CHAMPION TARGET SHOT.

**FRED GILBERT WINS THE TITLE,
SCORING 206 OUT OF 300.**

**Fulford, Helkes, Elliott and All the Cracks
Beaten at the Guttenburg Clay Pigeon
Tournament—The Victor Wins a \$500
Trophy by His Fowls.**

New York, May 8.—Fred Gilbert of Spirit Lake, Ia., won the title of champion target shot of America at the clay pigeon championship tournament, which concluded this afternoon at Guttenburg Park, N.J. Gilbert broke 298 out of a possible 300 flying targets, defeating E. D. Fulford of Utica and J. A. H. Elliott of Kansas City, who tied for second place with 261 breaks each. Helko Helkes of Dayton, O., who was considered invulnerable, finished fourth, with a total of 235 breaks.

As was anticipated, the final struggle was very close. With two shots to decide the winner, the score read: Fulford 223, Elliott 227, Helkes 225 and Helkes 224. The Kansas City man had the worst of the luck in the semi-final grand, and only scored 18 out of a possible 25. Gilbert broke 22, Helkes 21 and Fulford 20. The score was then: Gilbert 249, Fulford 243, Helkes 245 and Elliott 243.

TRIALS OF THE HORSES.

**Very Little Fast Going at Woodbine—Mr
Seagram Watches the Work.**

It was somewhat of an odd day at Woodbine Park yesterday, and very little fast work was indulged in. The weather was perfect, and the track in capital order, while a large number of turtles were on hand. 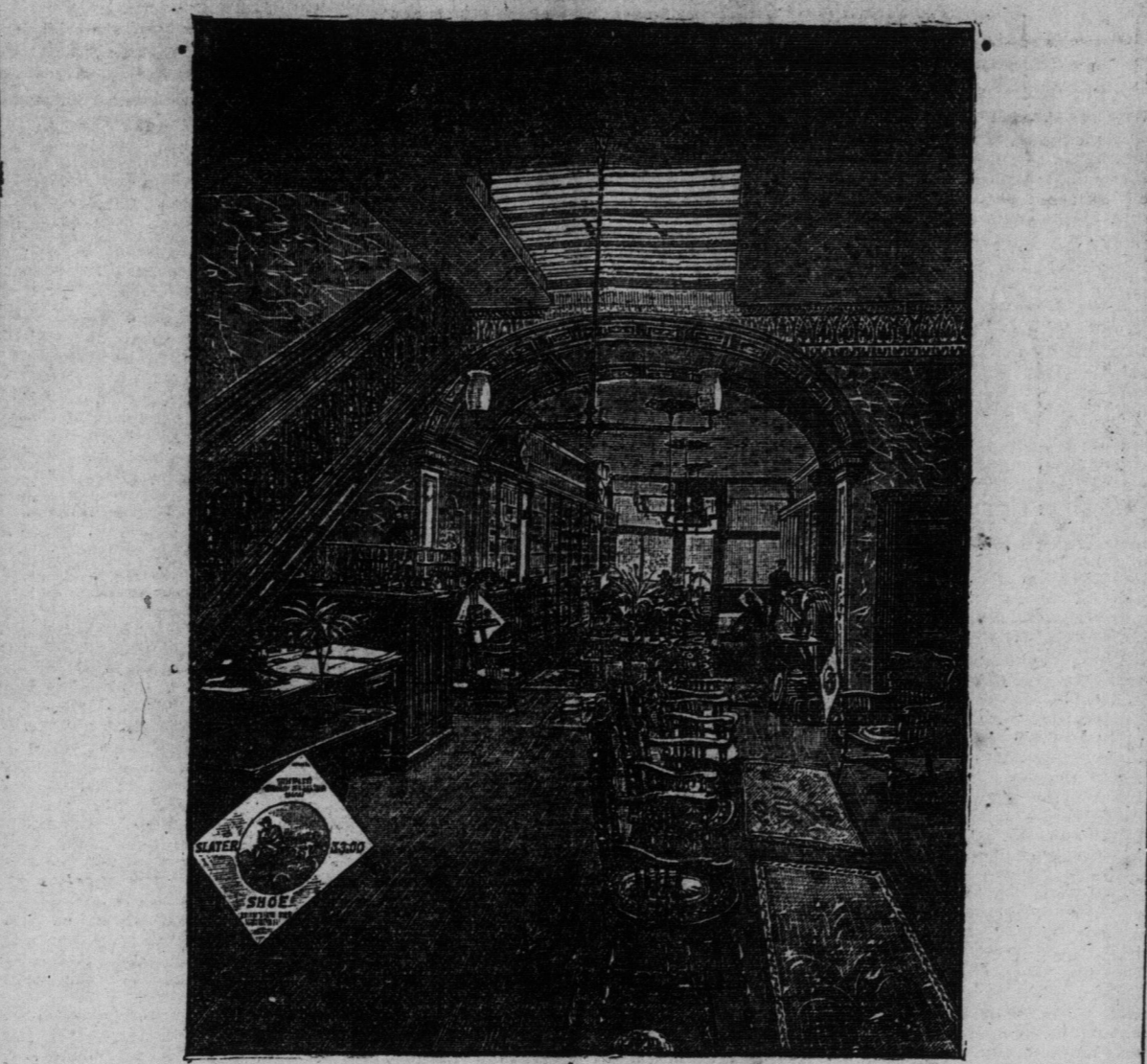

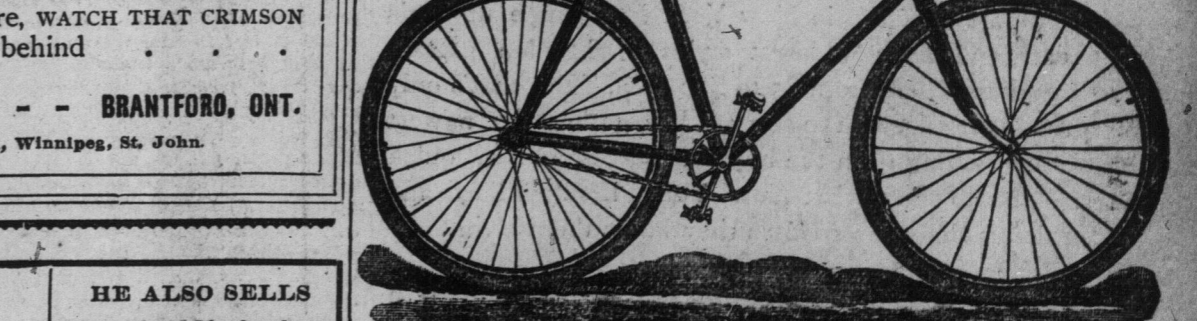
