"China" off Cape Race.

CAPE RACE, 3d July, 1865. China passed here at 8 Sunday morning.

FROM THE STATES.

Boston, July 1.

The Mayor of Washington has received from the State Department a circular on the Russian Plague, which our Consulate at St. Petersburg writes is spreading rapidly westward.

From Cairo it is reported that the negroes of Vieksburg protest against the appointment of Judge Sharkey as Provisional Governor of Mississippi.

Gen. Sheridan had gone to Texas. Guerrillas are said to infest the lower Mississippi country.

Gen. Canby had sent troops to attend to the Lee. Lee has gone to a country seat in Cumberland, Va., to spend the summer months.

Henry A. Wise arrived at Norfolk on Wednesday afternoon, intending to stay a few days.

The steamship America, from Southampton, left 21st ult., arrived.

In the House of Commons Mr. Carlisle placed on the table papers relating to Canada, and giving the result of negotiations between the Government and the Canadian delegates.

The Government approves of the Confederation Scheme, and will give it every assistance; will recommend the guarantee of a loan for the carrying out by Canada of the fortifications recommended, and will provide the necessary armament.

The 89th Anniversary of Independence is being celebrated to-day with unusual enthusiasm—all business is suspended and everybody jubilant.

President Johnson's health is such as to prevent his attending the Monument dedication at Gettysburg to-day.

Advices from Wilmington, N. C., bring alarming reports of the sickly condition of that city. Both spotted and yellow fever are said to be prevalent.

A large delegation from Richmond has arrived at Washington to urge the revocation of the twenty thousand dollar clause in the President's proclamation of amnesty.

GREAT RIOT NEAR NEW YORK.—Fifty to Sixty Persons Wounded.—Tuesday last was set apart by the firemen of Astoria, Jamaica, Fishing, and College Point for a trial of fire apparatus at a grand display.

The splendid steamer New York commenced her trips between Boston and St. John on Monday and is now owned by the International Steamboat Company.

TONNAGE.—On the 31st of last December, there were registered in the Port of St. Andrews, 245 vessels, measuring 26,000 tons.

The Baptist Pic-Nic and Fair held this day promises to be well patronized. A large number of visitors from up-river, arrived by the Steamer Queen, which left soon afterwards for St. George to bring over excursionists.

The 4th of July, (yesterday) was observed by our neighbors over the Lines with the usual demonstrations. They went through a fiery ordeal for four years, and have wiped out the foul stain of Slavery from their National consciousness.

The weather for the past week has been all that could be desired by the farmers—alternate sunshine and showers; and the crops here, as elsewhere, promise an abundant yield.

The letter of a "Volunteer," is better calculated for the eyes of the Commander in Chief and Adjutant General, than for a newspaper. The statement of "facts" will not militate against the Battalion; their loyalty or obedience will not be questioned when the whole matter is properly explained at Headquarters.

—The Carleton Sentinel says that the Woodstock Branch Railway Company have ordered the issue of a prospectus for procuring stock and proceeding with the line from the Iron Works to the St. Andrews Railway at Bel River.

—The Islander says that by the last mail his Excellency the Lieut. Governor of Prince Edward Island received a despatch from Mr. Secretary Cardwell, granting him three months leave of absence to proceed to England.

—A telegram to the Journal from Fredericton informs us that the University Extension Society, which was organized in 1852, has just received a grant of £1,000 from the Government.

—The Atlantic Mail Steamship Company, organized only one year ago to run steamers to California, has just declared its first annual dividend of 25 per cent. on the entire capital of \$4,000,000, equal to 50 per cent on the amount of capital paid in, or one million of dollars net profit on the business of the year.
