AN ACT,

TO INCORPORATE THE ALUMNI OF KING'S COLLEGE, WINDSOR.

Passed the 30th day of March, 1847.

WHEREAS, a number of persons have associated Preamble. themselves under the name of The Alumni of King's College, Windsor, for the promotion of Education, and have raised by private contribution, sums of money which they are desirous to expend in aid of the Funds of the said College, on the promotion of Education in the said College, and the Collegiate School at Windsor, connected therewith, in or towards the maintenance and support of the Teachers therein, or in such other way as may best conduce to the end which they have in view, and they are desirous of obtaining assistance from the Legislature, by the passing of an Act of Incorporation for enabling them to hold property, and manage their a airs with greater ease and convenience.

Governor, Council and Assembly, That John T. of King's Col-Twining, James B. Uniacke, Henry Pryor, Hugh sor, incorpo-Hartshorne, and all and every such other person and rated, persons as now are members of, or in the said Society, and their successors, shall be, and are hereby appointed a Body, Politic and Corporate, in deed and in name, by the name of "The Alumni of King's College, Windsor," and by that name have succession and a common Seal, and by that name shall sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded at law and in equity, and in all Courts and places, and be able, and capable in Law to have, hold, purchase, get, receive, take, possess, and enjoy, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Rents, in fee simple or otherwise, and also Goods and Chattels, and all other things real, personal, and

mixed, and also to give, grant, sell, let, assign, or convey the same or any part thereof, and to do and execute all other things in and about the same as shall or may be thought necessary or proper; and also shall have, from time to time and at all time full power, authority, and license to constitute, make and establish such Bye-Laws, Rules, and Ordinances, as may be thought necessary for the rule and good management of said Society, the establishing of the Officers proper for the management of its affairs, and declaring the extent, duration, and authority of the Offices and Officers of the Society, and their mode of appointment, and generally for promoting the objects of the Society: Provided such Bye-Laws, Rules and Ordinances, be not contrary or repugnant to the Laws and Statutes of this Province, or those in force within the same, or to the Laws and Statutes of King's College, Windsor, respectively, at the time such Bye-Laws, Rules, and Ordinances, may be constituted and established, or to the provisions of this Act: provided also that the said Society shall not hold at any time, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, Goods, Chattels, Property, or Effects, of greater value than Ten Thousand Pounds.

Annual Subscription to be paid by Members.

Proviso.

II. And be it enacted, That all persons paying to an Annual Subscription of Twenty Shilings or upwards, or making at one time a Donation of Twenty Pounds or upwards, shall be entitled to be members of the said Society, having been duly admitted pursuant to the Bye-Laws thereof: Provided that such Annual Subscription or Donation be actually paid into the Funds of the Society, and provided that no person now a member of the said Society, or who hereafter may become a member of the same, shall at any time hereafter continue a member of the same, unless he shall have heretofore paid, or shall hereafter pay at one time into the Funds of the said Society, a Donation of at least Twenty Pounds, or shall hereafter annually, and from year to year, pay into the said Funds the sum of Twenty Shillings or upwards, and if such Annual Subscription, or payment of any such Annual Member, shall not be paid on the first day of May in each year, such Member shall there-

Henry Hezekiah Cogswell, now the Vice President of the said Society, be the Vice President of the said Society after the passing of this Act; that Samuel L. Shannon, Esquire, now the Secretary and Treasurer of the said Society, be the Secretary and Treasurer thereof after the passing of this Act; and Samuel P. Fairbanks, Henry Pryor, James B. Uniacke, William J. Almon, Robert Fitzgerald Uniacke, Mather B. Almon, and Charles Twining, now the managing Committee of the said Society, shall after the passing of this Act, be the Executive Committee of the said Incorporated Society, until an Executive Committee be elected under this Act.

V. And be it enacted, That all persons without re-Persons of all gard to religious denomination or difference of relig-nominations ious sentiments, may be, and at any time hereafter eligible as members. become members of the said Incorporated Society, being in all other respects entitled to be and become members of the said Society, and now and at any time hereafter may hold any of the said appointments, or any other offices and appointments in the said Incorporated Society, being duly elected and appointed thereto, pursuant to the Bye-Laws thereof, any thing contained herein, or in any Rules, Regulations, or Bye-Laws of the said Society, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Appointment of President, and Committee.

VI. And be it enacted. That the said Society In-Vice Presi corporated as aforesaid, shall have power from time to time hereafter, to appoint the President, Vice President, and Executive Committee at some General Meeting of the said Society, by a majority of the members of the Society present, the whole number present being not less than Twenty Members; according to such regulations concerning such appointments as may hereafter be made by any Bye-Laws of the said &ociety to be made by virtue hereof.

And be it enacted, That the Secretary and Appointment of Secretary Treasurer of the said Society, and such other Officers as may hereafter be required for the management of its affairs, shall be appointed in such manner as shall be declared by the Bye-Laws and Rules of the said

Society, to be passed by virtue hereof.

Investment and disposal of Funds.

And be it enacted, That all Donations to VIII. of Donations, the said Incorporated Society, to constitute Life Members or otherwise, of not less than Twenty Pounds, shall be invested under the direction of the Executive Committee, as a permanent Fund for the benefit of the aid Society, and that the Funds of the said Incorporated Society shall from time to time be laid out and applied by the Executive Committee, in such way and for such purpose only as any General Meeting of the said Society may direct or appoint, and that the Executive Committee shall be bound, and are hereby required annually to account to the Society for all their acts, receipts, expenditures, and doings whatsoever in the said office, and to make a report annually to the said Society at its General Meeting, of the progress and state of the said Society, and of its affairs generally.

IX. And be it enacted, That a General Meeting of the said Society shall be held once, that is to say, sometime within the last ten days of the month of June in each year, and as much oftener as may be directed

by any Rule or Bye-Law of the said Society.

X. And be it enacted. That the Executive Committee of the said Society shall meet and assemble as often as there may be occasion, and any three members shall form a quorum.

BYE-LAWS

OF THE

ALUMNI OF KING'S COLLEGE, WINDSOR.

Passed at General Meeting held at the Halifax Hotel, 27th June, 1848.

I.—Besides the Annual General Meeting of the Incorporated Society, it shall be competent for the Committee at any time, either of their own accord, or upon a requisition signed by at least ten of the members of the Association, upon giving seven days notice in the public papers, to call a Special General Meeting of the Association, specifying the purposes for which it is called, and in which Meeting it shall be competent for the Association to transact any such business as may be required. Ten members shall be deemed a quorum for the transaction of business.

II.—That the Books, Accounts, and Papers of the Association, shall be open at all times to the inspection of all the members, and the Secretary shall furnish an account of the affairs of the Association, whenever required by the Committee.

III.—That the Treasurer and Secretary, and such Officers as shall be requisite for the incorporated Society, shall be annually appointed by the Executive Committee.

IV.—That at the Annual Meeting of the Association, the President and Vice President shall alternately go out of office, accompanied by the first three of the Committee, and that all or any of them on having a majority of votes, shall be eligible to be re-elected.

V.—That at any meeting, members not present may vote by proxy in writing to be held by any other member; provided that no member shall be entitled to vote either personally or by proxy, whose dues are not all paid up for the preceding year.

VI.—That the Funds of the Association will be appropriated for the payment of one or more Professors or Lecturers, and one or more Scholarships at the University of King's College, or one or more Teachers or Exhibitions in the Collegiate School at Windsor, to be denominated the Alumni Professorships and Scholarships respectively.

VII.—That the Association will scrupulously apply such Donations as may be made to them, to such specific objects in aid of King's College, as may be directed by the Donors respectively.

VIII.—That all Meetings of the Incorporated Society shall be opened with prayer.

IX.—(Passed at General Meeting of June 21st, 1849.) That the elections for members of the Incorporation shall be by ballot.

st, 1849.) hall be by AT the General Meeting of the Society held at Windsor, in June, 1852, the usual Grant of £50 stg. towards the salary of rofessor of Modern Languages was passed—and £20 cy. towards procuring a 2nd Assistant at the Academy up to the 31st December,—such grant to cease from that period.

As the Foundation Scholarships have been discontinued, owing to a want of funds, the Alumni granted a sum of £25, to be at the disposal of the Committee for prizes for the ensuing year, 1853, which has been distributed in the following manner, viz:

For the best General Scholar in College, £10

For the best Mathematical Scholar (the winner of the 1st prize to be excluded,)

For the best Modern Linguist—open to all, £5

For the best general conduct—open to all, £5

His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese, has also offered a prize of £5 (in books) for the best English Essay.

And the Hon. Mr. Justice Bliss, has offered a prize of £5,

(also in books) for the best Latin verse.

The Committee have much pleasure in stating that they waited on His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, who very kindly premised his aid and support to the Association, and consented to become its Patron.

At the request of the Alumni the Governors have abolished all the oaths heretofore taken by undergraduates on matriculation, except the oath of allegiance;—a promise of obedience to the Statutes being required in lieu of them.

It was understood that a new edition of the Statutes would

shortly be published.

The income of the Society from interest on investments (exclusive of the Wm. Cogswell Scholarship fund and the Academy Prize endowment), and from annual subscriptions, is about £200 per annum.

The Committee meet at the Secretary's office on the first Wednesday of every month, at 3 o'clock, P. M., and all members of the Society who may visit Halifax at any of those periods are invited to attend.

The Terms appointed for Matriculation are the last week in June and the first week in September. There should be a full three years attendance at Lectures. These are designed to embrace the successive study of the most approved Classics, the several branches of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy and Logic, the Evidences of Religion, Divinity and Hebrew. For such Students as reside after passing the examination for degree, separate classes are formed in the subjects required of Candidates for Ordination, and proficiency is tested by an examination similar to the "Voluntary," at the English Universities.

criber of hall pass THE following Resolutions were passed at the General Meeting, and from their importance they are given at length:—

RESOLVED, That agreeably to the suggestion contained in the Report of the Committee, a Conference be sought with the Governors of the College, for the purpose of consulting as to the best mode of procuring such an alteration in the Charter and Provincial Statutes as may secure the management of the College in the hands of those whose affections are engaged in its behalf, instead of entrusting it to ex-officio members who may or may not be friends of that Institution.

RESOLVED, That the Governors of the College be respectfully requested to take into their consideration the expediency of disposing of part or the whole of the wilderness lands belonging to the College, which are yearly suffering by the depredations of trespassers, and perhaps may at last be wholly alienated from the Institution.

WHEREAS, the Society P. C. K. has granted the sum of £1000, Stg. in aid of the funds of the College, to meet the sum of £2000, raised by the Alumni, which grant has already been funded: And whereas the said venerable Society has also been pleased to promise the further sum of £1000, Stg. whenever the friends of the College shall procure an additional sum of £2000 to meet this second grant, towards which latter amount about £700 had been raised when the late lamented Bishop was removed by death, leaving only a balance of £1300 to be now collected in order to entitle the Institution to this second munificent grant of £1000 from the Society P. C. K. and thus add the large sum of £3250 in all, to the funds of the College. Therefore Resolved, that it is highly essential, that energetic measures should be adopted, without further delay, to render that grant available for the support of the College—and that the attention of the Right Reverend the Visitor, be respectfully invited to this important point.

The money collected for the Jubilee fund in Nova Scotia, (about £130,) has been set apart as the commencement of a fund for endowing a Professorship of Pastoral Theology, at Windsor.
