Concession forty chains, more or less, to the centre of the 4th Concession of North Norwich; thence north seventy-eight degrees and thirty mirutes east, following the centre of the 4th Concession aforesaid, seventy-five chains, more or less, to the limits between Lots No. 6 and 7, in the said 4th Concession; thence south eleven degrees and thirty minutes east along the said limit, and across the allowance for road between the 4th and 5th Concessions aforesaid forty chains, more or less, to the place of beginning.

THIRD—The place for holding the first election of the said incorporated village shall be at J. A. Tidey's store-house, west side of Vicar street, in the said village, and the Returning Officer who is to hold the same shall be James Haken.

#### No. 211.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, to License, Regulate, and Govern Auctioneers, Hawkers, and Petty Chapmen within the County of Oxford.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient, in accordance with the Statutes passed by the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, in the thirty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, chaptered forty-eight, to pass a By-law licensing, regulating, and governing auctioneers and other persons selling or putting up for sale goods, wares, merchandise, or effects by public auction, and hawkers or petty chapmen and other persons carrying on petty trades who have not become permanent residents in this County, or who go from place to place or to other men's houses on foot, or with any animal bearing or drawing any goods, wares, or merchandise for sale, not being the growth, produce or manufacture of this Province, not being liquors within the meaning of the law regulating to taverns or tavern licenses.

Section I.—Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford in Council assembled, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this By-law it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to act as an auctioneer or sell or put up for sale any goods, wares or effects by public auction within the jurisdiction of

this Council, nor carry on the business of hawkers or petty chapmen, or to carry on any petty trade (not having become a permanent resident in this County) nor to go from place to place or to other men's houses on foot or with any animal bearing or drawing any goods, wares, or merchandise, not being the growth produce or manufacture of this Province, and not being liquors within the meaning of the law relating to taverns, or tavern licenses, without first purchasing and obtaining a license to exercise his calling as hereinafter provided, under a penalty of not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars, exclusive of costs, for each offence, such penalty and costs to be recovered before any or more of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the County of Oxford, and in default of payment the same to be levied by distress and sale of offender's goods and chattels, and in Cefault of distress found, out of which such penalty can be levied, such offender to be confined in the County Gaol at Woodstock, with or without hard labor, for any term not exceeding twenty-one days.

Section II.—There shall be issued by this Council licenses for each of the callings set forth in the preamble of this By-law, signed by the Warden, attested by the Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the Corporation in each year in the form of the schedule attached to this By-law marked A, such licenses to be in force for periods of one year, nine, six or three months as mentioned therein from the date thereof and to be dated either on the first cays of January, April, July, or October, and shall be issued and sold by the County Clerk only.

Section III.—That every license to practise the calling of auctioneer, or to sell, or to offer for sale goods, wares, merchandise, or effects at public auction, the sum of \$12.00 for twelve months, from the first day of January; \$10.00 for nine months, from the first day of April; \$8.00 for six months from the first day of July, and \$6.00 for three months from the first day of October.

Section IV.—That every license to practise the calling of a hawker or petty chapman or to carry on any petty trade (not being at the time a permanent resident of this County) or to go from place to place or to other men's houses on foot with goods, wares or merchandise for sale, not being the growth, produce or manufacture

of this Province, and not being liquors within the meaning of the law relating to taverns and tavern licenses, the sum of \$5.00 for twelve months from first January, \$4.00 for nine months from first April, \$3.00 for six months from first July, and \$2.00 for three months from first October, and for every animal bearing or drawing such goods, wares or merchandise, the further sum of \$8.00 for twelve months and a proportionate sum for nine, six or three months.

Section V.—Any person when exercising any of the above callings within this Corporation shall have with him his license, and shall upon demand being made by any Inspector of Licenses, Municipal Councillor, or by the Clerk of any Municipality, or by any Justice of the Peace for this County, or by any one of the ratepayers of the Municipality in which the demand is made, produce the same; and if he neglects or refuses to do so, he shall be held to be acting without a license, and shall be liable to the same penalties as if he were exercising his calling without license.

Section VI.—All Reeves, Deputy-Reeves, and Clerks are hereby required to see that all persons found acting in contravention of any of the provisions of this By-law are prosecuted.

Section VII.—All licenses issued under this By-law shall expire in the year in which they are issued.

Section VIII.—All fines and penalties imposed by this By-law shall be paid one moiety to the party complaining, and the other moiety thereof to the Treasurer of the County, and shall form part of the funds of the County.

Section IX.—All other By-laws or parts of By-laws of this Corporation in any wise contrary to the provisions of this By-law are hereby repealed.

## No. 214.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford to provide for the remuneration to be pad to the members of the Council and the several County Officers of the County for their services as such officers, and for the purpose of repealing Bylaw No. 153.

WHEREAS, it is expedient to provide by By-law for the remuneration for their services of the several County Officers of this County.

The Municipal Conneil of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, therefore enacts as follows:

FIRST.—Each member of the Council shall be entitled to, and receive the sum of \$2 for each days attendance at any special meeting thereof, and also the additional sum of ten cents per mile for each mile necessarily travelled thereunto.

SECOND.—The Messenger of this Council shall receive the sum of \$1.50 for each day's attendance upon the Council.

THEO.—The Clerk of this Council shall receive the sum of \$400 by the year for his services as such Clerk.

FOURTH.—The Treasurer of this County shall receive the sum of \$800 per year for his services as such Treasurer.

FIFTH.—The Surgeon of the County Gaol shall be entitled to, and receive the sum of \$350 per annum for his services as such surgeon, and for the supply of all medicines that shall be required for the immates of said gaol.

SINTH.—The County Auditors shall each receive the sum of \$40 per annum for his services as such Auditor, and ten cents per mile necessarily travelled.

SEVENTH.—That each Member of the Board of Examiners of the Public School Teachers shall receive the sum of \$3 for each days attendance, as members of such Board, and also the additional sum of ten cents per mile for each mile necessarily travelled thereunto.

EIGHTH.—The Keeper of the Court House and Offices shall receive the sum of \$150 per annum, as such Keeper of the Court Room and Offices.

NINTH.—It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to pay the sums aforesaid, out of any monies in his hands, not otherwise appropriated upon the application of the parties to whom the same are payable, that is to say, to the Members of the Council and to the Members of the Board of Examiners of Public School Teachers, on the last day of each session of the said bodies respectively, and to all other parties hereinbefore mentioned, quarterly, and this By-law shall be the Treasurer's sufficient warrant for such payments.

TENTH.—And be it further enacted, that By-law No. 153 be, and is hereby repealed.

ELEVENTH.—And be it further exacted, that all or any clause or clauses of any By-law or By-laws inconsistent with the provisions of this By-law be, and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford to appoint Commissioners to superintend the repairs and building of bridges across rivers forming Township Boundary Lines, and across rivers forming or crossing Boundary Lines between Counties, and for defining their duties; also for the purpose of providing the salaries of each Commissioner.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and expedient to appoint Commissioners to superintend the repairs and building of Bridges across the rivers forming Township Boundary Lines and rivers forming or crossing Boundary Lines between Counties, and for defining their duties; also to provide for the payment of the salary of such Commissioners.

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Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of Oxford, and it is hereby enacted and declared:

FIRST.—It shall be the duty of either of said Commissioners forthwith, upon receipt of a written or verbal notice from a Reeve of either adjacent Municipality, that a bridge is required to be erected or repaired, crossing such rivers, to examine the same with as little delay as possible, and shall, if he deems necessary, notify the other Commissioner to meet him where such bridge is required to be built or repaired.

If, after such examination, a majority of said Commissioners consider it necessary that a bridge should be built or repaired, required they shall proceed forthwith in building or repairing such bridge; and they are hereby empowered and authorized to expend such sum or sums of money as may be granted from time to time by this Council by By-law or otherwise, for the above named purpose,

Second.—And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that each Commissioner shall be entitled to receive the sum of two dollars per diem for each day's service in performing the duties of their office, and also an additional sum of ten cents per mile necessarily travelled thereto.

THIRD.—And be it further enacted that said Commissioners shall give in a report of their proceedings to this Council at the first meeting of the same next ensuing after such examination or expenditure has been made.

FOURTH.—That the tollowing gentlemen, viz: Thomas Abraham, Stephen Hall, and William Peers, be and are hereby appointed to act as said Commissioners for the current year.

FIFTH.—And be it further enacted that the County Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay out of the appropriations such sum or sums of money from time to time as may be required on the joint order of said Commissioners or their Chairman.

Sixth.--And be it further enacted, that all By-laws or part of By-laws contrary to this By-law are hereby repealed.

## No. 229.

A By-law of the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of Oxford, to consolidate and repeal By-laws Nos. 3, 6, and 62; providing for the protection of materials growing or lying on County Roads; for improving and keeping in repair County Roads, and for providing and regulating Statute Labor thereon.

Be it therefore enacted that all timber, stone, gravel, or other materials growing or lying on County roads in this County shall be under the care and protection of the Reeves of the Municipalities between which such roads lie.

And be it further enacted that if any person or persons shall wilfully or maliciously commit any damage or injury to or upon any of this timber, stones, or other materials, growing, lying, or

being upon any of the Courty roads in this County, shall be prosecuted, and upon conviction before any Justice or Justices of the Peace, acting within this County, shall forfeit or pay such sum or sums of money not exceeding fifty dollars as shall appear to such justice or justices to be a reasonable compensation for the damage committed, and in default of payment to be levied by distress-warrant under the hand and seal of the said justice or justices upon the goods and chattels of the offender, and in default of sufficient goods and chattels said offender shall be confined in the common gaol with or without hard labor for any time not exceeding twenty-one days.

Be it further enacted that if any two or more adjoining Municipalities deem it expedient for the better maintenance of the roads and bridges may direct the application of statute labor thereon as well as such other monies as they may from time to time have at their disposal.

Be it further enacted that the Reeves of said adjoining Municipalities be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell any timber, stones, gravel, or other materials growing, lying, or being on any allowance for road between said Municipalities, to expend the proceeds thereof in the improvement of said roads.

And be it further enacted that all persons rated on the Assessment Rolls or otherwise liable to perform statute labor residing on lots adjoining any County roads dividing any two Municipalities within the County, or on County lines adjoining other Counties, although such roads may deviate so as in some places to be wholly or in part within one Municipality, shall perform their statute labor on such County roads or pay a commutation of money in lieu thereof; provided however that such persons residing on corner lots adjoining side lines may under direction of the Reeves perform statute labor on said side lines or pay a commutation of money therefor. And that such statute labor or commutation money shall be performed or expended on said County roads and bridges whenever and in whatever manner the Councils of such Municipalities shall through their proper officers direct.

Be it therefore enacted that By-laws Nos. 3, 6, and 62 be and they are hereby repealed.

Be it further enacted that it shall be the duty of said architect to see that all resolutions of the Council and clauses in Reports of the Committees on County Buildings and Property, and other Committees regarding changes or repairs on County Buildings, be properly carried out; and should any changes or repairs become necessary and require to be made during the period intervening from the previous to the next session of the Council, the said architect being informed thereof shall notify the Chairman of the Committee on County Buildings and Property, who shall either give his order for said repairs to be done, or should he deem it necessary that the Committee should meet to consider the same he shall give his order accordingly.

Be it enacted that By-law No. 171 be and the same is hereby repealed.

Be it therefore enacted that at the first session of the Council in each year an Inspector of Auctioneers', Hawkers', and Pedlars' Licenses shall be appointed in each Municipality within the County, whose duty it shall be to see that the provisions of the By-laws to license, regulate, and govern Auctioneers, Hawkers,

and Pedlars in this County are properly carried out, and to prose cute any infraction of the same, as provided for in the said Bylaw; one moiety of all fines and penalties inflicted under the said By-law shall be paid said Inspector upon conviction of the offender.

Be it further enacted that By-law No. 92 be and the same is hereby repealed.


