In the course of a funeral service in the Memorial Church yesterday morning a dog wandered into the building, and after the audience departed gave indications of being mad. P. C. Tooley was notified and put several pistol balls into the cur and dispatched it. A Queen's avenue lady, hearing the yelp of the dog, threw a bottle of chloroform to ease its sufferings.

The Supreme Court at Ottawa yesterday heard a part of the argument in the celebrated insurance case of the Attorney General of Ontario vs. the Atna Insurance Company. This case is the one in which the 26 companies insuring the Ontario public buildings refused to pay a loss on the London Asylum because it occurred in a wing and not in the main building, as the companies contend. The Government contends that the policies covered the wing, as much as anything else. The courts in Toronto decided twice against the companies, and now they appeal at Ottawa.

An Accident. A young son of Mr. H. A. Stringer was run over at the corner of Richmond and King streets about 5 o'clock last evening by a gravel wagon. The little fellow was crossing the street when he was struck by the horses, one wheel of the heavy wagon passing over his neck and the other across his back. He was taken into the Levers House and conveyed to the hospital in his father's residence, Market Square. It was found that he had sustained a fracture of the shoulder blade. It is said the driver might have avoided the accident if a little care had been exercised.

Serious Accident to a Lineman. Mr. William Stanley, of this city, who is employed by the Bell Telephone Company, was killed by a serious accident the other day while putting in poles between this city and St. Thomas. Some of the men were engaged in putting up a pole, when Stanley, seeing the likelihood of its falling, went to the assistance of the others, but it fell on him, while the others escaped. The pole struck him on the side across the hip bone, and he was unable to walk after the accident. Medical examination showed that his hip bone was broken.

East Middlesex. No Liberal candidate in this campaign is making a better fight than Thomas Purdom in East Middlesex. Mr. Purdom is a young man of pluck, character and ability. He has proved by his conduct of the campaign that he will make a good representative, and that he has the capacity to deal with public questions with strength and wisdom.

Death of Mr. James McHarg. The death is announced of Mr. James McHarg, of Hamilton, the father of Mr. John McHarg, G. T. R. station agent of this city. Deceased was 71 years of age and was a resident of Hamilton for 40 years. He was highly respected by all who were acquainted with him, and was one time one of the best known travelers on the road.

Watson, promoted. 27th Lambton Battalion, St. Clair Borderers, No. 7 Company, Sarina.-To be captain, Lieutenant Ross MacKenzie, vice F. W. Kittomaster, appointed adjutant; to be lieutenant provisionally, Corporal Frederick Gorman, vice R. MacKenzie (promoted); to be adjutant, Captain Frederic William Kitter, promoted, from No. 7 Company, vice W. Kelly, promoted.

Rooney Sweeney in Trouble. Rooney Sweeney, who appeared earlier in the Toronto team, appeared behind the cage at the Police Court this morning charged with drunkenness. Rooney appeared in no means refreshed by his night in the cells and presented rather a shabby appearance. Pitcher Maguire, of the same team, was in the court room, and laid an information on the spot against Sweeney for rooney. It appears that Maguire drew \$30 from the Bank of Toronto last week, and had \$40 in \$10 bills in his pocket on Sunday evening when he retired to his Sunday morning he found this gone, and immediately informed the police. Detectives Phair and Ryler arrested Sweeney last night in a madhouse condition, and a search revealed \$37 40 on his person tied up in a handkerchief. The prisoner stated that he only took it money to take care of it until Maguire was sober out of kindness to him. "Mac" did not seem inclined to believe this statement, and denied that he was intoxicated, having had but one glass of whisky the night before.

Missionary Late in India. Mr. Wilkie, who has been a missionary in India for some years and intends returning to that country in July, delivered a very interesting and instructive address last night in the First Presbyterian Church before a very fair audience. Mr. Wilkie accompanied his discourse with practical illustrations of Hindu life thrown by a magic lantern, a somewhat novel method, but one which greatly enhanced the interest of the lecture. The map of India was first shown, and the district and cities of interest pointed out. The speaker dwelt chiefly with Central India, his sphere of labor in that country, and described the habits and customs of its inhabitants in a graphic manner. This district had never experienced a famine and without any manuring the land produced two crops a year, yet its produce all went to the native princes, some of whom

had revenues of \$3,000,000 annually, while the common people were in a state of starvation. The speaker gave some striking facts in connection with the sacred animals which the natives venerate so much, and minutely described the costumes and manners of the inhabitants. He declared that the condition of the women was degraded in the extreme and they were subject to all the brutal humors of their husbands. These unfortunate could only be reached through their own sex, and hence the necessity for female missionaries. In conclusion the speaker appealed to the Christians of civilized lands to aid in elevating the people of the ungodly, but rich and promising country of India.

Death of Mrs. Travers. On Sunday last Mrs. Harriet Charlotte Travers, formerly of Morestown, county Cork, Ireland, and widow of one late Mr. Richard H. Travers, died at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. John Going, Port Stanley. Mrs. Travers' death was very sudden. She awoke about 4 o'clock on Sunday morning and complained of a pain in her side and then quietly passed away. She was born in Cork, Ireland, in June 5, 1795, and was within a few days of being 65 years old. She came to Canada in 1850, and settled in this city. She was a highly-educated woman and spoke three languages, and was also a devout Christian. The survivors of her family are: Mrs. George Gaffney and Mrs. Charles A. Wagner, of this city; Mrs. John Going, widow of the late John Going, of Port Stanley, and Eliza Travers, M.D., of Amboy, Ill. The late Dr. Travers, of Fingal, so well-known in the county of Eglis, was her son. The funeral takes place from Port Stanley to Fingal, Canada.

The Donohue Case. In the case of Donohue vs. Donohue at Osgoode Hall, Toronto, yesterday, Judge McRobb rendered a judgment in favor of the plaintiff to recover balance of price of a cab, which the jury found was sold by the plaintiff to the defendant, Timothy Donohue, as agent for the defendant, William Donohue. The defendant, Timothy Donohue, pleaded infancy. It was argued by the plaintiff that if William acted as agent for Timothy, who, by reason of his infancy, could not appoint an agent, William must be held to be personally liable as having guaranteed his being validly appointed agent for Timothy. The jury found that William professed to act as agent for Timothy, but the learned judge holds that his agency did not extend further than the carrying of the plaintiff to the party in receipt of the cab paid, and taking back a receipt. Action dismissed as against William Donohue with costs. With regard to Timothy Donohue the learned judge holds that he is not before the court, being an infant, not appearing by guardian but by solicitor, and that the proceedings, so far as he is concerned, are null, referring to sections 291 and 292 of the Act, 13 P. R., 17. Order made setting aside the appearing by solicitor, the service of the statement of claim upon the solicitor, and all the proceedings in the case so far as the infant is concerned.
