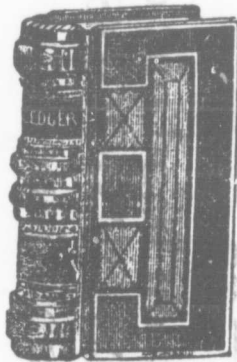

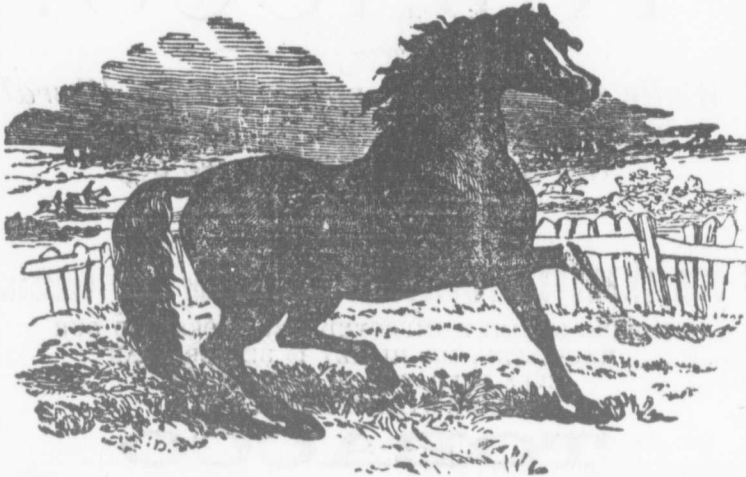

EXPLANATIONS
AND
PRINCIPAL ARTICLES OF THE CALENDAR FOR 1878.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time, to the nearest minute, for Charlottetown, with the exception of the Sun's right ascension and declination, and the equation of time, which are given for the instant of apparent noon.

The bearings of the Moon, at the time of its changes, are given for the purpose of assisting or testing the truth of weather forecasts.

The days of expected atmospheric disturbance are those on which the Moon, in its orbit, crosses the equinoctial line, or attains its greatest north or south declination. When these days fall close upon—within two days—the time of the Moon's change, or perigee, the disturbing influence on the atmospheric tides is proportionally increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences are combined, and the more closely these times agree, the stronger and more certain is the disturbance to be expected.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days, it sometimes happens that the effects of a storm generated within the tropics, may be propagated so as to arrive within two or three days, it having been ascertained that the average rate at which the centre of such storms travel, is about sixteen miles an hour.

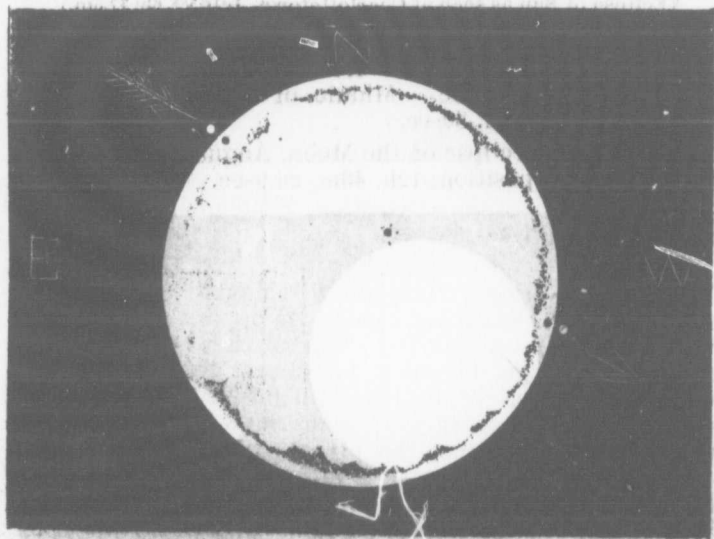

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Apparent motion alternately retrograde and direct between the following dates, when he will be stationary to the east or to the west of the Sun, January 22. W.; April 26, E.; May 19, W.; August 27, E.; September 18, W.; December 16, E.; being a morning star while to the West, and an evening star when to the East of the Sun. He will be in inferior conjunction with the Sun on January 10, May 6, September 9, and December 25; in superior conjunction with the Sun, March 20, July 4, and October 24. On the sixth of May he will pass in transit across the Sun's disc.

VENUS.—Motion direct till January 28; retrograde till March 12; after which direct to the end of the year; she will be in inferior conjunction with the Sun February 20; in superior conjunction, December 6; on January 7, she will be occulted by the Moon.

MARS.—Motion direct throughout the year; in conjunction with the Sun, September 18; after which he will reappear as an evening Star to the end of the year; he will be occulted by the Moon, September 3.

JUPITER.—Apparent motion direct till May 26; retrograde till September 23; afterwards direct till the end of the year; in opposition to the Sun, being on the meridian at midnight, July 24; in conjunction with the Sun, January 5; occulted by the Moon ten times during the year, April 23, May 21, June 17, July 14, August 10, September 6, October 4, October 31, November 28, December 26; range of motion 28° between Sagittarius and Capricornus.

SATURN.—Direct till July 15; then retrograde till November 30; direct to the end of the year; in conjunction with the Sun, March 13; in opposition, September 22; range of motion 16° in Pisces.

URANUS.—Motion retrograde till May 1; direct till December 11; afterwards retrograde; in opposition to the Sun, February 15; in conjunction, August 22; occulted by the Moon three times, February 16, March 16 and April 12; range of motion, 8° in Leo. On the 2nd February, and also on the 24th of July,—Uranus may be found in conjunction with Regulus, the planet being about 20° (two thirds of the Moon's diameter) to the North of the star.

NEPTUNE.—Motion direct from January 15th to August 13th; retrograde during the rest of the year; in conjunction with the Sun, April 28; in opposition, October 31; range of motion about 5° in Aries.

Of the fifteen lunar occultations above mentioned, not one will be observable here, each occurring in the day time, or when the moon is below the horizon.

TIDE TABLE.

ECONOMICAL BREAD.—Only the coarse bran to be removed from the flour: of this take five pounds, and boil it in rather more than four gallons of water, so that when perfectly smooth you may have three gallons and three quarts of bran-water, clear; with this knead fifty-six pounds of flour, adding salt and yeast in the same way, and proportions as for other bread. Thus made, flour will imbibe three quarts more of bran water than of plain, so that it not only produces a more nutritious, substantial food, but makes an increase of one-fifth of the

TO PRESERVE LEMONS.—Take some fine lemons, pare the yellow rind off very thin, cut out a piece of the rind at the blossom end, and remove the pulps and pips. Now, rub the lemons well all over with fine salt, and lay them in cold water, where they should remain for five or six days, totally immersed. Then boil them in new salt and water twenty minutes. Next prepare a syrup of one pound of loaf sugar to one quart of water, well skimmed; into this put the lemons, and boil five or six minutes each for four days successively; then

place them in a jar, and let them stand for six weeks—being particular that they are completely covered with syrup. After the special time, make a thick, fine syrup of the best refined sugar and water, put the lemons into it, and boil them gently ten minutes; set them aside, and after twenty hours boil them again at short intervals until they look plump and soft. Then lay them into jars or glasses, and pour the syrup over them cold; cover them with brandy paper, and tie bladder and lather over all.

TOMATO CATSUP.—Take ripe tomatoes, and scald them just sufficient to allow you to take off the skin; then let them stand for a day, covered with salt; strain them thoroughly to remove the seeds; then, to every two quarts, three ounces of cloves, two of black pepper, two nutmegs, and a very little cayenne pepper, with a little salt; boil the liquor for half an hour, then let it cool and settle; add a pint of the best cider vinegar, after which, bottle it, corking and sealing it tightly. Keep it always in a cool place.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Great Britain must be prepaid by postage stamp *Two* cents per 4 oz. each packet.

Parcel Post to places in Canada, $12\frac{1}{2}$ cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. weight.

Parcels intended to pass through the Mails should not exceed 5lbs. in weight, or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by *Parcel Post*." Parcels may be Registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.

MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER,

Books and Pamphlets, Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, etc.

CANADA AND UNITED STATES.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, and not exceeding 5lbs. in weight, 25 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth or depth, must be prepaid by Postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions. Bank notices, advices of goods in transit, and personal notices, are liable to letter rate because intended for the information of a particular person. Post Bands with an impressed one cent stamp for this purpose, may be obtained at the rate of 4 for 5 cents.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an Order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, which are not actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, posted for places in the United States, will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, pre-paid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.

STATISTICS, &c., RELATING TO P. E. ISLAND.

Prince Edward Island contains an area of about 1,250,000 acres, nearly all of which is fit for cultivation. It is divided into three Counties, 67 Townships, and 15 Electoral Districts. The population, by the census of 1871, is 94,021, of whom about 42,651, are in Queen's County. The population of Prince County is 28,022; and of King's County, 23,068. Charlottetown, the Capital of the Island, is in Queen's County, and contains about 8807 inhabitants; Georgetown and Royalty, 1056; and Summerside and Township No. 17, 3,562. The House of Assembly is composed of 30 members, and the Legislative Council of 13, all of whom are elected by the people. The Executive Council is limited to nine members. Responsible Government was granted in 1851. In 1871 an Act passed the Legislature, authorizing the Government to construct a line of Railway from Alberton to Georgetown, with branch lines to Souris and Tignish. This Road—measuring about 200 miles—was completed and handed over to the General Government of Canada, in December, 1874. On the 1st day of July, 1873, the Island entered the Union, and became part of the Dominion of Canada. In the Session of 1875 was passed "The Compulsory Land Purchase Act," by which a Court was created for assessing a just value for each Proprietor's estate, which value being found, the estate became the property of the Government.

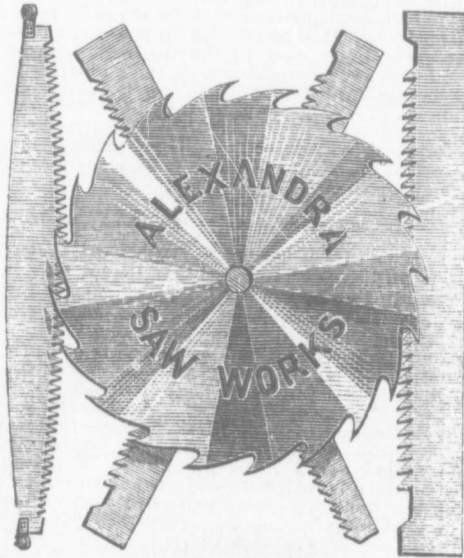
