GREATER TORONTO AND ITS FINANCES

Objections have been taken to the proposed enlargement of the area of the city on the score that the municipal debt is already disproportionately large, and that further annexations would increase the liabilities beyond the margin of safety.

The facts are not in accordance with this view, and when it is remembered that a tendency to financial rashness has distinguished at times some of the municipalities that sooner or later are annexed to Toronto, thus unduly increasing the prospective liabilities of the city, it will be seen that the sooner they are brought into bounds the better.

According to the latest city hall returns, the net debt of Toronto is \$18,238,538.60. Of this amount \$1,733,837.17 is local improvement debt, leaving a net balance against the city of \$16,504,701.43.

But in all fairness if this amount is reckoned as a liability there must be placed on the other side of the account the assets which the city holds thru that expenditure—assets which are of a revenue-producing character.

unable to arrive at a satisfactory solution.

But setting this problem aside for the present it should be evident that Toronto is in first-rate shape to undertake any expenditure which can be shown to be absolutely necessary. The debt of the city is light, and in this respect Toronto is considered to be on "easy-street."

There is nothing in the financial condition of the city to deter those outside, or those within, the city boundaries facing at once and prudently and with foresight upon them in the course of a very few years. That problem is the creation of a Greater Toronto, to include all the area between the Humber and the Scarborough Township line, and north to St. Clair-avenue, except where the municipalities to the north take a still more northerly range.

A SUPERVISING PRINCIPAL. The World, in opposing the appointment of a supervising principal for the collegiate institutes of the city, has no other object than to promote the efficiency and well-being of the schools and the saving of the people's money.

There is nothing that can be done by a supervising principal that is not at present done far more efficiently by each principal in his own school. Either Dr. Embree is going to usurp the functions of the de facto principals or he is to accept public ownership and operation of its services, and let the province government entirely sympathize. In days to come the early builders of the city will be abundantly evident.

YANCOUVER, June 19.—(Special.)—Dr. Sproule, grand master of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America, which in session here, presented his report this afternoon.

He expressed his personal gratitude for the prompt, generous and intelligent support the brethren of British Columbia gave during the important fight conducted in parliament against the obnoxious educational clauses of the autonomy bill.

United Kingdom Restless. "Coming clear home," said Dr. Sproule, "we find the United Kingdom of Great Britain in the state of unrest, constant agitation that is maintained by Roman emissaries to secure home rule for Ireland."

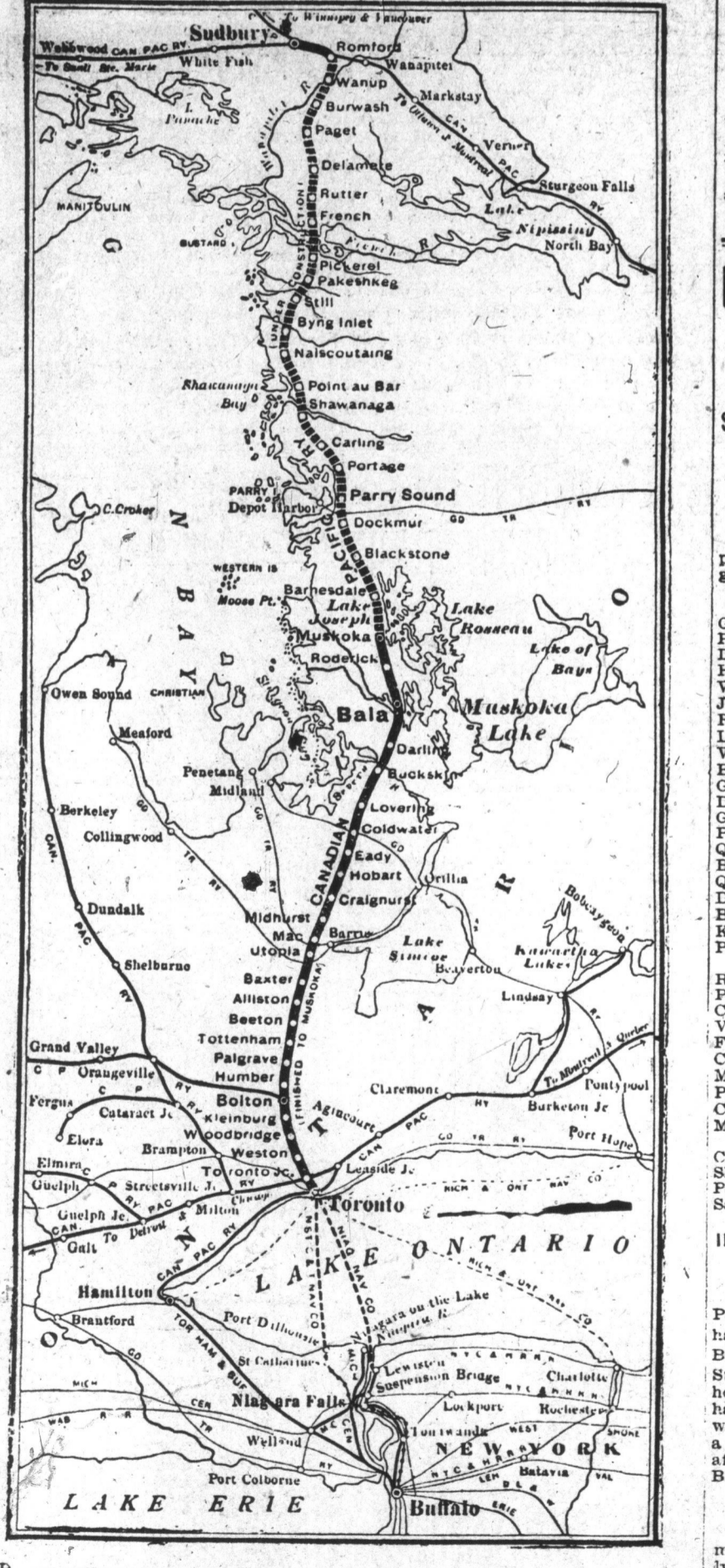
