ECLIPSES,

Like comets, were formerly objects of popular terror, but every one now knows that these phenomena are consequences of the laws of nature, and that they are predicted with as much accuracy as the return of day and night. Eclipses of the Sun must occur twice every year, and they may occur five times. They are *partial*, when the moon hides only a part of the sun's disk; *total*, when she covers the whole of it; and *annular*, when her apparent diameter being less than that of the sun, a portion of his disk is projected all round her body in the form of a luminous ring. The moon being so much smaller than the sun, projects a conical shadow; and being much smaller than the earth, the conical shadow can never cover more than a portion of the earth's shadow. Eclipses of the moon are a common phenomena. They were noted in very early periods, by the Arabians in the dark ages of the Christian era, by Ptolemy at the commencement of the second century, by the Chaldeans several centuries before Christ. Eclipses of the moon are caused by the earth interposing between the sun and moon, and projecting its shadow upon it.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

LEFT HAND PAGE.

Column.

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
- 3 " 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
- 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.
- 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow or fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time. There are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing, namely,—about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
- 7—Length of days in hours and minutes.
- 8—The rising of the Moon.
- 9—The setting of the Moon.
- 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
- 11—The Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—The days of the Month.
- 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
- 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.

- 4—" " " Pictou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine, N.B.
- 5—" " " Annapolis, N. S., St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.

6—" " " St. John's, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establissemont du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 80m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N.B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h.; and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

The top of the columns of each month contain notes on Astronomy.

THE farm to the farmer, is what the ship is to the merchant. To undertake agriculture without means, is like sending a ship to sea without a cargo. The profit is to use them both to their highest capacity. If the merchant cannot fill a ship, he had better sell her and buy a sloop. If a farmer cannot cultivate one hundred acres, let him sell fifty, and put his whole capital on the remainder, and he will find his labour lighter and his profits greater. Farmers are generally anxious to improve their farms, or at least to reap the result of improvements in better crops and greater profits, but very many of them have yet to learn the most direct road to prosperous agriculture. It lies in the careful management of abundant labour and capital, more than in stinting these to the lowest possible amount—the saving is in the prudent use of every means of progress, rather than in the miserly neglect of all which seem to be indirect aids, but which are really the trifles which ensure that increase above the cost of production, which alone counts as profit.

ASTRONOMY.

Astronomy treats of the motions, the distances, the size, the physical constitution, the eclipses, and all other phenomena of the heavenly bodies. Under the general name of *stars* are vulgarly comprehended all the bodies that fill the celestial space; but astronomy ranges them into several classes. In the language of astronomy, those are called *fixed stars* which in the revolution of the sphere seem always to occupy the same relative position, and to preserve the same distances the one from the other. For the greater facility in recognising and designating them, they are di-

It is not the sleepy, unthinking, un-inventive farmer who makes the most money by his vocation; but he who has the best and most perfect implements, and knows how to take care of them when in or out of use.

vided into groups, called *constellations*. Each of these has its proper name, derived from that of a man or an animal, sometimes suggested by its form, but almost always capriciously chosen. The utility of these names has continued them amongst us. To distinguish the several stars of a constellation from each other, they are classed according to their brilliancy or their apparent magnitude, and each class has a particular denomination. Thus the most considerable are arranged into classes or *magnitudes*; this consists in designating them in the order of their magnitude by the letters of the Greek alphabet. If these are not sufficient, recourse is had to Roman letters, and even to the ordinal numbers. This nomenclature has been followed by all modern astronomers. Observations having shown that certain stars, besides the daily revolution which they have in common with the other heavenly bodies, have besides a

There are rainy days enough every year for the farmer to keep his premises in good repair, without employing a carpenter, except for the large and important jobs, provided he has a shop with proper and sufficient tools, by applying them at the right time. A hundred little jobs are constantly waiting to be done, and besides furnishing employment, (which is a great thing) and giving the place a neat and tidy aspect by keeping things in repair, his sons are receiving invaluable lessons, which will be of lasting importance to them. A boy brought up to the use of the bench and tools, becomes at the age of sixteen a carpenter, or at least has acquired sufficient skill to perform all the rough carpenter's work on the farm, and the general appearance about the buildings indicates this, as, for example, gates off their fings, or broken down, boards off the barn or fences, and a general slipshod appearance all over the farm.

motion peculiar to themselves, which alters their relative distances from the other bodies around them, these stars have received the name of *planets*, from a Greek word which signifies wandering. The planets are distinguished into *primary* and *secondary*. The primary planets are those which turn round the Sun as a centre; and the secondary, more frequently called satellites or moons, are those that revolve round a primary planet as a centre, and are carried with it in its revolution round the Sun. To the small planets discovered at the beginning and middle of this century, — sometimes called *telescopic* planets, because seen only with a powerful telescope, Herschel has proposed to give the name of *Asteroids*, including under that name those celestial bodies which move in orbits

WAGGONS last much longer in those parts of the country which are more free from stones. Nothing batters a vehicle to pieces more rapidly than striking stones when under full headway. The farmer who is carrying a load to market or to mill, and whose waggon wheels strike a stone three inches above the common surface, cannot fail to be satisfied that a severe injury has been done to his waggon, harness, and horses by this single concussion. What is the probable cost of a single stone in the highway for one season? Twenty waggons or more probably strike it in a day; that is, it may cause six thousand heavy blows annually against waggons and waggon tires. The only reason for its remaining there is the "trouble" of casting it out. A crow-bar and ten seconds' labour would have removed it. Now is the season when many loose stones, washed out by spring rains, or knocked loose by waggon wheels, should be thrown from the track.

of any eccentricity round the Sun. The Sun, like the planets, seems to have a motion of its own, for we see it rise and set successively in different points of the horizon. At the end of June it rises near the north, remains a long while above the horizon, and approaches nearer the zenith; whereas at the end of December, it rises nearer the south, keeps at a great distance from the zenith, and describes but a small circle above the horizon. To this motion of the Sun we owe the variety of the seasons and the inequality of the days. The Moon's motion, and the aspect she presents at different periods of her course, are still more remarkable. First, she begins to show herself on the western side of the heavens at a little distance from the Sun, under the form of a crescent, which enlarges as the Moon's distance from the Sun increases, until at last

No garden is complete without its shrubbery. A large garden of course requires a good deal to keep it from being naked and bare in appearance, while a small one may, by a judicious arrangement of clumps of shrubs, be made to appear much larger than it really is. Equally with the other branches of ornamental gardening, this department has received greatly increased attention of late years. In order to arrange shrubbery properly, it is absolutely necessary to be informed as to the usual height and habits of growth of the shrubs to be planted. Shrubs require very little care and attention beyond a somewhat particular pruning early in the spring, which is necessary to preserve them of a good shape. No one should begrudge the few hours labour which will be necessary for this purpose, particularly as it may be performed at a time when there is generally abundance of leisure. The great majority of shrubs bear flowers; in many, the flowers are succeeded by ornamental fruit; a few are cultivated only for their foliage.

She then bends gradually more towards the east, rises further and further so every night, till at last she is as near the Sun in the east as she had been in the west. She then shows herself in the morning a little before him, as in the first part of her course she had appeared a little after him. These different phases are run through in a month; after which they are repeated in the same order. To those who have given but little attention to the science of Astronomy, its truths, its predictions, its revelations, are astonishing; and but for their rigorous verification would be absolutely incredible. When we look out upon the multitude of stars which adorn the heavens, scattered in bright profusion in all

SEEDING down with Oats is rarely successful. If the oats are poor, the grass may succeed—but on good soil that will bring heavy oats, and which should grow good grass, it usually fails. There are two modes of seeding down that may be adopted. The first is to sow the grass-seed (double the usual quantity) early in the spring, on the land which has been prepared for the oats, with no other crop, and brush it in. If sown quite early, it will be good pasture before midsummer. The second year the grass will be all that could be wished. The second mode is to sow oats alone, and after harvest to plough in the stubble, and sow and brush in the grass seed. The grass crop next year thus treated will be much better than it could be if the seed was sown with the oats in spring. The "Canadian Agriculturist" says that the Tartarian, white or black, is the best suited to that province—it being hardy—and will more than make up in quantity what it may be deficient in weight by the bushel, and that seed oats ought to be frequently changed.

MANURING grass lands late in autumn is no longer a subject of doubt among the best farmers. It is far better to keep manure housed and apply it as a top-dressing, late in autumn to grass-land, than to apply it in the spring of the year, even if well rotted. Coarse barn-yard manure applied as a top-dressing to grass land in the spring will not increase the crop half as much as the same manure would increase it, were it spread evenly over the surface in the fall. In autumn everything tends downward into the earth. Grass, leaves, stubble, and all such substances return back to the soil. The weather grows cooler and cooler every day, and the various gases do not rise to promote vegetation as they should do in the spring of the year. Therefore, when manure is applied in late autumn almost the entire strength of the manure is carried down into the soil, and there retained as food for plants until the next spring, when new life of plants begins, and long and warm days increase the temperature of the soil.

As farmers cannot complete all their underdrains in one year, nor in several years, there is a mode of ploughing wet fields in autumn which will improve very much the friability of the soil, and thus be the means of producing a much larger and better crop the next season, than when ploughing is performed in the usual way. The first thing is to lay out the lands for ploughing, up and down the slope, as nearly as may be, so that the middle furrows may carry off the surplus water more readily than they would were they made across the slope. Now that the work is laid out, the next step will be to execute it. If the ground is sod ground, the ploughing should be performed—if it be done with a single plough—with lipped furrow-slices, and not with the furrow-slices laid flat. And more than this, the ploughing should be done in narrow lanes, not more than 10 or 15 feet in width. Then, after every piece of land has been finished, adjust the plough for running, as deep as the team can draw it, and cut the middle furrows six or eight inches deeper than the rest of the ploughing, to form a channel for the water.

In the 15th century Copernicus arose, and after forty years of intense study and meditation, divined the true system of the world. The Copernican system maintains, 1. That the *apparent* diurnal motion of the heavenly bodies, from east to west, is owing to the *real* revolution of the earth on its own axis from west to east; and 2. That the Sun is the centre around which the earth and planets all revolve from west to east. This theory is based on arguments so uncontested that it is the only one at present taught. Galileo also proved beyond dispute

THESE is no way that land can be so profitably improved as by grass kept in a vigorous state of growth. To grow large crops of grass we must have rich, drained land—naturally fertile or enriched by manure and thorough culture before seedling down; and by frequent top-dressings afterwards. It must be drained land—artificially drained if subject to stagnant water—or the best grasses cannot be grown, nor can it be brought into profitable rotation with grain crops. It must be thoroughly seeded—economy in grass seed "saves at the spigot to lose at the bung," in the less quantity and poorer quality of the product. And it must not be overstocked. The best pasture land, especially while young, can be ruined by feeding too closely and unseasonably—late in autumn and early in the spring. Let no mild weather tempt you to allow a hoof upon them during the winter. Meadows should be top-dressed with fine manure after baying. And it should not be forgotten that the richer and better stock are fed, the more rapid and profitable their growth, and the far greater value their manure.

It is not already attended to, the dark drizzling days of November afford the farmer a favourable time to repair and put in order his sleds, chains, and axes. The dwelling house should be well banked up, so as to prevent the frost from entering the cellar and freezing the potatoes and other vegetables stored therein. From neglecting to make the cellars frost proof in time, many farmers have lost large quantities of potatoes in their cellars, from freezing. The burrowing of families in ill-lighted rooms, in the cold, dark, north side of the house, where the sun scarcely peers in upon the inmates from November to April, is poor economy indeed, and still poorer, to shut the children, who wish to read or study, to the feeble light of a small sized, greasy, tallow candle. Good oils of various kinds, for illuminating purposes, with lamps to match, are now everywhere obtainable, and at prices within the reach of all. Keep the boys and girls well supplied with suitable books and papers, and then we should hear less of their fleeing from the paternal roof.

The movements of the planets inspire confidence. They are ever visible, and true to their appointed times, while the comet, erratic in its course, bursts suddenly and unannounced upon the sight, and no science can predict in the outset its uncertain track; whether it may plunge into the Sun, or dash against one of the planetary systems, or even come into collision with our own earth, is equally uncertain, until after a sufficient number of observations shall have been made to render the computation of the elements of its orbit possible. Comets, as before stated, move in all directions,

it is therefore not out of the range of possibility that they may come in contact with some of the stars, and the shock of the earth by a comet is rigorously possible; at the same time it is extremely improbable. The doctrine of chances affords the means of estimating numerically the probability of such a collision, and shows that there is but one such chance in 281 millions: that is to say, on the appearance of a new comet, the odds are 281 millions to one that it will not strike against our globe. In the structure, arrangement, and laws, which prevail among the heavenly bodies, in their magnitudes, distances and velocity so much beyond every thing of this kind which belongs to the world around us, is seen the power and wisdom of the Creator.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An Octagonal Light Beacon on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the enterance of the Eastern Passage to Halifax Harbour. Exhibits a red light on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white Belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbour. Two light—*flash light above, fixed light below.*

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted white, on the Southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation 70 feet above sea level.*

PORT MEDWAY—*Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance of the port. Building square, painted white with black square*

in the centre of the seaward sides,—*a white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 80 fathoms of the shore.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *A plain revolving light.*

FORT POINT LIGHT, at the head of Liverpool Harbour. *A bright fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbour.

GULL ROCK LIGHT, OFF THE ENTRANCE OF RAGGED ISLAND HARBOUR. Building square and painted white, exhibiting a *clear fixed light*, at an elevation of 51 feet above sea level, and is situated in lat. $48^{\circ} 89' N.$, and long. $64^{\circ} 88' W.$

SHELBYNE—On McNutt's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—On Bacogro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Harbour. *A flash light*, of thirty seconds.

CAP SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—Building octagon, painted white. *A fixed red light.*

PUBLICO HARBOUR LIGHT—*A Beacon light* on the S. E. side of the entrance to the Harbour, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about 18 miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted white. *A bright white light*, on the seaward side 28 feet above high water level, (rise and fall 12 feet) and stands fifty fathoms from low water mark. The point of each is bold.

YARMOUTH LIGHT—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth Harbour. *A plain light*, revolving once in 80 seconds. Building painted white, and red vertically, elevated 185 feet above the level of the sea. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' N.$, Long. $66^{\circ} 09' W.$

A Spar Buoy has been placed on the Budget Ledge, at the entrance of Cape Negro Harbour. On the N. E. side, half-way from the lower to the upper end of the Ledge, in six fathoms of water, and about 70 feet from the shoal water.

A Fog BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth Harbour, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes seven times per minute.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain white light*, situated about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—On Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of 40 feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Annapolis Basin. *A fixed white light.*

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted white; exhibits two white lights, one above the other. Port Williams is distant from Digby Light House E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock Light House W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted white; exhibits at a distance of five miles a red light. Margaretville is distant E. 87 miles from Digby Light House, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light House.

The lights in the above two beacon lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed white light*, 27 miles E. of Port Williams.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto Channel. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet. The Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbour at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas; 95 feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greater part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blowmedon,) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shows a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted *white*. Bearings and distances: Cape Blowmedon, N. 70°, W. 26° 5', 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52°, W. 7° 5', 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36°, W. 3° 9', 10 miles.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT, off Cape Sable.—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South point of Seal Island. *A white light*, elevated about 80 feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore ought not to attempt passing between them.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS.—*Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, 45 feet above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet. Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be, then, not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the E. of the lights.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT.—This is an American Light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

SWALLOW TAIL POINT LIGHT.—North east side of Grand Manan Island. *A fixed white light*, at an elevation of 180 feet above the level of high water, and seen in clear weather from a distance of 17 miles. Tower 58 feet high, and painted white. Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 52''$ N., Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W.

HEAD HARBOUR LIGHT.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbour Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times, to enter Head Harbour. *A fixed white light.* Building painted white, with a red cross on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS.—Upon this projecting headland two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant 28 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful. Both are *fixed and white*. Building painted *red and white*, in stripes, 5 feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT.—At the entrance of the river and harbour of St. John, N. B. *A fixed white light.* Building painted *red and white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT.—Within Partridge Island. *A fixed white light.* Building painted *white and black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT.—*A revolving white light*, placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white and red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT.—On the point of that name in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain white light.*

A light is placed in a window in a building at Spencer's Point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin, exhibits a *clear fixed light*.

East from Halifax.

BEAVER HARBOUR—On Williams' Island. *A revolving flash light.*

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT.—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of 10 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT.—On Eddy or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSEAU, NORTHERN ENTRANCE.—*A fixed light.*

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT, ANTIGONISH COUNTY.—Building square and painted white. *A revolving white light at intervals of 30 seconds.*

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted white. *A fixed light, 52 ft. above high water mark.*

PICTOU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour. Two *fixed vertical lights—the lower one red.*

ARICHAT BEACON—A light on Point Marache, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbour. Building square, painted white. *A white light, 34 feet above the sea level.*

LOUISBURG—On the east side of entrance to harbour. *A fixed light.*

SCATARI ISLAND—*A revolving light, on the east point of the Island.*

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, eastern coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance of Cow Bay. Lat. $40^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., and Long. $59^{\circ}, 45$ to 50 W., and exhibits a *bright flash light every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass.* The light is 65 feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of 12 miles.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, (Cape Breton) harbour. *A fixed light.*

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—*A fixed light on the N. E. end, and a revolving light on the S. W. end.*

MARGARIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant from the mainland of Cape Breton two and a half miles. *A plain white light.* The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted white, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level; visible from all points of approach. There is a landing near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—When seen from the S. W. shows a *white light*, and from the N. shows a *red light*—both fixed.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or and St. Ann's, east coast of Cape Breton Island, Lat. $46^{\circ} 25' N.$, Long. $60^{\circ} 25' 30'' W.$, exhibits alternate *flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds.* An Octagon building, at an elevation of 85 feet above sea level, and is visible from all points of approach.

The Board of Works have erected three Light Houses at the following places, which were put in operation in November 1864.

On Boar's Head, Petite Passage, Digby county. Exhibits flashes of *red and white at intervals of 60 seconds.*

On Battery Point, Lunenburg county. Building white. *A fixed white light.*

On Fish Island. **LIGHT**—At the entrance of Tusket River. *Two clear fixed lights, horizontally, seaward.*

CAPE RACE, NEWFOUNDLAND, Light House, exhibits a *fixed white light* from sunset to sunrise. Visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped *red and white vertically.* It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Light House is in Lat. $46^{\circ} 89' 12'' N.$, $58^{\circ} 2' 38'' W.$ Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 deg W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle.

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT. An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of BELLE-ISLE separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the

extreme south-west point of the island. A *single fixed white light*, Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire bricks of a light colour. Lat. N. $51^{\circ} 58' 00''$; Long. W. $55^{\circ} 26' 00''$. Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather $28\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $32\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT. Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Fortean Bay, Lat. N. $67^{\circ} 27' 30''$; Long. W. $56^{\circ} 68' 40''$. A *single fixed white light*—two thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $18\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $21\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT. at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. $49^{\circ} 52' 3''$ Long. W. $64^{\circ} 35' 00''$. A *single fixed white light*—two thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT. East coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. $48^{\circ} 51' 00''$, Long. W. $64^{\circ} 15' 00''$. A *single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $16\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $19\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at, or near, each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 18½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

The Mails for ST. PIERRE and MIQUELON are forwarded to Newfoundland by Steamer. Letters 8½ cents; if posted in the interior, 18½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

The Mails for BERMUDA and the BRITISH WEST INDIA ISLANDS are made up *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston, at 8 o'clock, once a month the year round. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 18½ cents; Newspapers 2 cents—all *must be prepaid*. ALMANACK.

Masters of vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver at the first Office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate, when inward bound, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

Every master of a vessel inward bound, shall at the port or place of arrival, sign a declaration, in the presence of the person authorized to take the same, that he has to the best of his knowledge and belief, delivered every letter, package or parcel of letters that was on board his vessel, except such as are exempted. And no officer of the Colonial Revenue shall permit such vessel to enter or report until such declaration has been made and produced, nor permit to break bulk or make entry, until all letters shall be delivered at the Post Office.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage has been established throughout British North America. A single letter must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a single letter. If a letter exceeds the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. it is charged double, treble, &c., according to weight.

Letters for registry must be mailed half an hour previous to the closing of the Mail by which they are to be sent. The registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia or British North America and the United States is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. Must be prepaid as well as the postage. No registered letters will be forwarded between two Way Offices.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters dropped in the letter box during the night, prepaid by stamps, will be forwarded with the Mails despatched the next morning.

A mail to and from Dartmouth daily, postage 2 cts. If unpaid 4 cts.

PRINTED BOOKS transmitted through the Province, are charged at the rate of one cent per oz. up to 48 ozs., beyond which weight no book can be sent. PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews or Pamphlets, binding rollers for prints or maps not exceeding two feet in length, markers, and every thing appertaining to such publications, are sent between Nova Scotia and the United Kingdom, and also between Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the British West Indies, at the following rates:—for a single volume not exceeding 4 ozs. 3d. sterling; above 4 ozs. and not exceeding 8 ozs. 6d. sterling; above 8 ozs. and not exceeding one pound 1s. sterling; and so on, adding 1s. sterling for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. PERIODICALS passing through any office in the Province, except those published in the Province, and Agricultural Reports, which go free, are liable in addition to any charge prepaid on posting, to an additional charge on delivery, of two cents for each number. If posted within the Province, for delivery within or without the Province, are liable to a charge of two cents each—all to be prepaid by stamp. British and colonial Newspapers, and small religious periodicals, such as the British Workman, Penny Post, Child's paper, Play Hour, Sabbath School Visitor, and others of a like description, whether British or Foreign, pass through the Nova Scotia Post Office, whether posted within or without the Province, free. All other Newspapers are charged one cent each, if mailed within the Province and prepaid by stamp; if mailed without, for delivery within the Province, the postage is collected on delivery. called an exchange copy, of any Newspaper, if addressed to a Newspaper Publisher in Nova Scotia, passes free of Nova Scotia postage.

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars and other printed matter of a like description, posted within the Province and addressed to any place within or without the same, are charged one cent per oz. up to 48 ozs. must be prepaid.

All papers printed by order of either House of the Imperial Parliament, or by her Majesty's command, or by the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of this Province, or by virtue of an address of the Council or Assembly, are transmitted by post, within the Province free.

The word "Newspaper" means any publication issued not less frequently than once a week, and containing notices of passing events—and the word "Periodical" means any publication issued at regular intervals, but less frequently than once a week.

No printed paper, whether Newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other paper, shall be transmitted either free or at a reduced rate of postage, unless it is sent, 1. Without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides or ends. 2. There shall be no words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover of it, except the name and address of the sender, and of the person to whom it is sent. 3. There shall be no paper or thing enclosed in it, or with any such paper or publication, and in any case where these conditions are not fulfilled the whole of every such paper will be charged letter postage, and every such printed paper going out of the Province may either be detained by the Postmaster General, or forwarded charged with letter postage.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying letters within the Province, and any person who shall, except in the cases below excepted, convey or deliver any letter within the Province, will incur a penalty of \$1 for every letter so conveyed, except—1. Letters sent to be mailed in the nearest Post or Way Office. 2 Letters to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel, not being a Packet. 3. Letters sent by a Messenger purposely, on the private affairs of the sender or receiver. 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Office. 5. Letters of Merchants, Ship-owners, or of cargo sent by such vessels, and delivered to the persons to whom addressed without charge or fee for so doing.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels closed at the ends or sides are sent by post in Nova Scotia at the following rates, which must be prepaid by stamp:—If under 8 ounces, 12½ cents; above 8 ozs. but less than a pound, 25 cents; above one pound, and not exceeding two pounds, 50 cents; above 2 pounds, but not exceeding 3 pounds, 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be forwarded, and the size of the parcel not to exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, and six inches in thickness.

All letters, parcels and newspapers, when marked in the foregoing "to be prepaid," must be paid by having stamps of the amount affixed to them. Postage stamps can be obtained at any Post or Way Office, and at the Druggists and Stationers in HALIFAX.

When the Mail arrives from England before 9 p. m. it will be delivered the same night; after that hour at 7 the following morning.

The Postmaster General is not liable to any party for the loss of any letter or packet, sent by Post, unless such loss should have arisen from his own default.

In all questions that may arise, whether a printed paper is entitled to the privileges of a newspaper, or other publication, as regards its transmission by post, the question shall be referred to the Postmaster General, whose decision, with the concurrence of the Governor in Council, shall be final.

Any printed newspaper or other printed paper privileged to go by post, and brought into the province, directed to a person who shall have removed from the place to which it is directed, before the delivery thereof at that place, it may, provided it shall not have opened, be redirected and forwarded by post to such person at any other place within this Province, free of charge for such extra conveyance.

From the time any letter, packet, chattel, money or thing shall be deposited in the Post Office for the purpose of being sent by post, it shall cease to be the property of the sender, and shall be the property of the party to whom it is addressed, or the legal representatives of such party.

If any letter or packet be refused, or if the party to whom it is addressed cannot be found, then such postage, payable thereon, shall be recoverable from the sender of such letter or packet; and all such postages may be recovered with costs by civil action in any court having jurisdiction to the amount.

No person is obliged to send pamphlets, books or newspapers, by Post.



