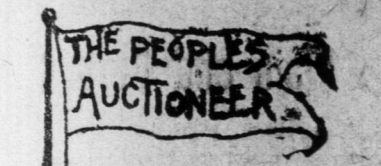

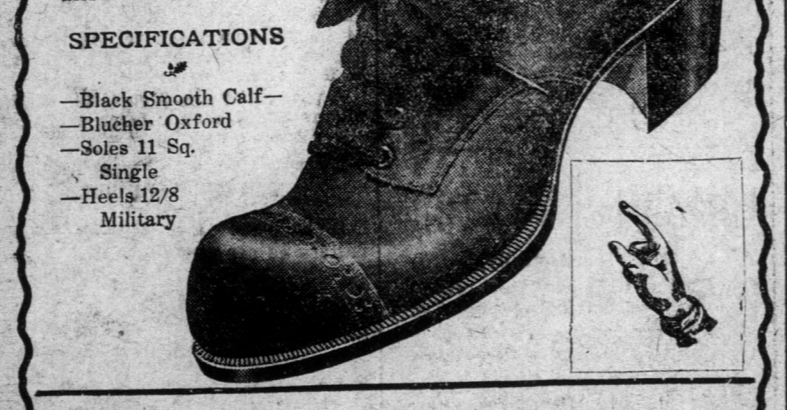

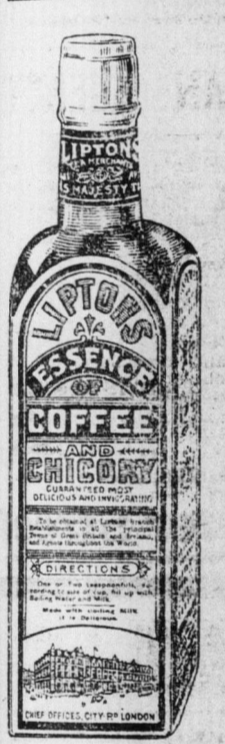

Gigantic Finds. London, May 16.—Details of the season's results in exploration by the British school of Archaeology in Egypt, are described by Professor Petrie as gigantic. An alabaster sphinx was found at Memphis, 26 feet long and four feet high, which weighed 60 tons. The face is as perfect as when it was carved 1,300 years B.C. Earth-fortress walls over 100 feet thick and a quarter of a mile across were discovered at Heliopolis. They probably date back to the early barbaric invasion. 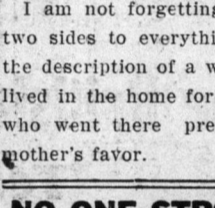

# Love That's Kin to Hate.

"So each man kills the thing he loves, By each let this be heard." —Oscar Wilde. Love is the most beautiful thing in the world; hate is the ugliest thing; the two are commonly supposed to be opposite poles. And yet how often love is just as cruel and just as much a happiness destroyer as hate! There is a woman in this town who loves her son very dearly—so dearly in fact that she is doing her best to spoil his home. Her son is married to a good woman whom he loves and who loves him; he has a comfortable income; he has children; he and his enjoy good health. There is no reason why his home should not be a model of harmony and happiness, except that his mother loves him with this love that is more cruel than hate. She is a widow and has lived with him since his marriage. His wife has always tried to make her comfortable and happy, but she refuses to be either, and everything that the wife does she misconstrues and often misrepresents to her son. Fortunately he is a man with a strong sense of justice and infinite tact, and while he treats his mother with the utmost love and kindness, he refuses to let her spoil his love for his wife.

I am not forgetting that there are two sides to everything. But this is the description of a witness who has lived in the home for some years and who went there prejudiced in the mother's favor. Again, a certain young man in love with a sweet and desirable girl. His mother said he was too young to marry, and by clever intriguing actually succeeded in estranging him from the girl. Since then the girl has married another man, and the son, who never found any other woman he cared for, has become a "man about town" in the very worst sense of that phrase. I think his mother would give her life now to see him marry a good woman and gettle down, but he does not wish to marry, and he is certainly not fit for any good woman. And his mother is to blame. To be sure both these experiences are exaggerated cases of the cruelty of love, but I know of many homes where this jealousy, although less acute and ruthless, still spoils infinite happiness every day. Of course there are a great many sweethearts and wives who are selfish in their claims on their lovers and husbands. I am not condoning their faults. But we all know that sex love is inclined to be selfish and exacting. Whereas mother love is universally supposed to be the most unselfish love in the world. Is it not more sad and terrible when we find even this holy affection tainted by selfishness and jealousy? Besides, the mother must have known what it is to be a wife. The young wife does not know what it means to be the mother of a man. The younger woman is almost always condemned most harshly in such cases. It seems to me that the older woman who has lived long enough to have greater sympathy and understanding, and who has a more selfless affection to live up to, is faithless to a greater trust.

Household Notes. Housewives who enjoy using a bare table in summer will do well to invest in some of the inexpensive asbestos mats that go under the dollies. Lemons placed in the oven and thoroughly heated, then rolled with the hand, will have a delicious flavor which never is found when the lemons are used cold. They will also be more juicy. Bathroom sash curtains are better made higher than usual, to reach several inches above the middle of the window, so that the shade may be run to the top and no neighbour the wiser. If you own too many pictures, don't try to crowd them all on the walls at once; it is much more effective to hang only half at a time, changing them at spring and fall housecleaning. Before putting away the winter clothing and blankets they should be hung out in the sunshine and brushed and shaken thoroughly. Without this precaution moth preventives are of little use. When olive oil dressing will not thicken after the necessary amount of oil has been used, beat in a small quantity of dry cornstarch. This prevents the curdled or oily appearance after standing a short time, the dressing will be stiff and will not taste of cornstarch. Many people melt the butter and then mix it with the sugar. This makes the cake heavy and is always prohibited in good cake baking. Instead of this put the sugar in a double boiler and let it get warm. In this way it creams the butter nicely and does not melt it. Before sending a garment to the laundry, sew a piece of tape to the end of the ribbon you intend to pull out. Then, as the ribbon is pulled out, the tape is pulled in its place. When the garment is sent back from the laundry, sew the ribbon to the tape, pull the tape out and the ribbon is in. Many women like to change their table furnishings this time of year using separate linen pieces on a bare table. For this purpose nothing is more charming than crossed strips of the lovely Japanese toweling at a dollar for ten yards. It comes mostly in blues, printed with iris and other designs, and washes perfectly. When buying a baby carriage, be sure to get one with the back and the front wheels of the same size. The rubber tires on the back wheels wear out in less than half the time of those on the front, and by changing the wheels when the back tires are partly worn you can get much more wear out of a set of rubber tires. Pictures hung by a single wire have an annoying way of getting uneven on account of the slipping of the wire on the picture hook. This can sometimes be avoided by first hanging the picture face to the wall and then turning it around. The single turn this makes in the wire near the hook prevents slipping. The desired fitness in a plain shirtwaist is easily obtained by placing the neck of the pattern on the fold of the cloth and slanting the bottom of the pattern away from the fold. Be sure to keep the neck of the pattern on the fold. This method of cutting material gives extra fullness in the waist and keeps the upper part of it plain, insuring a good fit across the chest.

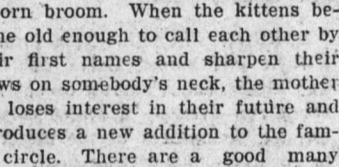
# Soper & Moore

All that will then be required is to rub the grate well over each week with turpentine and polish with the velvet. This will be found much easier than blackleading each week.

# The House Cat.

**The Socialist Movement.**  
BY ANDANTINO.

X. — WOMAN, THE HOME AND EDUCATION.

Mazzini speaking of woman:—"Blot out of your mind any idea of superiority to her; you have none whatever. The prejudice of ages has created through unequal education and the pre-natal oppression of the laws that apparent intellectual inferiority which you use to-day as an argument for maintaining the oppression. There is no graver offence in God's sight than that which divides the human family into two classes and imposes or allows the subjection of one to the other. Before the one God and Father there is neither man nor woman, but the human being, the being in whom, under the aspect of man or of woman, those characters exist which distinguish humanity from the order of the animals; namely, social tendency, capacity of learning, and the faculty of progressing. Wherever these characters reveal themselves, there human nature exists, and in consequence equality of rights and of duties. No inequality exists between man and woman but, as often happens with two men, a difference of tendencies, of special vocations. Hold woman, then, as the companion and partaker of your joys and sorrows. Hold her as your equal in civil and political life. The Mosaic Bible has said God created the man, and the woman from the man; but your Bible, the Bible of the Future shall say, God created Humanity, manifested in the woman and in the man."

The majority of Socialists, I find, are in favour of Woman's Suffrage, and in the Socialist state woman occupies an elevated position, and her rights are equal.

The temporary setback the suffragists have suffered in England owing to "dear, delightful, illogical John Bull" rejecting a Bill which he read a second time last year, is not because the M. P.'s are against Woman's Suffrage, but that they desire to retaliate against the "window-

smashers." While we deprecate some of the means which the ladies used, it is interesting to read that Mr. Gladstone has said in relation of disturbing the public repose: "I am sorry to say that if no instructions had ever been addressed in political crises to the people of this country, except to hate violence and love order and exercise patience, the liberties of this country would never have been attained."

A great deal has been made out of an ignorant charge that Socialism will destroy the Home, and the opponents of Socialism do not scruple to attach to the Movement extracts of isolated writers who have no more right to lead the whole Socialist party on the subject of marriage than an isolated Liberal or Tory would have to lead their respective parties on any question.

Socialism will make the home possible. It will create conditions under which children will grow up healthy and happy. Can you imagine what home-life there can be in the hundreds of wretched hovels in St. John's? Can you see the children there and imagine how impossible it is for them to grow in such conditions, to what God intended them to be?

Let those who say that Socialism will destroy the home first take the mote out of their own eye. Do they say that 50,000 divorces in one year have anything to do with breaking up the home?

A clergyman of England speaking a few years ago said: "We must protest against the exaggerated, the unnatural, and the unnecessary luxury of the age, which is destructive of home life and of high ideals. In society domesticity is being gradually destroyed by the fashion of dining and living in hotels."

Education! What iniquities are committed in thy name! What distorted

and cramped notions have we of thy infinitude!

We have had a shaking up of 'dry bones this winter, and if the C. H. E. is not abolished altogether it is in a fair way to be modified before another year. Whereat we say 'Amén'!

"Education seeks to discover and develop the innate powers of childhood; its work is to educate as well as to instill, to draw forth the actual from the actual to shapeliness and 'use.' I think I may take myself as an average product of our schools and I never heard while there of the above uses of Education, and it took about two years after I left school before I came to myself, and found how little use school had been to me, outside of knowing that 2 and 2 make 4.

With the exception of those who have wealthy parents, the great majority in the schools have no horizon beyond Water Street; they must earn money; whether the work suits them or not is secondary. They issue from school mere machines, with no object beyond material desires. Even when they have learnt is quickly upset when they enter an office and their arithmetical problems are reduced to simpler and quicker methods.

The political creed of Ruskin begins with "training schools for youth established, at Government cost, and under Government discipline, over the whole country; that every child born in the country should be permitted (and in certain cases be under penalty required) to pass through them; and that, in these schools, the child should (with other minor pieces of knowledge) imperatively be taught, with the best skill of teaching that the country could produce the following three things:—

a.—The laws of health, and the exercises enjoined by them.

b.—Habits of Gentleness and Justice.

c.—The calling by which he is to live.

The Socialist intends that every child shall have its chance, that he will not go to work until he is educated and fitted as nearly as possible to the work which he will enjoy. Every child will have an equal opportunity for mental development, and in his maturer years the hours of work will be such that education can proceed all the time.

It is a disgrace that so few of our labourers and fishermen can read or write—not a disgrace to them but to the powers that be that can view such a condition so calmly. Every one of the Chinese can read and write and we call them heathen!

Most of those who have written on the social condition of Athens seem to agree that as a whole, the population of Athens was as superior to our modern civilization as we are to Australian savages.

How many "gems of purest ray serene" may not Education find among the poor?

"Ye sheep without a shepherd, claim your right to be fed, but claim more loudly your right to be holy, perfect and pure. Strange words to be used of working people: 'What! holy; these rough-lacketed, rough-worried persons; set to nameless and dishonoured service? Perfect! these, with dim eyes and cramped limbs, and slowly wakening minds? Pure — these with sensual desire and grovelling thought; god of body and coarse of soul!'

It may be so; nevertheless, such as they are, they are holiest, perfectest, purest persons the earth can at present show. They may be what you have said; but if so, they yet are 'holier than we, who have left them thus.'

**Rumors of Unrest in Navy.**

LONDON, May 14.—According to the Daily Chronicle, the present unrest among the sailors in the British Navy, is due to dissatisfaction with the conditions of the service, especially in reference to pay and punishments.

This complaint has become so acute, that petty officers and men in the service are contemplating a breach of the King's regulations by forming themselves into a trades union.

He says it is time for the nation and the naval authorities to realize that if the Admiralty does not start immediately to reform the legitimate grievances of these 100,000, or if the country does not compel the authorities to measure out at least justice, the rank and file of the navy will form an association which will be strong enough which the industrial history of the last year or two has made the country painfully familiar.

### Board of Trade And Titanic Disaster.

Editor Evening Telegram.  
LONDON, To-day.  
The attack on Buxton, President of the Board of Trade, in connection with the Titanic disaster was renewed in the Commons, when the slackness of the Board of Trade was severely handled. Archer Shee, Unionist, moved the reduction of the salary of Buxton, who, he declared, had been convicted by the damning fact that he had neglected to carry out the recommendations of his own committee. Charges of slumbering, dilatoriness, absolute neglect, unconcern were heaped at the Board of Trade by various speakers. Lord Beresford bitterly complained the Board of Trade had not attempted to carry out its own regulations till after the Titanic tragedy. He demanded the appointment of a new advisory committee to the Board of Trade, whose object should be to render ships to be able to float after they had received bad damage. Beresford indicated watertight compartments with small doors in bulkheads which would be more easily closed were more important questions than life-boats, as there were many days at sea when it was impossible to launch life-boats with any safety. This was also the view of Richard Holt, who declared boats to be rotten reefs, most certain to fall in the hour of need. He suggested provision of bulkheads without any doors at all. Buxton in his defense argued Parliament had been as slack as the Board of Trade was equally responsible, because it had not raised the question of providing adequate boat life-saving appliances before the Titanic disaster. He said the British and German Governments have now undertaken arrangements for an international conference on the subject. But Britain had clearly informed the German Government it would not, on account of the prospective conference, delay issuing regulations which might be thought necessary.

Sirius is a second class protected cruiser, completed twenty years ago, of the same size and type as the Brilliant, which was completed in 1893, a year after the Sirius. Some of her crew have been on this station before.

Nardini, who has been expelled from France reached Dover yesterday after a flight from Calais.



SALEM, Mass., May 15.—John J. Breen, a prominent citizen of Lawrence, was found guilty on one of the three counts of an indictment in which he was charged with planting dynamite during the big textile strike in that city, by a jury in the Superior Court here to-day. Sentence had not been imposed. Breen is a member of the school committee of Lawrence. The count on which Breen was found guilty charged that he intended to injure the strikers in the conduct of their strike.



### To-Day's News.

Special Evening Telegram.  
LONDON, To-day.  
Mr. Buxton, President of the Board of Trade announced in the Commons that the Government would appoint a Court to inquire into the strike of Lightermen on the Thames. This, he said, was due to the fact that the strike was rapidly spreading and that unless soon settled it will involve a stoppage of all work on the London docks.

Special to Evening Telegram.  
LONDON, To-day.  
Mr. Haldane, Secretary of State for War, left for Germany last night. It is surmised he would continue his mission began early in the spring, relative to restriction of armaments. But it is officially stated that Haldane's visit to Germany is of a purely private nature and was undertaken for his health. It is announced further that the Secretary is not going to Berlin.

Special to Evening Telegram.  
BERLIN, To-day.  
The Reichstag passed the third reading of the bills for increasing the German Army and Navy. The Navy Bill provides an extra battle squadron for which three additional battleships and two cruisers are to be constructed before 1920. It is estimated the additional annual cost will be: \$24,250,000 this year; \$31,750,000 next year; \$28,500,000 the year afterwards. The Army Bill provides an increase 23,000 men excluding officers, non-commissioned officers and other details in the peace footing of the army. There is a condition that part at least of the cost of the increase in army and navy should be borne by new taxation imposed on the wealthier class.

### Beri-Beri.

Seeing that beri-beri is a comparatively new disease in this country, and not knowing to what extent it may spread among our people, we sought an opportunity of interviewing Dr. Tait for information on the matter. The doctor started out by saying that he, four years ago, had the disease himself, and that since then he has seen and treated a considerable number of cases. He informed us that the disease was a form of neuritis of epidemic-endemic type, and that it was especially prevalent in Japan, China, the Malay Archipelago and in other tropical and sub-tropical countries. The sporadic cases found in this country were imported from Norway, the West Indian ports, or among fishermen on the Banks. The cause of the disease is unknown, though no less than twelve supposedly specific organisms have been described. Two theories are held: (1) that it is an infection, caused by a specific organism, which is not yet determined; (2) that it is a toxæmia, produced by tainted food—particularly rice or fish. Both theories may be true, but in connection with either we now know that had hygienic surroundings undoubtedly play an important part. He mentioned that a friend of his lately in conversation with a celebrated Japanese Army surgeon, was informed that by eliminating raw fish and rice from the dietary of the soldiers, and improving their condition of living, the disease was almost entirely eradicated. Dr. Tait says that the disease is generally slow in making its appearance—often weeks may elapse before distinguishing symptoms show themselves. When manifest the chief symptoms are irritability of the heart, tenderness and swelling of the feet and legs, a generalized tired feeling, great shortness of breath, muscular weakness, emaciation, paralysis and contraction of the joints. He says there are four forms of the disease—(a) the "mild form," where all the symptoms are slight; (b) the "wet" or "dropsical form"; (c) the "dry form," with slight dropsy, but a tendency to emaciation and paralysis; and (d) the "pernicious form," in which heart symptoms predominate.

Dr. Tait reminded us that a new disease in a new country is an ever-gestating process, and has much to do with changeable predisposition and changeable conditions. Race immunity depends upon individual adaptation, and our people generally with their bad condition of life may not possess sufficient resisting power to overcome the introduction of a new disease, so that if preliminary precautions are not undertaken we may be confronted with a spreading epidemic.

In China, Japan, the Malays, the Philippine Islands and other places, the disease has been a formidable one. In the late Russo-Japanese war in less than one year more than 50,000 Japanese soldiers were stricken down, while for the same period in the homeland several thousands more were invalided.

Regarding the distribution of this disease and the great difference in the type and spread of the same, we must remember that we possess no immunity, so that if the infection or whatever it is obtains a foothold it may become more widespread and troublesome than tuberculosis.

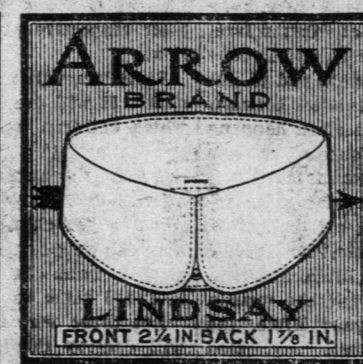

## Cable News.

HENIA, Ohio, May 21.  
Fred Southward, amateur aviator,

HALIFAX, May 21.  
A cable from London announces the  
death this morning of Lieut.-General  
Winburn Lawrie, C.B., aged 77.

DOVER, Eng., May 21.  
Crombers, a Belgium airman, cross-  
ed the English Channel from Nieu-  
port, Belgium, from whence he start-  
ed this morning.

HAVANA, May 21.  
The Cuban Government disclaims  
any further knowledge regarding the  
uprising of the negroes. The opinion  
is spreading generally that the condi-  
tions are becoming serious, and it is  
reported that two armed parties are  
operating in Matanzas province. Or-  
ders were issued this morning for ad-  
ditional troops to be prepared to take  
the field.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 21.  
After the surprising declaration  
that there are 2,000 churches in the  
United States without pastors had  
been made at the General Assembly of  
the Presbyterian Church to-day, reso-  
lutions were adopted urging all Pres-  
byterian Commissions of Laymen to  
keep in close touch with young men  
who might be possible candidates for  
the ministry.

LONDON, May 21.  
Second officer Lightoller of the Ti-  
tanic was the chief witness on the  
stand to-day. His evidence was prac-  
tically a repetition of that given be-  
fore the United States Senate Commit-  
tee. He stuck to the belief that the  
light seen by the Titanic was not  
more than five miles away, and that  
there was no field ice to prevent the  
vessel coming to the Titanic's aid.

LONDON, May 21.  
The Miners' Federation met to-  
day to discuss with the District Boards  
the decision arrived at as regards the  
various minimum scale of wages  
throughout the coal fields. There was  
much dissatisfaction, particularly over  
the South of Wales scale, which  
was considered to be against the men.  
It is believed that the Government  
will be appealed to for further legis-  
lation to reorganize the District  
Boards.

LONDON, May 21.  
Viscount Haldane leaves for Berlin  
to continue his mission begun last  
spring in preparing the ground for in-  
ternational conversations with lead-  
ing statesmen and prominent persons  
in Germany, with a view to a move-  
ment toward the restriction of arma-  
ments among European powers and  
improving international relations.  
Haldane expects to remain ten or  
twelve days in the German capital,  
and hopes to make more noticeable  
progress than during the previous vis-  
it in February last.

LONDON, May 21.  
With an apology offered in court,  
Winston Spencer Churchill ended the  
off-repeated accusation that he broke  
parole when he was a prisoner in  
Pretoria during the Boer War. This  
time it was reported by a writer in  
Blackwood's Magazine, and led to a  
libel action, which was settled yester-  
day by a complete withdrawal of the  
allegations. Churchill relating in the  
witness box the circumstances of his  
escape from Pretoria, said he never  
broke parole, because he was not  
asked for it. He accepted the defend-  
ant magazine's apology, whereupon  
the judge permitted the suit to be  
withdrawn.

The schr. Michael Francis, owned  
by James Baird, Ltd., arrived here  
from Channel yesterday morning after  
a record run. She came down in 45  
hours, and from the time of leaving  
carried every stitch of canvas on her.  
The schooner has on board a cargo  
of seals hauled at Channel and  
neighbourhood during the past spring.

favour was ever denied, and to-day  
friends of all nationalities and his  
countrymen in particular are glad to  
have the opportunity to shower on
