Edmund Burke entitled it one of the most chaste and instructive miscellanies of the age—an opinion corroborated by Dr. Warton and Edward Gibbon, the latter of whom urged Nichols to make a selection for future reference from its overflowing pages. Richard Gough was for many years a constant contributor.

This first treatise on fishing printed in England must ever have a great interest for the bibliophile and for the follower of the "gentle art." "The Treatyse of Fysshynge wyth an Angle," which claims this position, has ever been cherished by both as of surpassing value for its rarity, as well as for its intrinsic interest. The work has also a peculiar interest as being the quarry from which so many subsequent writers on fishing have drawn riches which they have adapted to their own use, and that frequently without acknowledgment; while even Isaac Walton hiraself has not only drawn much of his inspiration from its perusal, but has clearly taken his "Jury of flies" and other information almost intact from its pages. Such gentle spirits too as Herbert Donne, Walton, Paley and Bell, have without doubt read and caught enthusiasm from the lofty sentiments of the noble authoress of "The Treatyse." Its poetic language, its appreciation of all the gentle surroundings of the angler's life, and its sense of the beautiful in nature, have contributed to the innocent pleasure of those who have read it in earlier and later times. The modern angler will be amused by the circumstantial directions it gives in quaint language as to the dyeing and making of lines, and the six methods of angling and playing fish, and may find useful hints in the common sense instructions about the weather, the seasons of the year, and the different baits to be used for different fish, while he will read with wonder the directions concerning the construction of the rod, the making of paste, and the keeping of live baits. The "Treatyse of Fysshynge," by Dame Juliana Berners was first printed by Wynkyn de Worde in the second edition of the "Book of St. Albans," in 1496; and the motive for so publishing the work is thus given by the authoress in the concluding paragraph, -"By cause that this present treatyse sholde not come to the hondys of eche ydle persone whyche woulde desire it yf it were enprynted allone by itself put in a lytyll plaunflet, therefore I have compylyd it in a greter volume of dyuerse bokys concernynge to gentyll and noble men to the entent that the forsayd ydle persones whyche sholde haue but lytyll measure in the sayd dysporte of fysshyng sholde not by this meane vtterly dystroye it."
