### Great Exhibition in London in 1862.

THE Provincial Government having decided  
that New Brunswick should be properly  
represented at the Great Exhibition in  
London in 1862, and having authorized the Provin-  
cial Board of Agriculture to receive, select,  
and prepare such articles as will best accom-  
plish such object, the Board invite the co-oper-  
ation of all persons disposed to become "private  
exhibitors," and will take charge of any ar-  
ticles coming within the following conditions  
required by Her Majesty's Commissioners in  
charge of the London Exhibition, viz: every  
article produced or obtained by human industry  
whether of raw materials, machinery, manufac-  
tures, or the arts, will be admitted to the Ex-  
hibition with the exception of—  
1st. Living Animals and Plants.  
2d. Fresh Vegetables and Animal substances  
liable to spoil by keeping.  
3d. Detracting or dangerous substances.  
Spices, or Alcohols, Oils, Acids, Corrosive  
Salts, and substances of a highly inflammable  
nature will not be admitted, unless sent in well  
secured vessels.  
All articles must be sent to George McLeod,  
Custom House, the Agent at St. John, for the  
Board to receive them, on or before the 15th  
January next, preparatory to being transmitted  
to London by the Provincial Government.
