unique facts with regard to certain tribes of savages have recently been ascertained. W. Montagu Kerr, for instance, has found among the Makorikori tribe in Africa, whom he is the first to describe, gunpowder which they make themselves for use in the flint-lock quite a distance south of the Zambesi river. Their ganpowder burns slowly, and its explosive force is far inferior to that of ours, but it

nswers their purpose very well. They mix ne efflorescence of saltpetre with charcoal which they make from the bark of the mufati tree. This mixture is baked in an earthen pot for several hours, and then it is pulverized and spread in the sunlight, whereit is left for some time. It is not at all likely that the Makorikoris, like the Chinese, discovered the art of making gunpowder. Their fathers doubtless learned it from the Portuguese or from slaves who had lived among white men on the coast. We hear strange things once in a while of African tribes, but it was hardly to be expected that a wholly unknown tribe, hemmed in by the mountains of inner Africa, would be found engaged in the manufacture of gunpowder. tree. Saukuru rivers, many street villages, with
large, gable-rooted huts standing squarely on
either side of the street, inhabited by brownish-red, fine looking people. These villagers
have advanced notions of comfort. They
sleep on wooden bedsteads, instead of on the
floor. Their houses are the largest yet found
in Africa, and are kept clean. Their streets
are about fifty yards wide, sometimes two or
three miles long, and are carefully swept.

into pits dug for the purpose. They are

They carve pestles out of ivory for pounding manioc, and they have astonishing skill as wood carvers. 

A deputation of fifty ladies also filed into the room and were given seats along the east side of the room. One-third of them remained till the meeting broke up. There was also a strong contingent of saloon-keepers present. The galleries were noisy and demonstrative at times, and more than once had Ald. Crocker (Chairman of the Committee of the Whole) to call them to "order."

It will be remembered that at the meeting of the Executive Committee last. Thursday by a vote of 10 to 3 it was decided not to submit Ald. Fleming's bylaws to the people for approval or rejection. Therefore the temperance men and their suprocters in the convent transdet trans

ments. Mayor Howland stated positively that there were but twenty unlicensed liquor dives in Toronto. Ald, Shaw said the License Commissioners would not recognize any bylaw the people might pass. Ald, McMi lan said it was an act of simple justice that the people should be allowed t vote on the number of taverus they should have. Mayor Howland said further that the council was trying to burke the will of the people. He denied emphatically that saloonkeepers had any vested rights. There was no such thing as compensation for saloonkeepers. Their licence was but a yearly privilege and could be chopped off at any time. When voting time came things began to get pretty well mixed up. An amendment by Ald. Boustead to strike out the report of the Executive was voted down by 22 to 12. Ald. Baxier's amendment in effect to compromise at 173 met a similar fate. Then a whole batch of amerdments were sent up to the table, and amid much noise, either declared out of order or voted down.
