Further Light on How the Charm Works—Money Manager Appears—The Beverly-Street Show—No Pay, No Cure.

President McKinley, M. Cambon and Secretary Day Had an Amicable Conference—One Concession to Spain.

Washington, D.C., July 30.—Events of the momentous character occurred at the conference at the White House this afternoon between the President, Ambassador Cambon of France and Secretary Day, carrying the peace negotiations far beyond the mere submission of terms of peace by the United States, and reaching the point of a preliminary basis of peace between the Government of Spain and the Government of the United States, leading only to the ratification of the Madrid Cabinet of what was done to-day to bring the war to an end.

What is the Modification? What the modification is that has been agreed on can be only conjectured, but there is reason to believe that it relates either to the time when actual hostilities should be suspended, or else to the extent of the American interest in the Philippines, the independence of Cuba, the cessation of the war with the Philippines, the granting of adequate consular rights to the United States in the Pacific, or to diminish in any vital particular the terms on which peace will be restored.

August Will Surrender. Can Get No Help From Spain and Realize That He Has to Fight Only Cause Slingshot. Manila, July 28, via Hong Kong, July 31. (Special.)—A special to The Journal says General August, having been informed by the Madrid Government that no help can be sent him from Spain, realizes that the situation is now hopeless.

GOSCEEN'S AMAZING NAVY SPEECH

Practically Commits the Country to War With Russia—Nothing Else Understood by His Words.

New York, July 31.—In his cable letter to The Times, Harold Frederic says (and he is right) that Mr. Baifour has announced that the Government contemplates no discussion of the Chinese policy, or absence of policy, during the remainder of the session, it seems unlikely that Parliament will consent to break up without some clearer understanding on this most vital of points.

MAKE PERIODICAL RAIDS. Spaniards in the Island of Cebu Are Preparing Defences. Hong Kong, July 31.—The British steamer Yung Sang has arrived at Cebu, Philippines, on July 23, and Cebu, capital of the island of that name, on July 23. She reports that the Spaniards are preparing defences consisting of trenches and bamboo obstacles.

MERRITT ARRIVES AT MANILA. Assumes Command of U.S. Forces—Transports Expected Shortly. Manila, July 26, via Hong Kong.—General Merritt assumed command of the American forces in Manila when the American transport Admiral Dewey has established headquarters at the Cavite arsenal.

DESIRE TO RESIST. To the Last—Prospects Are That Peace Will Be Reached Prior to Manila's Capture.
