A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR.

To the Members and Adherents of St. James Square Church :

In this my first annual message to you, as minister of St. James Square Church, I desire to express my appreciation of the hearty welcome you have extended to Mrs. Gandier and myself. The old century ended for us with the sadness of farewells, and the severance of ties that had become strong and sacred ; but through the warmth of your reception, the readiness of your co-operation and your hopefulness of spirit, you have cheered our hearts and made the new century to open for us with an outlook bright and promising.

It is not wise for a minister to expect too much from his people, or for the people to expect too much from their minister ; but when both stand together in mutual confidence and love, expecting great things from God and undertaking great things for God, the blessing is sure to come.

I count it an honor to succeed the grand and noble men—the thoughtful and learned ministers of Christ—who have filled the pastorate of this congregation. Their work abides, and will give tone and strength to all that is done here for many years to come. My one regret is that death and change of residence have removed from us so many who were trained under their ministry.

We are fast becoming a down town congregation, situated in the centre of a district where boarding-houses will soon be more numerous than homes. Hence, while the number of families in our congregation is not likely to increase very largely, the district in which our church is placed is becoming more populous than ever ; and we must seek to adapt our

work to the new conditions, and make our church a centre of interest, a spiritual force, a source of moral elevation to those among whom we are placed. We who have our family home and our church home—whose place and interest in this particular household of faith is of long standing and hallowed by many tender associations, should count ourselves the servants, for Jesus' sake, of that floating multitude who, away from the homes of their youth, in the great city for a longer or shorter period, are without home and without church connection. There is here a large field and a difficult field, but one in which we as a congregation are bidden "go work" by the Master, who has "chosen us and placed us that we should go and bring forth fruit."

Through the earnest advocacy and worthy example of your former pastor, the Rev. Louis H. Jordan, B.D., you were led to aim at \$25,000 for the Century Fund. That amount has all been subscribed save a few hundred dollars, which I trust will be promised before this appears in print.

The congregation has done well. This is a fitting thank-offering for the mercies of the past—a worthy memorial by which to signalize the opening of the New Century. But this was never intended to, and will not interfere with our regular support of the great missionary work with which God has honored our Church at home and abroad. No Church ever had a more magnificent or promising Home work than that given to our Presbyterian Church in Canada; and no church of its size and in a new country ever had a larger share in the evangelizing of the heathen world.

The Century Fund is intended to help us do better for the aggressive work of the Church in the future. With our debt removed, as it will be when Century Fund subscriptions are all paid, we will be free to give to missions as never before. The old system of gathering money for missions by collectors calling monthly is not now satisfactory. A new system will soon be proposed, which will emphasize the purely voluntary character of our giving; and with this change

THE ANNUAL MEETING.

Toronto, Wednesday, January 23rd, 1901.

The forty-seventh Annual Meeting of the Congregation was held this evening in the lecture room. After the meeting had been opened with devotional exercises the Rev. Alfred Gandier, B.D., was elected Chairman of the meeting, and Mr. R. A. Grant was elected Secretary.

Moved by Mr. John Paton, and seconded by Mr. Jos. Henderson, that the minutes of the last annual meeting, having been printed in the annual report of the congregation, be taken as read. Carried.

Moved by Mr. W. E. Long, seconded by Mr. W. D. McIntosh, that the minutes of the special meetings of the congregation during the past year be also taken as read. Carried.

Mr. Robt. Carrie presented the report of the Board of Managers and Treasurer's statement, and moved their adoption. The motion was seconded by Mr. A. A. Allan, and was carried.

Moved by Mr. Jos. Henderson, and seconded by Mr. R. C. Steele, that the thanks of the congregation be given to the Board of Managers, and especially to the Chairman and Treasurer for their faithful and valuable services during the year. Carried.

Ballots were then distributed for the election of Managers the Chairman appointing Mr. Wallace Anderson, Mr. J. Y. Reid, Mr. John Turnbull and Mr. A. D. Gordon to act as scrutineers.

A letter was read from Mr. T. O. Anderson asking that his name be withdrawn from the ballot.

Moved by Mr. W. D. McIntosh, seconded by Mr. Thos Woodbridge, that Messrs. W. M. Douglas and W. A. Cameron be auditors for the ensuing year. Carried.

Moved by Mr. W. P. Rodger, seconded by Mr. A. Nairn, that the Rev. Alfred Gandier, B.D., the Clerk of Session, the Treasurer and Secretary of the Board of Managers be a committee for publishing the annual reports of the congregation. Carried.

Mr. Henderson moved to amend certain sections of the Constitution of the congregation regarding the election of the Board of Managers as more fully set forth in the notice of such motion read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths. The motion was seconded by Mr. R. C. Steele. After some discussion, the mover and seconder asked that the motion be allowed to stand until the next annual meeting.

The scrutineers now reported the election as Managers of Messrs. Carrie, Woods, Gray, Allan, Woodbridge, Darling and Bruce.

The report of the Session, presented by Mr. Long, referred appropriately to the resignation of the Rev. L. H. Jordan, B.D., as minister of St. James Square, and to the induction of the Rev. Alfred Gandier, B.D., as his successor. Owing largely to the vacancy there had not been the usual number of additions to the membership. An addition to the number of elders is urgently needed, and will probably be asked for at an early date. During the year a number had been removed by death, especial mention being made of Mrs. John Watson and Mr. Wm. Macdonald, Q.C.

The report of the Sunday School presented by Mr. Wallace Anderson, the Superintendent, stated the number on the roll to be 139 with an average attendance of 86. At the close of the year there were seventeen teachers. The contributions for the year were satisfactory.

The report of the Missionary Association regretted that

the contributions for the year just closed showed a decided falling off. The report recommended the amounts to be given to each scheme, Mr. Jos. Henderson, the Treasurer, moved its adoption, and a vote of thanks to the lady collectors. The motion was seconded by Mr. W. D. McIntosh, and carried.

Mr. John Gowans reported that the total subscriptions to the Century Fund on January 21st, were \$24,257.40. On account of these subscriptions, the sum of \$12,383.90 had been paid and applied as follows :

The report of the Murray-Mitchell Auxiliary was presented by Mr. John Paton. The meetings during the year had been of much interest, and well attended, and much work had been done.

The report of the Hopeful Gleaners Mission Band reported increased interest among the members. During the year the Band suffered a severe loss through the death of Mrs. Watson, for many years their president.

The report of the Wayside Gatherers Mission Band was presented by Mr. R. C. Steele. The average attendance had been satisfactory, and the year's work was cause for gratification and encouragement for the future.

On the motion of Mr. A. A. Allan, seconded by Mr. Robt. Flaws, a vote of thanks was tendered the choir for their services during the year.

The meeting then adjourned.

THE SESSION'S REPORT.

The Session in reviewing the history of the congregation for the past year, while it has been a time of varied experiences, yet see in it much cause for thanksgiving and gratitude to God for the way in which He has led this people.

The year opened in uncertainty as to the future and with an outlook that was not altogether encouraging. Our beloved pastor, Rev. Louis H. Jordan, B.D., had some time previously intimated his intention of resigning the charge in which he had so faithfully and earnestly labored for nearly six years, this resignation was shortly to take effect and the congregation was again to face a vacancy with all it meant in its effects on the life and work of the Church.

To the Session this was an anxious time, as no doubt it was to all who had the best interests of the congregation at heart, but in the providence of God, this uncertainty and anxiety have been cleared away, and the year closes with bright prospects for all the interests which are centred in this place. Mr. Jordan's resignation having taken effect at the end of March, a large committee consisting of the Session, the Managers and other members of the congregation was appointed to take the steps necessary to secure his successor and to arrange for pulpit supply from week to week. The work of this committee was rendered anything but easy by so many ministers declining to preach in a vacant charge, and at times considerable difficulty was experienced in securing the necessary supply. After holding several meetings, the committee decided to call the congregation together, which was done on the 24th October when a unanimous call was extended to the Rev. Alfred

Gandier, B.D., of Fort Massey Church, Halifax. The call was presented to Mr. Gandier at a meeting of the Presbytery at Halifax, on the 29th November, and was then accepted by him. Arrangements were at once made for his induction, and although the year ended without a settled minister in charge, the New Year had but opened when Mr. Gandier's induction took place, and he commenced his ministry among us on the first Sabbath of the year and of the new century, when pastor and people gathered around the table of our Lord to commemorate His dying love, with hearts full of thanksgiving for the blessings of the past and with great hopefulness for the future.

Mr. Jordan in a recent message of kindly greeting to the Session uses words which may well be put on record as showing his deep interest in this congregation, and which may also be used as an exhortation from the Session to all the members and adherents of this Church, he writes, "When your new pastor is placed over you in spiritual things, it is my prayer that you and he may so labor together in all loving considerateness and diligence that you shall win from the outset the Master's coveted benediction,—'Well done, good and faithful servants.'" This is a prayer in which the Session heartily joins. They feel certain that this Church has entered on new era of useful service, and that the loyal support and co-operation which the congregation has ever given to its ministers in the past will be continued to him whom we have just been privileged to welcome.

THE COMMUNION ROLL.

As might have been expected, the prospect of a vacancy, and the vacancy itself, have had the effect of decreasing the number on the Communion Roll.

This large decrease is traceable not so much to the numbers who have left us, as to the lack of new members to take their place. For this the vacancy is no doubt accountable. It is interesting to note as an evidence of the way the congregation has held together that of the 51 certificates granted, 37 were to persons leaving the city, 8 were to those who had removed to such a distance as to prevent their attendance here, leaving but 6 who have left for other reasons.

THE ELDERSHIP.

The Session has lost one of its number by resignation. Mr. C. Blackett Robinson, who was inducted to the eldership in 1885, and who had faithfully served in that office until his removal from the city, tendered his resignation, which the Session had no alternative but to accept. This resignation makes it more than ever necessary that the eldership be increased, and it is probable that before long the Session will ask for an addition to its numbers, from among the many in the congregation so well fitted for the office.

THE CHOIR.

Dr. Anderson who had held the position of organist and choirmaster for a number of years, resigned in May last to accept a similar position in another city church. His place was filled until the end of the year by Mr. V. E. Greene, but is again vacant. It is, however, expected a permanent organist will shortly be secured. The Session desire to sincerely thank those who have by their presence in the choir so ably assisted in the service of praise. It would be a source of gratification to the pastor and the Session if many more of our young people who are so well able to do so, would undertake this duty; they would be rendering a service both well pleasing to God, and of great assistance in His worship.

DEATHS.

There is cause for a deep feeling of thankfulness that this past year we have not been called upon to mourn the loss of

so many of our number as in the three previous years. Yet death has not been absent from us, but has entered some of our homes and taken thence those who were dear to us. Two of the number were of those who have labored faithfully for this congregation: Mrs. John Watson, for many years president of the Hopeful Gleaners' Mission Band, will long be remembered for the untiring interest she took in that society and for the efficient work she did for it; and Wm. Macdonald, Q.C., who, as a manager, was ever looked to for wise counsel and advice and who was always ready to render any assistance in his power to promote the welfare of this church. Our sympathy goes out to all who have been bereaved and our prayer is that they may be comforted by Him who knows all our sorrows and who is ever ready to help us bear them.

TWENTIETH CENTURY FUND.

It is pleasing to note that although the congregation has been so long without a settled pastor, there has been no diminution of interest in the Twentieth Century Fund, as is evidenced by the fact that there has been a steady inflow of payments during the year, so that at the present time about half of the whole amount subscribed has been paid to the Treasurer.

The Session need not refer to the other organizations of the church; full reports will be presented by them showing the work they have been able to accomplish during 1900. Another year has now commenced, with an outlook bright in expectancy. The congregation under the able leadership of our new pastor, is well prepared to again go forward, and laboring faithfully with him, should, with God's blessing, accomplish even greater things than we have yet undertaken for the upbuilding of the Master's kingdom.

MANAGERS' REPORT.

In presenting their Report for the year 1900, the Board of Managers congratulate the congregation upon their very satisfactory position financially, and the prospects for the future in every branch of congregational work. The receipts during the year have been sufficient to defray all expenditures and to reduce the debit balance of \$847.58 with which was commenced the year to the small sum of \$93.40.

A comparative statement of receipts for the past three years is as follows :

The Managers hope that the coming year will see the success of the Century Fund in this congregation. The subscriptions, when paid, are invested at the same rate of interest as is paid on the church mortgage, so that when the whole sum is paid, the yearly interest on the mortgage will no longer be a charge on the yearly revenue.

During the past year the congregation parted with great regret with our late minister, the Rev. L. H. Jordan. The Managers thought it desirable to obtain his portrait, now in the lecture room, and at the same time to obtain the portrait of a former much-esteemed minister, the Rev. Dr. King.

The managers wish to congratulate the congregation upon the settlement of the Rev. Mr. Gandier as our minister. They assure him of their hearty support and sympathy in his work in St. James' Square and are sure that his ministry will be successful in the highest and best sense.

The school was open on 48 Sabbaths during the year and was closed only during the month of August.

The number on the roll at end of year is 139 :—viz. 66 boys, and 73 girls, and of these, at least 48 are not otherwise

connected with this congregation. We desire to lay special emphasis upon this, and would indulge the hope that the families of the congregation may be more largely represented on our roll and in the classes during the teaching hour in the new year than has recently been the case.

The average attendance was not encouraging—only 86, viz.: 38 boys and 48 girls, but the smallness of it is principally accounted for by the fact that during the heated term of July and September the Sabbath School attendance fell off considerably, running down as low as 22 on July 29th.

The largest attendance was 115 on December 16th.

As in our last report, we desire to record with pleasure the fact that the older boys and girls have been faithful to the school throughout the year, and it is a matter for congratulation that those who began the year with us are still with us.

We give above the names of the teaching staff at close of year, showing few changes from our last annual report. This is still, however, deficient in numbers, and our work we feel could be done with greater efficiency in its various features if we had from four to six additional teachers, as some of the classes are at present too large.

It would also be a comfort and satisfaction to the Superintendent did he know of several in the congregation who would, at a moment's notice, be willing substitutes for teachers who may be prevented by sickness or other unavoidable causes, from taking their classes on the Sabbath day. In this connection it is our pleasure to record our appreciation of the willing assistance given us at various times by interested friends. Without them, our temporary equipment would often have suffered.

The givings of the School for missionary purposes during the year totalled \$189.22, being \$22.02 over amount of preceding year. There were also three special collections taken up, amounting to \$70.50, making the total offerings for all

purposes \$250.72. Fuller particulars will be found in Financial Statement printed elsewhere.

Our annual Sabbath School Picnic was held at Lorne Park on Saturday, June 23rd, and was fairly attended, not only by scholars, but by parents and friends as well.

The annual Christmas Social has been fixed for Friday evening, January 11th, 1901.

In our report for 1899 we drew attention to the need of replenishment in the Library, but thus far nothing has been done in that direction: therefore we once more commend the matter to the liberality of the Managers. The Librarians report that little interest is taken in the Library in its present condition, the books being old, and most of them read and re-read by the scholars, while there are many which, on account of their character, are scarcely if ever asked for. Under these circumstances, we feel that, to make this department of our work more efficient, a special appropriation for that purpose is desirable.

During the year, there have been supplied to the teachers at the Church's expense "The Teachers' Monthly;" to the senior and intermediate scholars "The Home Study Quarterly," and to the junior scholars, "The Primary Quarterly." In addition to these, the scholars as mentioned, have been given "The King's Own" and "Jewels" respectively, two delightful papers for home reading. All these periodicals are the publications of our own Church, and we would here express our appreciation of the good work done by the Editor, our friend, the Rev. R. Douglas Fraser.

The need of a Senior Bible Class is still felt, and we are sure that if such were in existence it would be a great support to us in our work.

In conclusion, with others in the congregation, we regret the resignation of our former pastor, the Rev. Louis H. Jordan, B.D., who was always in sympathy with our work, and often encouraged us by his wise and kindly words. It is our prayer that he may be richly blessed in his new sphere of endeavour,

The Committee of the Missionary Association presents its report for the year ending, 31st December, 1900.

The amount received by the Treasurer from all sources was \$2,372.51. Of this there was received through the Collectors, \$2,132.25.

interest. She spoke of the great distress caused by the famine, and gave interesting particulars of the industrial work being carried on. In May, Mrs. Avison, lately returned from Corea, gave an account of the work there. At our thank-offering meeting Rev. Murdock MacKenzie gave a stirring account of the experiences through which our Missionaries in Honan had passed, and of their deliverance by the good hand of God. This meeting was well attended, and the offering amounted to \$126.10. Mrs. Livingstone, of the Ewart Training Home, was present at one meeting, and presented the claims of the Home, and told of the work being carried on by those in training; and on another occasion Mrs. Grant's description of her visit to one of the Indian schools, was much enjoyed. We have 91 Members, and seven Scattered Helpers have contributed \$10.75. The total amount raised by the Auxiliary during the year is \$318.05. Also the Auxiliary and friends in the congregation contributed to the Famine Fund, \$256.05. \$6.50 was given for the North West supplies and clothing to the value of \$7.45. During the year, two of our members have passed away, one of them the beloved President of the Hopeful Gleaners Mission Band. We extend our warm sympathy to the members of the Band, realizing from our own loss how much they must miss her; but with her it is fulness of joy in the Master's presence forever more. The general attendance at our meetings has not been encouraging. Is there not room for heart-searching on this point? Are we growing weary in the Master's Service? "Let us not be weary in well doing; for in due season, we shall reap if we faint not."

The work has been carried on as in former years, the meetings being held on the second Tuesday of each month except in July and August, an hour at each of four meetings was devoted to making quilts for the North-West, and these with articles made at home by the members comprised a donation valued at \$30. The June and October meetings were held in the evening and were especially helpful and interesting. During the year papers have been read dealing with missionary work in China, India, Africa, Japan, the North-West, South Sea Islands, Trinidad, &c., and fourteen members have taken part in the meetings. A special feature of the year's work was the reading of original papers by several of the members.

We feel, too, that we have lost not only a president, but a very dear friend whom we shall not soon forget. It only remains for us to do our work as she would have had us do it.

HISTORICAL NOTES.

The first printed ANNUAL REPORT of the Congregation covers the history of its life and work during 1865. The history of the Congregation, prior to 1865, must be sought in the official *minutes* of the Session and of the Board of Managers.

The Congregation of St. James Square was formed by act of the U. P. Presbytery of Toronto, June 23rd, 1853. This step was the outcome of a Petition, already favorably considered at a meeting of the Synod of the United Presbyterian Church, whereby the Presbytery was urged to organize a second U.P. Congregation in Toronto. The Presbytery granted the prayer of the petitioners, and at the same time it agreed to sanction the invitation extended to Rev. John Taylor, M.D., to act as stated supply of the new Congregation. Dr. Taylor afterwards became the minister of this promising charge, the call addressed to him being signed by thirty members and about fifty adherents.

At the beginning of its history, the Congregation was known as the "Gould Street U. P. Church." For about twenty-five years it worshipped in the structure now occupied by the adherents of the Catholic Apostolic Church, corner of Victoria and Gould Streets. In 1877 the original property was sold for \$10,000,—which sum, by the way, was exactly the amount paid for the Gerrard Street site. The present structure was at once commenced. On November 17th, 1878, the new Church was formally set apart for the worship of God, Rev. Dr. Taylor of New York, and Rev. Dr. Jenkins, of Montreal, preaching the opening sermons.

The following ministers have served in the pastorate of the Congregation. The dates set after their respective names indicate the period during which each held office:—

The Rev. Dr. Taylor spent his later life in Edinburgh, Scotland, where he died October 30th, 1880, in the eightieth year of his age. The Rev. Dr. Burns died in Toronto, August 19th, 1869. The Rev. Dr. King, a tried and trusted leader in our Church in Canada, and who held the important post of Principal of our College in Winnipeg at the time of his death, passed hence, after a brief illness, on March 5th, 1899. The Rev. Dr. Kellogg returned to his missionary labors in India, where, at the same time, he assisted in the re-translation of the Scriptures into Hindi and Urdu. As the result of an accident, just on the eve of his accepting a Professorship in the United States, he was suddenly called away on May 3rd, 1899. The Rev. Mr. Jordan resigned that he might devote some years to making fuller and more exact research in the field of Comparative Religion.

* Dr. Burns, strictly speaking, was not pastor of the congregation, for he was never inducted. He, nevertheless, for a time, discharged the duties of the pastorate, in addition to his professorial work in Knox College.

The Managers derive no revenue from the pews. All the sittings are free, no pew rent being charged to any one.

CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE SUPPORT OF ORDINANCES IN ST. JAMES SQUARE CHURCH may be made in one of three ways:—

(1) Weekly Offerings, enclosed in special envelopes and placed on the collection plate each Sabbath.

(2) Quarterly Subscriptions.

(3) Open Contributions, placed upon the collection plate.

The first method has been adopted by the greater part of the congregation; it ought, if possible, to be adopted by all.

The necessary envelopes are given out at the beginning of each quarter, as well as upon the allocation of sittings. Any one not now receiving envelopes, but desiring to contribute in that way, is requested to give his or her name to any of the Managers; and the matter will at once be attended to.

All who occupy sittings are expected to contribute, according to their means, towards meeting the current expenses of the congregation. All alike derive the benefit which accrues from the expenditure of the congregation's funds; ALL, therefore, should aid in raising these funds. All cannot give amounts equally large,—this is neither asked nor expected; but all can give *something*. EVERY ONE who is *in receipt of a regular income*, be it small or great, is in a position to dedicate a portion of it to the Lord. “Let each man do according as he hath purposed in his heart; and not grudgingly, or of necessity, for God loveth a cheerful giver.”

from week to week, and the total amount paid, which shows its steady growth. Up to the present time 264 persons have subscribed to the fund and nearly two hundred of them have made one or more payments on their subscriptions, and many have paid in full. This is very gratifying when it is remembered that when the scheme was first started in the congregation late in autumn of 1899, strong emphasis was laid upon the fact that while it was very desirable every member should take part in this thank-offering by subscribing at an early date, (however small the amount,) payment might be made at any time at the convenience of the subscriber, either in instalments, or in full up to the first day of May, 1901, after which date the Century Fund books will be closed. It is now within three months of that date, and it becomes necessary for the congregation to make an early effort to have the small balance still required to make up the \$25,000 subscribed and the whole amount of the subscriptions paid to the Treasurer.
