THE ORPHANS' HOME.

THE THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL MEETING.

The thirty-first annual meeting of the Orphans' Home was held in the institution last night, the Bishop of Niagara in the chair.

There was a very large attendance of ladies and gentlemen, amongst them being Mesdames VanKoughnet, McMurray, McMurrich, MacNab, Cowan, Beardmore, Rutherford, McKean, Lett, Cayley, Lockhart, Cartwright, Miss Morrison, Revs. J. D. Cayley, Septimus Jones, J. P. Lewis, R. A. Bilkey, Messrs. J. S. McMurray, Huson W. M. Murray, Kivas Tully, Andrew Fleming, R. Spratt, and Dr. Lett.

The children were seated in raised benches on the platform, the boys to the right and the girls to the left of the chairman, and it was a pleasure to all to look upon their bright rosy faces and clean tidy appearance. During the proceedings they sang three times very evenly and sweetly.

The meeting was opened by prayer offered by the Rev Mr. Cayley, after which the chairman made a few remarks, speaking of the great pleasure it gave him to be present at what would likely be the last annual meeting in the old Protestant Home. He was glad to find that the managers were to erect a larger building, and that they had secured a suitable site on the confines of the city.

ANNUAL REPORT.

In the absence of Alderman Boswell the Rev. Mr. Cayley read the thirty-first annual report, which, after speaking of the gratifying measure of success and prosperity since the last annual meeting, stated that within the year 50 children had been admitted to the Home, 28 boys and 22 girls; 33 removed by relatives, and 4 apprenticed, 3 adopted, and 2 removed by death. The average number for the year had been 104, and the present number 107.

As in previous years, many of the boys and girls who had left the shelter of the Home were succeeding well, and very satisfactory reports of their conduct had been received from time to time.

The building fund, the nucleus of which was formed last year, had been materially increased by the exertions of some of the managers and many kind friends of the institution, who interested themselves in the calico and fancy ball held in the Pavilion on 13th Arpil last.

The net proceeds of the ball amounted to \$650, an increase of \$116

upon that of last year. the success which attended their efforts in that way, and the favour with which they were received, as evidenced by the city press, had encouraged the managers and ladies and gentlemen to make this species of entertainment an annual affair.

Owing to the increasing number of applicants, and the insufficiency of room in the present building, the board of management felt the urgent necessity of taking some decided action towards meeting the demands which that drawback entailed. After due inquiry, and careful inspection of a number of available lots for the purpose, they finally succeeded in securing a suitable site on Dovercourt road for the new Home. Plans and specifications had been prepared; according to these, the building, when completed, would cost \$35,000, and will accommodate 125 inmates. Under these circumstances the managers felt justified in making a strong appeal to the generous public for assistance in the arduous task of providing so large a sum.

The matron was complimented for her unwearying care and attention in her general oversight of affairs, and Mrs. Riches for the kind and

judicious management of the school-room.

Regret was expressed at the death of Mrs. T. G. Ridout, one of the Home's oldest and staunchest friends, and also at the resignation of Mrs. Crombie, Mrs. Godson, and Mrs. Baker from the board of management.

Thanks were tendered to the proprietors of the different ferry-boats for the delightful and health-giving trips to the Island and parks; to the victuallers, bakers, grocers, etc., for their donations; to the many private friends of the Home for their liberality; to Mr. Huson Murray, for many services rendered as solicitor; to Drs. Ogden and Macdonald, for medical aid; and to the friends who assist every Sunday in the religious instruction of the children.

The report concluded with an appeal for active sympathy and aid, in

view of the additional burthens upon the management.

The Treasurer's report was then read, which showed that the receipts, including a balance of \$382.92 brought from last year, amounted to \$6,898.96; and the expenditure, including freehold loan of \$720 handed Mr. Murray on account of purchase of lot for new Home, and \$835.90 deposited in Loan and Savings Company, to \$6,020.72, leaving a balance in the bank of \$878.24.

The Rev. Mr. CAYLEY moved that the reports be adopted, which was seconded by the Rev. Mr. BILKEY, and carried unanimously.

VOTES OF THANKS.

It was moved by Mr. Andrew Fleming, seconded by the Rev. Dr. McCarroll, that the thanks of the meeting be tendered to the lady managers and office-bearers for their management of the Home during the past year. Carried unanimously.

Mr. F. Arnoldi then moved, seconded by Dr. Lett, that the thanks of the meeting are due to the Orangemen of Ontario for their liberal contributions to the funds of the Home. Carried unanimously.

FINANCE AND BUILDING COMMITTEE.

The Rev. Mr. Jones moved, seconded by Mr. Spratt, that the Mayor of Toronto, J. S. McMurray, Kivas Tully, Major Bennett, Mrs. McMurray, Mrs. MacNab, Mrs. Cowan, and Mrs. Hoskins be a Finance and Building Committee for the new building. Carried unanimously.

Mr. MURRAY then moved a vote of thanks to the Chairman, which was seconded by Rev. Mr. CAYLEY and carried.

THE CHAIRMAN briefly replied, and hoped that the suggestion thrown out by Rev. Mr. Lewis that all those who had been inmates of the institution should be asked to attend the next meeting and state their experiences would be voted upon.

The benediction was pronounced and the meeting adjourned.

ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting their Thirty-first Annual Report, the Lady Managers of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society return thanks to God for the bountiful blessings vouchsafed to the inmates of the Institution during the past year: and especially for the singularly good health enjoyed by them throughout that period.

Though nothing of unusual interest has occurred in the "Home" since the last Annual Meeting, a gratifying measure of success and prosperity has attended all efforts which have been made on its behalf.

Within the year ending this day 50 children have been admitted—28 boys and 22 girls; 33 removed by relations; 7 apprenticed; 3 adopted, and 2 removed by death. The average number for the year has been 104; the present number is 107.

As in previous years, many of the boys and girls who have left the shelter of the "Home" are succeeding well; and very satisfactory reports of their conduct have been received from time to time.

The Building Fund, the nucleus of which was formed last year, has been materially increased by the exertions of some of the Managers and many kind friends of the Institution, who interested themselves in the Calico and Fancy Ball, held in the Pavilion on the 13th of April last. The net proceeds of the Ball amounted to \$650, an increase of \$116 over that of last year. The success which attended their efforts in this way, and the favor with which they were received, as evidenced by the notices of the city press, has encouraged the Managers and ladies and gentlemen to make this species of entertainment an annual affair. The Committee has to thank the public generally for their hearty and liberal response to the appeals made to them for the supper table upon that occasion.

Owing to the increasing number of applicants and the insufficiency of room in the present building, the Board of Management felt the urgent necessity of taking some decided action towards meeting the demands which this drawback entailed. After due enquiry and careful inspection of a number of available lots for

the purpose, they finally succeeded in securing a suitable site on Dover Court Road for the new "Home." The plans and specifications have been prepared, and according to these the building, when completed, will cost \$35,000, and will accommodate 125 inmates. Under these circumstances the Managers feel justified in making a strong appeal to the generous public for assistance in the arduous task of providing so large a sum.

As in previous years, the Committee have much pleasure in bearing testimony to the unwearying care and attention shown by the Matron in her general oversight of affairs, and also the kind and judicious management of Mrs. Riches in the school-room.

It is with much regret the Managers have to record the death of Mrs. T. G. Ridout, in whom the "Home" has lost one of its oldest and staunchest friends. Compelled by failing health to withdraw her name from the Board of Management, she nevertheless continued until the close of her life to take a warm interest in everything connected with its welfare.

No less deeply have the Managers to express their regret at the resignation of three of their former associates—Mrs. Crombie, Mrs. Godson, and Mrs. Baker, who during a long period rendered efficient and valuable service in their discharge of official duty.

Two noteworthy events of the year were the Christmas visit of Mrs. Robinson, wife of the Lieutenant-Governor, and the visit of His Worship the Mayor. Mrs. Robinson gave each of the children a small present and otherwise evidenced her kindly feelings towards all of them. In his annual tour of inspection of the city charities, the Mayor called at the "Home," and complimented the Managers on the neat, cleanly, and comfortable appearance of everything within its precincts, and the perfect order and system which prevailed throughout.

As in former summer seasons, the little ones have had many opportunities of enjoyment afforded them during the past year, and thanks are due to the proprietors of the several ferry-boats for delightful and health-giving trips to the island and to the various parks to which access is had by water.

Nor have the usual thoughtful contributions to the comforts of the children been omitted. Donations have been gratefully received from the victuallers, bakers, grocers, &c., of the city, who, remembering that "it is more blessed to give than to receive," have assisted in supplying the necessities of the orphans. This,

with continued liberality from many friends of the "Home," is most gratefully acknowledged; and to all who have been associated with them in this labor of love the Committee tender their sincere thanks.

The Board takes this opportunity also of thanking Mr. Huson Murray, its solicitor, for the many services rendered by him to the "Home;" Drs. Ogden and Macdonald, for their generous consideration of those requiring medical aid, and the kind friends who every Sunday assist in the religious instruction of the children.

In conclusion, the Managers would call attention to the Treasurer's Report, containing a full and satisfactory account of the financial affairs of the Institution. As a whole, the record of the past year's operations of this charity shows, if anything, increased and wider beneficence, and responsibilities for the future very much greater: but the Managers earnestly hope that, in taking these additional burthens upon themselves, they will be strengthened by the active sympathy and warm, helpful liberality of the charitable public of Toronto.
