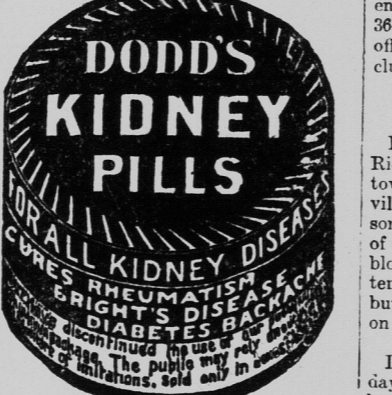

Montreal Pastor Says Vision of Betterment Lead to Agitation and Reform.

(Montreal Witness) There is no hour in a man's experience greater than the hour in which he sees life in the light of a heavenly vision and then girds up the loins of his soul to turn that vision into reality.

These were the opening sentences of a sermon in the American Presbyterian church last evening by the Rev. Dr. Johnston on 'Aspiration and Ideals.'

Every great duty or privilege appears first as a vision. The musician hears the harmony that flows into his soul before ever he puts hand to score or to instrument.

The election of officers took place before the chief business of the meeting was taken up and resulted as follows: J. F. Owens, president; Miss Cotter, vice-president, and Miss Milligan secretary.

Mr. McLean, who submitted the draft of the pension scheme, explained that he had sent copies of the document to about twenty of the principal teachers of the province, from each of whom he had received a reply expressing approval.

The speaker went on to explain the points in the scheme and he was followed by Mr. Myles, who spoke along the same lines. In the course of the discussion that followed the opinion of the amount of the pension named for them is too small.

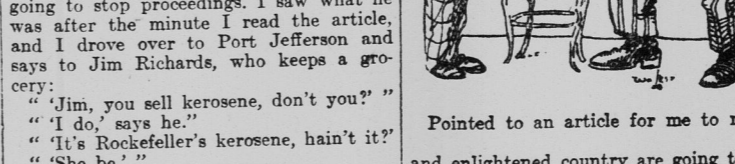

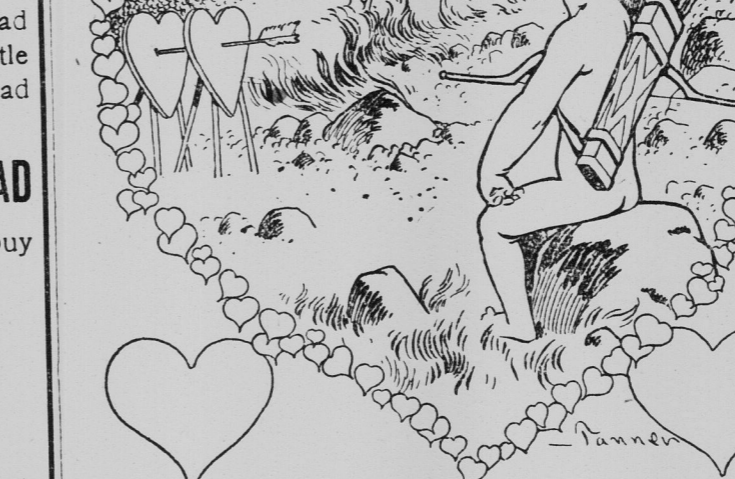

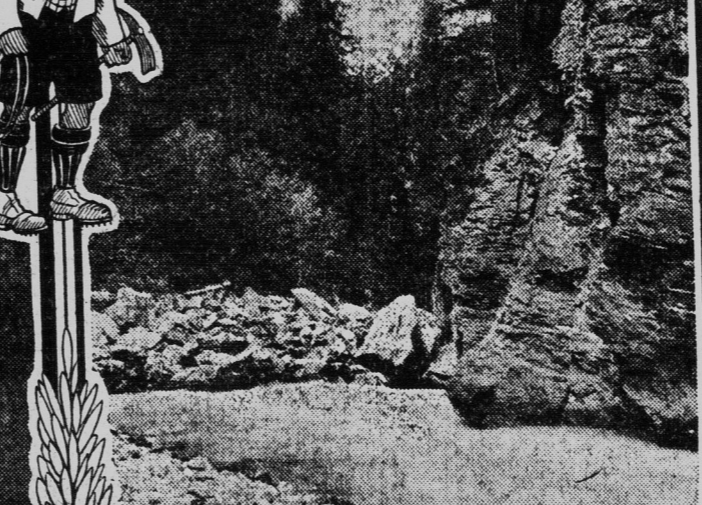
