The period of the Comet is presumed to be every 292 years—and Mr. Hind, of England, agrees with the most celebrated astronomers of the day in their calculations of its orbit and return. On former occasions, it approached very near the earth, and the display was really magnificent. The perihelion passages of this Comet upon its two former appearances were July 17th, 1264, and April 21st, 1856.
