Personal Appearance of Christ.

The following description was sent to the Roman Senate, by Publius Lentulus, proconsul of Judea, before Herod. Lentulus had seen the Saviour and had made him sit, as it were, that he might give a written description of his features and physiognomy. His portrait, apocryphal though it be, is at least one of the first upon record; it dates from the earliest period of the Church, and has been mentioned by the most ancient fathers. Lentulus writes to the Senate as follows:—"At this time appeared a man who is still living, and endowed with mighty power. His disciples called him the Son of God; others regarded him as a powerful prophet. He raises the dead to life, and heals the sick of every description of infirmity and disease. This man is of lofty stature, and well proportioned, his countenance severe and virtuous, so that he inspires feelings both of fear and love. The hair of his head is of the color of wine, and from the top of his head to the ears, straight, and without radiance, but it descends from the ears to the shoulders in shin ing curls. From the shoulders the hair flows down the back, divided into two portions, after the manner of the Nazarenes: his forehead is clear and without wrinkles, his face free from the rate of the planet and the earth and is thus projected upon the face of Jupiter.
