## ECLIPSES of the GREAT LUMINARIES in the YEAR 1820.

There will be Four ECLIPSES this Year; two of the SUN and two of the MOON, alternately as follows, viz:—

**March 14th**—The SUN will be eclipsed in Longitude 11 Signs,  $23^{\circ} 55' 6''$  at 8h. 57m.—Moon's latt.  $43^{\circ} 54' 8''$ . This Eclipse, though invisible to us, will be central on the Meridian, at 8h. 23m. morning, in latt.  $56^{\circ} 33' 9''$  South, long.  $11^{\circ} 43'$  West, that is, a little to the Eastward of Candlemas Islands, in the South Seas.

— **29th**—The Moon will be partially but invisibly Eclipsed ♀ at 2h. 22m. afternoon.

**September 7th**—There will be a very small Eclipse of the SUN, the time of Greatest Obscuration will be at 7h. 49m. morning, two-thirds of a digit only observed on the upper or northern limb.

**September 22d**—The Moon will be partially and visibly Eclipsed—

A ball at the mast head—vessel is on shore or in distress.—  
Should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.
