SPEECH
of Attorney-General Blaine on the Opposition's Want of Confidence Motion.

We gave last week a summary of the speech in the Assembly at Fredericton on Mr. Park's Want of Confidence resolution with the Attorney-General's opening remarks. His speech was such a complete vindication of the Government, however, that we make room for a more full report of it this week.

The Attorney-General said he did not intend to ask the House to remain very long in session, but he would make a few remarks upon the amendment. In the speech delivered the general policy of the Government had been brought before the House, and he would deal with them at length. At present he would only deal with the amendment.

He pronounced that the amendment was moved by Mr. Park after consultation with the gentleman with whom he usually acted. He would treat the resolution with every respect, but if he and his authors did not of their own initiative, the responsibility must rest with themselves. It is not reasonable to suppose that such a resolution would be supported with such arguments, and it was reasonable to suppose that Mr. Park had been charged with the reasons in favor of it. Mr. Park had not asked the House to vote upon the policy of the Government. He spoke against it, but in framing his amendment he has avoided challenging the policy of the Government. Upon questions of such magnitude, one upon which the Opposition have such decided opinions, they ought not to have fled from a declaration of their opinions and should have framed a resolution upon which they could stand with credit, instead of endeavoring to catch votes by touching the outside of the subject. Mr. Park had told the House that the effect of the policy of the Government in respect to the regulations was detrimental to the business of the country and placed

in the hands of a few magnates. He gave no other reasons or arguments for the resolution. Do we find these expressed in this resolution? In these reasons, if they are true, why the House should vote for the resolution? If so, he failed to discover it. He joined issue on the reasons suggested and said if the Opposition would challenge an issue upon this point, he would be prepared to face the House and the country with a defence of the Government's policy and show that it is in the interests of the country and the lumber business. He was not called upon after the discussion of this question now but was prepared to discuss it either here or before his constituents. What does Mr. Park ask the House to do? He asks a change of vote upon the House. He is not concerned with the amendment in what the House is to do, but in what the House is to do, and this is that the estimated revenue should be based upon a reduced rate of stumpage. What reason does he give for this? He has told the position in which the country stands, or the state of existing contracts or the effect such a change would have upon the House. He has told the House that he wishes the estimates, carefully prepared, should be revised? Does he mean that the Secretary shall revise his estimates? He should have given the House some information on these points. When the regulations were adopted gentlemen had purchased the leases under a full knowledge of their conditions and with a full knowledge that the lumber business was depressed. They had a right to hold these leases against all the world, and we are asked to interpose and alter the terms of their holdings. The House is asked to say to these men, "We will put you in a better position than you supposed you would be put in, and which looks no gain; no gripping; no purging."
