The House met at 3.15 p.m. Though the session lasted all the hermoon, there was absolutely no done, the time being taken up in the discussion of the American Embargo. The Opposition members urged the Government to get busy on this important matter, but Government members apparently were dazed as the seriousness of the situation was brought home to them, but with the exception of the Hon. Minister of Marine and Fisheries not one speke on the subject. When the House opened the Prime Minister intimated that owing to the Railway programme not being ready he would adjourn the session until to-day.

Apparently, however, there was no business ready to proceed with. He thought the whole thing was a wreck.
