Theodore H. Ayer, formerly a mem-

ber of the above firm, testified that How-

ard frequently bought Havemeyer

Mould A sugar from him, and in every

case the refined gentleman requester

the grocer to have the manufacturers

name scratched off the barrel.

Arthur Friedman, a truckman, told

Howard had engaged him on sev-

eral occasions to bring empty cases from

the factory in the city, and that he

never saw any of the sugar in the

store on East Sixty-fourth street, and

that he had seen the sugar in the

factory when they had been

unaccompanied.

The local republican manager promised

him his services would be recognized, and

for three months he has been "look-

ing for an appointment. When Cronin's

body was found and later developments

pointed so strongly to a Clan-na-Gael
