XXI.—The owner of every vessel or boat under the burthen of fitteen tons belonging to this Province, and employed in fishing, coasting, or piloting, shall furnish a written description of the same, together with his own name, place of abode, and occupation, to the chief officer of the Provincial Treasury of the district wherein the owner resides; such officer shall thereupon grant to the owner a cartificate, that the requisite description has been filed with him, and that a certain number shall thereafter be painted conspicuously on both bows in figures not less than nine inches ic length, and on the mainsail of such vessel or boat in figures not less than nine inches ic length, and on the mainsail of such vessel or boat in figures not less than three teet in length.
