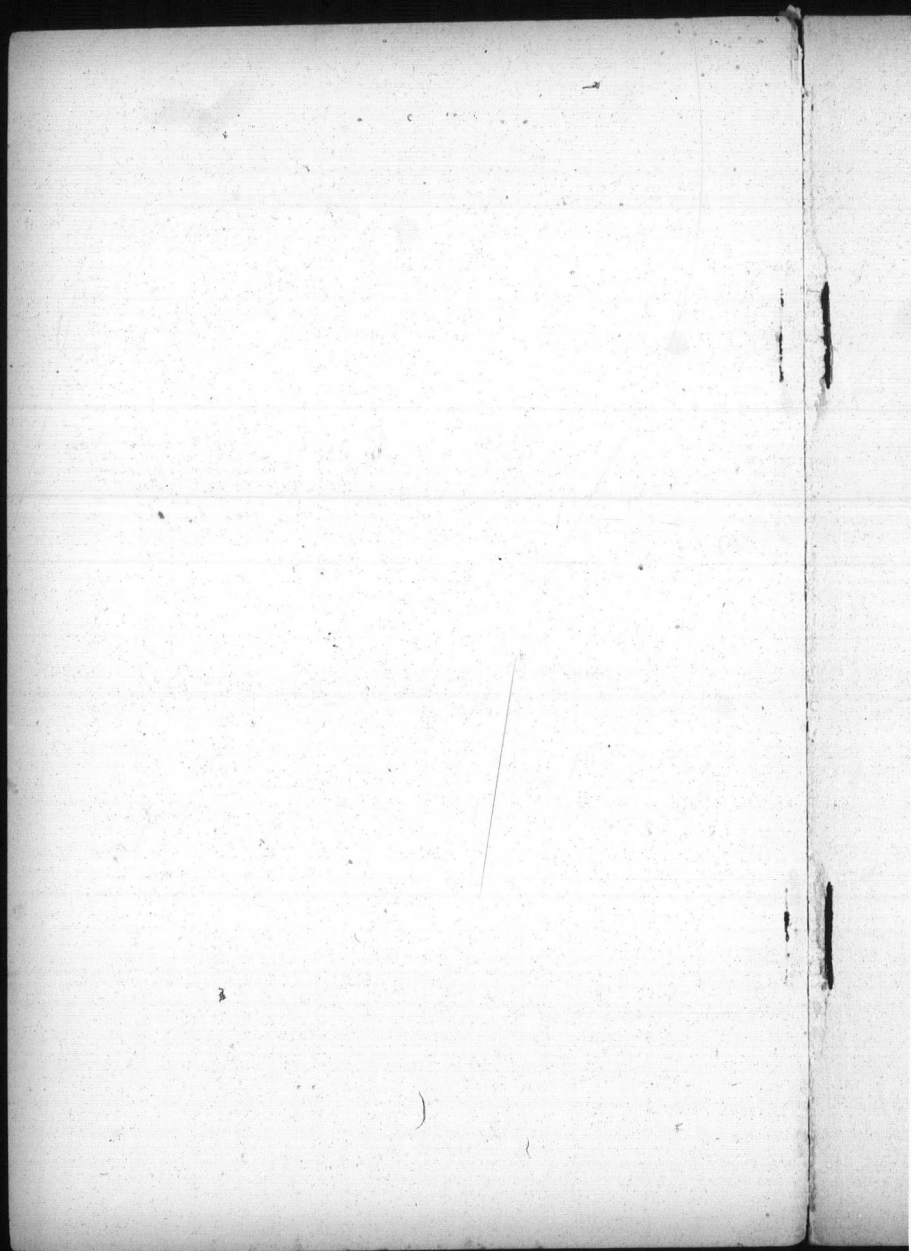

Stated Meetings of Managers are held in their room on the second Tuesday of every month, at 8 p.m., and a committee meets in the Church on the same evening, at 7.30, for the purpose of allocating pews.

A Joint Meeting of the Session and Managers is held at the first regular meeting after each Communion.

Auxiliary to the Women's Foreign Missionary Society meets on the second Tuesday of each month, at 8 o'clock p.m.

Weekly Prayer Meeting every Wednesday at 8 p.m. Mission Prayer Meeting in the Mission School every Thursday evening, at 8 o'clock.

The Regular Business Meetings of the Sabbath School Association are held on the last Thursday of every month.

The Ordinance of Baptism is dispensed on the first Sabbath of every month, at the commencement of the morning service, and on the first Wednesday of every month, at the commencement of the Prayer Meeting.

The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper is dispensed on the first Sabbath of March, June, September and December.

A Preparatory Service on the Friday immediately preceding each of the said Sabbaths, at 8 p.m.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation is held on the third Wednesday of January.

When members change their residence, they should give notice either to the Pastor or the Elder of the district, otherwise they cannot reasonably expect to be visited or have their communion cards delivered.

REVENUE.

THE whole revenue of this congregation is derived from weekly contributions by envelope and the plate collections.

All subscribers by envelope are supplied with envelopes on the first Sunday in each quarter.

Members and adherents who are not subscribers may be supplied with envelopes on application to any of the managers.

All subscribers are expected to contribute a fixed sum weekly, and if, from any cause, they are unable to do so, they shall be expected to make up all deficiencies at their earliest convenience.

Subscribers in arrears are notified of the same on the second Sunday of each month.

Subscribers wishing to increase or decrease their contributions are requested to notify the managers, so that a corresponding alteration may be made in the books.

Subscribers are particularly requested to see that their envelopes are properly sealed and their names and pew number on the outside before they are handed in.

MISSION COLLECTIONS.

Collections for the Mission schemes of the Church are received by envelope on the last Sunday of each month, and are placed in the boxes which will be found on entering the church, just inside the doors.

If not convenient to give on the last of the month, any other time will do.

Those wishing to subscribe by envelope, and who are not at present supplied, can secure envelopes by applying to any of the members of the committee, or to Mr. Warren, church officer.

It is expected that, as far as possible, subscribers will give a definite sum every month, and if subscribers fall in arrears they will be notified of the same as often as the committee think it best.

The meeting was opened by a short devotional service, after which Mr. A. McPherson was appointed chairman, and Mr. J. A. Moffatt, secretary.

Moved by Mr. John Wright, seconded by Mr. W. J. McFadden, That the minutes as printed in Year Book, be taken as read. An omission was pointed out by Mr. Jas. Ogilvie—namely, a vote of thanks to the choir. With this addition, the minutes were declared confirmed.

The report of the Session was read by Dr. Fraser, when it was moved by Mr. John Wright, seconded by Mr. W. J. Cunningham, That the report be received and printed in the Year Book.—Carried.

The Managers' report was submitted by Mr. John Wright, the chairman, who moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. John Scott.—Carried.

Mr. H. S. Wallace, the Treasurer, submitted the Treasurer's statement, and moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Wright.—Carried.

Messrs. W. H. McLaren, James Dixon, John Gillespie, James A. Cox and Thomas Hopper, were nominated as Managers—three to be elected for the term of three years, and one for two years, in place of Mr. James Kilgour, who has retired from the Board.

The Chairman appointed the following as scrutineers : Messrs. Jas. Ogilvie, W. J. McFadden, and Robt. Booth.

Moved by Mr. H. S. Wallace, seconded by Mr. John Robertson, That the following persons be a committee of ushers for 1897: Messrs. G. S. McConnell, James J. McQuarrie, Wm. Robertson, Henry Campbell, D. J. M. McLeod, Jas. W. Stevenson, Thos. Hendry, D. R. McPherson, Hugh Hawthorne, C. Whitmore, Thomas M. Wright and Jas. A. Smith.—Carried.

The report of the Missionary Society was read by Mr. D. A. Rowland, who moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Daniel Jack.—Carried.

The Treasurer's statement was read by Mr. W. J. Cunningham, who moved its adoption, seconded by Miss R. A. Baine.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. D. McLeod, seconded by Mr. John McDougall, That the following persons be the Missionary Committee for 1897: Messrs. R. McRae, D. A. Rowland, J. A. Moffat, W. J. Cunningham, Jas. Johnston, Robt. Booth, John McKenna, J. C. Campell, Mrs. Cunningham, Miss R. A. Baine, Miss K. McKenzie, Miss M. McMenemy and Miss Helen Fraser.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. D. McLeod, seconded by Mr. John Wright, That the reports of the following organizations be taken as read, and printed in the year book: Knox Church Sunday School, Mission Sunday School, Senior Y. P. S. C. E., Junior Y. P. S. C. E., Auxiliary to the W. F. M. S.—Carried.

The Scrutineers here reported that Messrs. Jas. Dixon, W. H. McLaren and Jas. A. Cox had been elected managers for three years, and Mr. John Gillespie for two years.

In reference to carrying on the work of the North End Mission, Dr. Fraser reported that the Session recommended that some arrangements be made with the Hamilton Presbytery to work the field in connection with some other station. It was moved by Mr. H. S. Wallace, seconded by Mr. John Wright, That the Sunday School be retained and the Sunday evening and Thursday evening services be discontinued. This motion was lost.

Moved by Mr. J. C. Campbell, seconded by Mr. John McKenna, That Messrs. Samuel Groves, J. W. Stevenson, D. A. Rowland, with two members of Session and Managers respectively, be a committee to secure supply for Mission.

Moved in amendment by Mr. Colin Arthur, seconded by Mr. W. J. Stevenson, That a student be engaged to carry on the work all through the year. The amendment was declared carried.

Moved by Mr. Jas. Dixon, seconded by Mr. Jas. Ogilvie, That the matter of engaging a student for the Mission and fixing his salary be left with the Session and Managers.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Jas. Dixon, seconded by Mr. H. S. Wallace, That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered Miss M. Laird and Miss Annie Munro for their services as precentor and organist in the Mission.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Jas. Ogilvie, seconded by Mr. Colin Arthur, That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered the Managers for their labors during the past year.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. John Wright, seconded by Mr. Jas. Dixon, That a special vote of thanks be given the retiring Managers, Messrs. Kilgour and Wallace.—Carried.

There being no further business, the meeting closed by singing the long meter doxology and Dr. Fraser pronouncing the benediction.

FIFTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Managing Committee of Knox Church

For the Year ending Dec. 31st, 1896.

Your Committee in presenting their annual report would thank our Heavenly Father for any success that may have attended their labors during the past year.

We have to report a deficit from a financial point ; the envelope collection falls short of last year by \$313.93 ; the loose collection falls short for the same period \$103.58 ; or a shortage on ordinary collections from last year of \$417.51.

The following are the figures as taken from the Treasurer's statement for the year :

Compared with 1895 :

Envelope.....	\$5,333 52
Loose.....	765 60

The number of subscribers by envelope for 1896 were 522, against 480 for the previous year. The average giving per Sunday for 1896 was \$95.60, while that of 1895 was \$102.57. The loose, 1896, per Sunday, \$12.73, while that of 1895 was \$14.72. The arrears at the end of the year were about \$300.

Your Committee, acting upon instructions received at the last congregational meeting, proceeded early in the year to get plans from Charles Mills for the most suitable roof for the church. After these plans were carefully criticized, tenders were asked for, and the whole work was awarded to Donaldson & Patterson, theirs being the lowest tender.

Your Committee have put on swing doors in the vestibule of the church, which we hope will make an improvement during the winter months.

Your Committee express the hope that their work will meet with the approval of the congregation ; the raising of the pitch of the roof, we think, has been justified, and will preserve the property.

Your Committee would recommend two special collections taken up this year for the reduction of the mortgage on the Sunday-school property, one to be taken up on the second Sunday of May, the other to be taken on the second Sunday of October.

The managers who retire by rotation this year are Messrs W. H. McLaren, James Dixon and H. S. Wallace. Mr. Kilgour having sent in his resignation at our last meeting, it will be necessary for the congregation to elect a fourth manager to serve out his term.

In conclusion, your Committee ask the blessing of God to rest on their labors, so that pastor and people may be benefitted and God glorified.

The percentage of attendance of the classes which have won the prize banner is also higher during the past year, and is as follows :

1st quarter, Mr. O. Penny's class,	97 per cent.
2nd " Miss A. Nichol's "	98 "
3rd " " L. Bennet's "	79 "
4th " " A. Campbell's "	91 "

The Treasurer's report shows that the funds of the school are in a very healthy condition, the three principal items being for General purposes, \$268.64 ; for Missionary purposes, \$243.22 ; for Building Fund, \$145.74, a total of \$657.60, and an average per Sunday of \$12.65.

We are pleased to report that we have been able to pay to the Managers the sum of \$250.00 toward the mortgage debt on the school, for which we have received their sincere thanks.

There are at present about 1,000 volumes in the library, and we expect to make some additions during the coming year. A large portion of the classes were so well pleased with the "Home Study Leaflet" that we have decided to continue it, with the addition of the full year lesson scheme.

It gives us pleasure to record the fact that during the year thirty-two of our scholars have united with the Church by profession of their faith in Christ, and we take this as an evidence that our labors have not been in vain.

Flower Sunday, Rally Day and the Quarterly services, we believe were occasions of great profit, as was evinced by the large attendance, good order and hearty response in the exercises.

At the beginning of the year we decided to give prizes to all scholars who would answer from memory all the questions in the Shorter Catechism. The following six passed the examination and deserve great credit :

We make special mention of Miss Annie Gillespie, who, during a sickness of nearly four years, exhibited great patience, and at last passed away rejoicing in Christ as her Saviour.

In conclusion, let us buckle on the armour for another year's effort, determining that we will be more in earnest, that as teachers we will devote more time to the study of the lesson, and that our prayers will rise continually on behalf of our scholars.

CONSTITUTION

... OF ...

Knox Church, Hamilton.



1st.—The Church, Manse, Burying Ground, and any other houses or real estate now belonging to or which may hereafter become the property of the congregation, shall be held in trust by three members of the said congregation, in full communion, in accordance with a Deed of Trust—bearing date the sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

2nd.—The members in full communion with the congregation shall have the sole power of choosing a Minister or Pastor and Elders of said congregation.

3rd.—The election of a Minister or Pastor shall take place at a meeting of the members of the congregation, which shall have been called from the pulpit of the Church by the officiating minister on each of the two Sabbaths preceding such meeting. The majority of members present shall determine the election.

4th.—The method of the election of the Elders shall be determined from time to time by the Session, as occasion may require, but the election shall be by the members of the congregation, and notice of meeting for such election shall be given as provided in clause third.

5th.—The constitutional duty of the Session to superintend the spiritual affairs and watch over all the interests of the congregation is recognized and reserved to them.

6th.—Nine Managers shall be elected to take charge of the secular affairs of the congregation, three of whom shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election. In case of a vacancy occurring by resignation or otherwise, the Managers themselves shall fill the vacancy at their earliest convenience; and a Manager absenting himself from three successive regular meetings, without leave shall cease to be a Manager.

7th.—The Managers shall select their own Chairman, Treasurer, and Secretary, hold regular meetings as often as their business may require, and may give notice of their meetings either from the pulpit on Sabbaths or by the Secretary to each Manager, when demanded by any three of them. Five Managers shall constitute a quorum. When the Managers shall themselves deem it necessary, or when requested to do so by seven or more members of the congregation in

full standing, they shall with concurrence of the Session call a special meeting of the congregation, stating the object in the notice thereof; and no business shall be entertained at any special meeting excepting what is mentioned in the notice thereof. Should any Manager cease to be a member of the congregation he shall cease to be a Manager. The Treasurer shall open an account with some regular chartered bank in the city, and deposit in his own name, as Treasurer of the Managing Committee, moneys from time to time as may be convenient.

8th.—The use of the Church property for public and general purposes not connected with the congregation shall be under the control of the Managers, with the concurrence of the Minister.

9th.—The whole revenues of the congregation from all sources shall be received and disbursed by the Managers in payment of stipend, salaries, and other expenses, including such as may be required for preserving the property and providing for the dispensation of Divine ordinances; but no repairs, improvements or alterations exceeding the sum of one hundred dollars shall be gone into without the consent of the congregation. The "Poor Fund," however, shall be distributed by the Session, and contributions for missionary and benevolent purposes shall be distributed by the Association appointed for these special purposes.

10th.—The members of the congregation shall choose their Organist and Precentor, and fix their salaries, and in the discharge of their duties they shall be under the control of the Session.

11th.—The Managers shall have power to engage or dismiss and regulate salary of any one who may act as Church Officer or Door Keeper; and appoint or pay such person or persons as may be required to keep the Church clean and comfortable.

12th.—The Managers shall be accountable to the congregation for their acts, and shall, at each annual meeting in January, submit a full printed, audited, articulate statement of the income and expenditure of the preceding year—copies of which shall be distributed in the pews on the Sabbath before the annual meeting; and said Managers shall be regulated as to the proportion of revenue to be applied to any particular purpose by the instructions they may receive from the congregation at any special or annual meeting.

13th.—A committee, consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Managing Committee, two members of the Session, the Secretary of the Sabbath School, and Secretaries of all the organizations in connection with the congregation, shall annually arrange for the printing—in pamphlet form—of the reports of all the different organizations in connection with the Congregation, together with the list of office-bearers, members and adherents, with their residences; said pamphlet to be distributed to the congregation as early as possible after the annual business meeting, and not later than March 1st. The chairman of the Managers shall be chairman of the said committee.

14th.—The Managers or Trustees shall have no power to contract debt on property without the consent of the congregation.

15th.—At each annual meeting the Congregation shall elect three Trustees and two Auditors to serve for one year.

16th.—The foregoing rules shall be in force until altered or amended, and no motion to alter or amend said rules shall be put unless due notice of such motion has been given at the annual meeting of the congregation, and when notice of motion shall have been made, a special meeting of the congregation shall be called to consider the same, not sooner than two weeks, nor later than two months after said annual meeting.

17th.—In the foregoing rules no one shall be held to be a member of the congregation who is not in full communion with the same, and whose name does not appear on the Communion Roll of the said congregation, and no others than members in full communion shall be allowed to vote at any congregational meeting.
