'We got out of the trenches on Friday night, midnight, not without loss of several men, all of whom I buried before leaving for here. This bivouac or billet is several miles from the trenches, and is only a paper shack. Three bell tents for headquarters 26th. Cold, wet weather. Almost everyone wears rubber boots all the while when not sleeping. General health of all ranks is high. The men are as game as ever, just looking for trouble, which, from what I see right along, isn't hard to get into.



New York, Oct. 30—The London correspondent of the New York Herald cables:

"General Joffre came, saw, and conquered England yesterday, for, after a long war council in Downing street, in which Mr. Asquith, Lord Kitchener, Mr. Lloyd George, Mr. Balfour, and several distinguished English and French "enerals took part, I am informed a complete understanding was arrived at." If am in a position to state Serbia will not be abandoned. Though she may suffer temporarily as the result of the treachery of Bulgaria, and the inactive policy of the king of the Hellenes, in the end the allies will rescue her.

"In this connection, I am told, there has been an effective rapprochement between Russian and Roumania; that the Czar, having agreed to consent to a realization of Roumania's national aspirations, including the cession of certain portions of Bessarabia, Russian troops will march through Roumania traticry to succor Serbia, and that, within a short time King Ferdinand's fine army will support the Quadruple Entente.

"Athens despatch indicates that King Constantine realizes the tide is turning toward the allies, and again it would be no surprise if, despite the threats of the Kalser, when Roumania marches Greece will also be found fighting on the side of the allies."

# New York, Oct. 30—An aerial wireless controlled torpedo, which could be launched from the top of the Woolwogth tower to smash an enemy ship, its inventor proudly says, is being exhibited at the new Washington market by the National Security League. Hundreds of persons who visited the market paused at the National Defence booth, to study George F. Russell's new "wasp with the sting of death." Mr. Russel's invention has the approval and confidence of Prof. Herschel C. Parker, of Columbia, who believes that the wireless-controlled torpedo may come to be a valuable factor in national defence plans. The contrivance is a torpedo with wings and double propeiler, one at each end. It is seven feet two inches long, can carry five hundred pounds of powerful explosives, is built to travel at the rate of 200 miles an hour, and can be constructed cheaply. The inventor asserts that with his wireless apparatus a torpedo could be fired from the top of any very tall building, and accurately directed until it reached its target.
