ECLIPSES of the GREAT LUMINARIES in the YEAR 1820.

There will be Four ECLIPSES this Year ; two of the SUN and two of the MOON, alternately as follows, viz :—

March 14th—The SUN will be eclipsed in Longitude 11 Signs, 23° 55' 6 at 8h 57m.—Moon's latt. 43' 54" S. This Eclipse, though invisible to us, will be central on the Meridian, at 8h. 23m. morning, in latt 56° 33' South, long. 11° 43' West, that is, a little to the Eastward of Candlemas-Islands, in the South Seas.

— 20th—The Moon will be partially but invisibly Eclipsed ♀ at 2h. 22m. afternoon.

September 7th—There will be a very small Eclipse of the SUN, the time of Greatest Obscuration will be at 7h: 49m. morning, two-thirds of a digit only observed on the upper or northern limb.

September 22d—The MOON will be partially and visibly Eclipsed—

- A blue pendant, for a Merchant ship,
- A red pendant, for a Merchant brig,
- A white pendant, for a topsail schooner or sloop,
- A blue and white snake pendant, for an American vessel,

When a Vessel requires a Pilot, her descriptive Pendant will be shewn at a yard arm, instead of the ball.

After a Vessel has been described, and passes the Harbour, her descriptive Pendant will be lowered, half staff, for an hour, and the ball taken down.

A ball at the mast head—vessel is on shore or in distress.—
 Should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.



Such Merchants as will supply their Private Colours to the Signal Post, at Fort Howe, may have them hoisted (instead of the usual distinguishing Pendant) when the Vessels appear in the Offing.
