On the Choice of Spectacles.

Spectacles are usually manufactured of an oval form and small size to render them more elegant, but, as regards their utility, it is infinitely preferable that they should be large and round, covering not only the globe of the eye, but also a part of its vicinity.

Something similar is true of lenses, when they are oval and too small; refraction takes place only for objects placed in front of the eye, whilst those placed above, below, or laterally, present their natural image.

One of the Emperors of China having noticed that a particular stalk in his garden produced better fruit than the rest, cultivated it for several years; and then, having fully satisfied himself of its superiority, he distributed its grains among them for their general benefit.

A Sussan farmer having remarked that some gooseberry bushes, growing under an elder tree, were exempt from the attacks of caterpillars, was induced to try the efficacy of a decoction of elder leaves in destroying the grubs that infested his turnip crops, and he and other farmers who tried the experiment found it successful.

The late severe frost has caused particular attention to be paid to these useful and simple instruments; yet many persons are quite ignorant of the principles on which they are constructed. The word means literally, "measure of heat."

His plan was improved upon by Fahrenheit, a German philosopher, who lived about the year 1720, and he was the inventor of the thermometer now used in this country and England.

French thermometers are differently marked, but equally wrong, as the freezing point is placed at the temperature of mingled snow and salt, or zero, when in reality water freezes at a much higher temperature.

At 40 deg. below zero, mercury becomes solid; consequently, to mark the degrees of cold sometimes experienced in Russia and in the Arctic regions, spirits of wine is used, which has never been known to freeze from natural causes, although it is said that the Scotch chemist once succeeded in producing such an extreme degree of cold as to freeze even alcohol.

What is Manure?
